2 Corinthians - KJV

Greetings

2Co 1:1 Paul, an apostle of Jesus Christ by the will of God, and Timothy *our* brother,

unto the church of God which is at Corinth, with all the saints which are in all Achaia:

2Co 1:2 Grace *be* to you and peace from **God our Father**, and *from* **the Lord Jesus Christ**.

Comfort in Sufferings

2Co 1:3 Blessed be God, even the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ,

the Father of mercies, and the God of all comfort;

2Co 1:4 Who comforteth us in all our tribulation,

that we may be able to comfort them which are in any trouble, by the comfort wherewith we ourselves are comforted of God.

2Co 1:5 For as the sufferings of **Christ** abound in us,

so our consolation also aboundeth by Christ.

2Co 1:6 And whether we be afflicted, *it is* for your consolation and salvation, which is effectual in the enduring of the same sufferings which we also suffer: or whether we be comforted, *it is* for your consolation and salvation.

2Co 1:7 And our hope of you *is* stedfast, knowing, that as ye are partakers of the sufferings, so *shall ye be* also of the consolation [our comfort].

2Co 1:8 For we would not, brethren, have you ignorant of our trouble [affliction] which came to us in Asia,

that we were pressed out of measure [burdened excessively], above [beyond our] strength, insomuch that we despaired even of life:

2Co 1:9 But we had the sentence of death in ourselves,

that we should not trust in ourselves,

but in God

which raiseth the dead:

2Co 1:10 Who delivered us from so great a death,

and doth [will] deliver:

in whom we trust

that he will yet deliver us;

11 Ye also

helping together by prayer for us,

that for the gift {and deliverance} bestowed upon us by the means of many persons thanks may be given by many on our behalf.

Confidence in God and each other

2Co 1:12 For our rejoicing [proud confidence] is this,

the testimony of our conscience,

that in simplicity and godly sincerity,

not with fleshly wisdom,

but by the grace of God,

we have had our conversation in the world, and more abundantly to you-ward.

2Co 1:13 For we write none other things unto you, than what ye read or acknowledge;

and I trust ye shall acknowledge even to the end;

2Co 1:14 As also ye have acknowledged us in part,

that we are your rejoicing [reason to be proud], even as ye also are ours

in the day of the Lord Jesus.

2Co 1:15 And in this confidence

I was minded to come unto you before, that ye might have a second benefit;

2Co 1:16 And to pass by you into Macedonia,

and to come again out of Macedonia unto you,

and of you to be brought on my way toward **Judaea**.

2Co 1:17 When I therefore was thus minded, did I use lightness?

or the things that I purpose, do I purpose according to the flesh,

that with me there should be yea yea, and nay nay?

2Co 1:18 But as God is true, our word toward you was not yea and nay.

2Co 1:19 For the Son of God, Jesus Christ,

who was preached among you by us, even by me and Silvanus and Timotheus, was not yea and nay, but in him was yea.

2Co 1:20 For all the promises of God in him are yea,

and in him Amen, unto the glory of God by us.

2Co 1:21 Now he

- which stablisheth [establishes] us with you in **Christ**,
- and hath anointed us,

is God;

- 2Co 1:22 Who hath also sealed us,
- and given the earnest of **the Spirit** in our hearts. [gave us **the Spirit** in our hearts as a pledge]

2Co 1:23 Moreover I call God for a record upon my soul,

that to spare you I came not as yet unto **Corinth**.

2Co 1:24 Not for that we have dominion over your faith,

but are helpers of your joy:

for by faith ye stand.

2Co 2:1 But I determined this with myself,

that I would not come again to you in heaviness.

2Co 2:2 For if I make you sorry,

who is he then that maketh me glad,

but the same which is made sorry by me?

2Co 2:3 And I wrote this same unto you,

lest, when I came, I should have sorrow from them of whom I ought to rejoice;

having confidence in you all, that my joy is the joy of you all.

2Co 2:4 For out of much affliction and anguish of heart

I wrote unto you with many tears;

not that ye should be grieved,

but that ye might know the love which I have more abundantly unto you.

Forgive, Comfort, and Affirm your Love for the one you punished

2Co 2:5 But if any have caused grief, he hath not grieved me,

but in part: that I may not overcharge you all.

2Co 2:6 Sufficient to such a man is this punishment, which was inflicted of [by] many [the majority].

2Co 2:7 So that contrariwise ye *ought* rather to forgive *him*, and comfort *him*,

lest perhaps such a one should be swallowed up with overmuch [excessive] sorrow.

2Co 2:8 Wherefore I beseech you that ye would confirm your love toward him.

Note: 1Co 5:5 {I have decided} To deliver such an one (Note: who committed incest with his mother) unto Satan for the destruction of the flesh, that the spirit may be saved in the day of the Lord Jesus.

2Co 2:9 For to this end also did I write, that I might know the proof of you,

whether ye be obedient in all things.

2Co 2:10 To whom ye forgive any thing, I forgive also:

for if I forgave any thing, to whom I forgave it,

for your sakes *forgave I it* in the person [presence] of **Christ**;

2Co 2:11 Lest Satan should get an advantage of us:

for we are not ignorant of his devices.

Sidenote:

2Co 2:12 Furthermore, when I came to Troas to preach Christ's gospel,

and a door was opened unto me of the Lord,

2Co 2:13 I had no rest in my spirit, because

I found not **Titus** my brother:

but taking my leave of them, I went from thence into Macedonia.

2Co 2:14 Now thanks be unto God,

- which always causeth us to triumph in Christ,
- and maketh manifest the savour of his knowledge by us in every place.

2Co 2:15

For we are unto God a sweet savour of Christ,

Note: several Old Testament references containing the phrase: "an offering made by fire of a sweet savour unto the Lord"

in them that are saved, and in them that perish:

2Co 2:16 To the one we are the savour of death unto death;

and to the other the savour of life unto life.

And who is sufficient for these things?

2Co 2:17 For we are not as many, which corrupt the word of God:

but as of sincerity, but as of God, in the sight of God speak we in Christ.

2Co 3:1 Do we begin again to commend ourselves?

or need we, as some others, epistles of commendation to you, or letters of commendation from you?

2Co 3:2 Ye are our epistle written in our hearts, known and read of all men:

2Co 3:3 Forasmuch as ve are manifestly declared to be the epistle of Christ

ministered [cared for] by us.

2Co 3:4 And such trust have we through **Christ** to **God**-ward:

2Co 3:5 Not that we are sufficient of ourselves to think any thing as of ourselves;

2Co 3:6 Who also hath made us able ministers of the new testament [covenant];

not of the letter, but of the spirit:

Note: the letter of the Law

2Co 3:12 Seeing then that we have such hope,

we use great plainness [frankness, bluntness] of speech:

Our faces revealing the glory of the Lord

2Co 3:13 And not as Moses, which put a vail over his face,

that the children of Israel could not stedfastly look to the end of that which is abolished:

2Co 3:14a But their minds were blinded [hardened]:

for until this day remaineth the same vail untaken away	2Co 3:14b which <i>vail</i> is done away in Christ .
in the reading of the old testament [covenant];	
2Co 3:15 But even unto this day, when Moses is read,	2Co 3:16 Nevertheless when it shall turn to the Lord,

2Co 3:17 Now the Lord is that Spirit:

and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is liberty.

2Co 3:18 But we all, with open [unveiled] face beholding as in a glass [mirror] the glory of the Lord, are changed into the same image from glory to glory, even as by the Spirit of the Lord.

The Light of the Gospel hidden from the arrogant

2Co 4:1 Therefore seeing we have this ministry,

as we have received mercy, we faint not [do not lose heart];

2Co 4:2 But have renounced the hidden things of dishonesty,

not walking in craftiness, nor handling the word of God deceitfully;

but by manifestation of the truth

commending ourselves to every man's conscience in the sight of God.

2Co 4:3

But if our gospel be hid,

it is hid to them that are lost:

2Co 4:4 In whom the god of this world hath blinded the minds of them which believe not,

Note: Those who have seen the gospel demonstrated with power, signs, wonders, healings, resurrections, demons cast out, yet still refuse to believe.

lest the light of the glorious gospel of Christ, who is the image of God, should shine unto them.

2Co 4:5

For we preach not ourselves,

- but Christ Jesus the Lord;
- and ourselves your servants for Jesus' sake.

2Co 4:6 For God, who commanded the light to shine out of darkness, hath shined in our hearts.

to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.

A totally surrendered life Willing to Suffer in the same way Christ suffered unto death

2Co 4:7 But we have this treasure in earthen vessels,

that the excellency of the power may be

of God,

and not of us.

2Co 4:8 We are troubled [afflicted] on every side,	yet not distressed [crushed];
we are perplexed,	but not in despair;
2Co 4:9 Persecuted,	but not forsaken;
cast [struck] down,	but not destroyed;

2Co 4:10 Always bearing about in the body the dying of the Lord Jesus, that the life also of Jesus might be made manifest in our body.

2Co 4:11 For we which live are alway delivered unto death for Jesus' sake, that the life also of Jesus might be made manifest in our mortal flesh.

2Co 4:12 So then death worketh in us, but life in you.

2Co 4:13 We having the same spirit of faith,

according as it is written,

I BELIEVED, AND THEREFORE HAVE I SPO	OKEN; Pro 21:28 A false witness shall perish: but the man
	that heareth speaketh constantly.

we also believe, and therefore speak;

2Co 4:14 Knowing that he which raised up **the Lord Jesus** shall raise up us also by **Jesus**, and shall present *us* with you.

2Co 4:15 For all things are for your sakes,

that the abundant grace might through the thanksgiving of many

redound [abound] to the glory of God.

Note Glory G1391: dignity, honor, praise, worship

2Co 4:16 For which cause we faint not:

but though our outward man perish, yet the inward man is renewed day by day.

2Co 4:17 For our light affliction, which is but for a moment,

worketh for us a far more exceeding and eternal weight of glory;

2Co 4:18 While we look not at the things which are seen, but at the things which are not seen:

for the things which are seen are temporal; but the things which are not seen are eternal.

Our New Heavenly Body

2Co 5:1 For we know that if our earthly house of *this* tabernacle were dissolved, we have a building of **God**, an house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens.

2Co 5:2 For in this we groan,

earnestly desiring to be clothed upon with our house which is from heaven:

2Co 5:3 If so be that being clothed we shall not be found naked.

2Co 5:4 For we that are in *this* tabernacle do groan, being burdened:

not for that we would be unclothed, but clothed upon, that mortality might be swallowed up of life.

2Co 5:5 Now he that hath wrought us for the selfsame thing is God,

who also hath given unto us the earnest of the Spirit.

2Co 5:6 Therefore we are always confident,

knowing that, whilst we are at home in the body, we are absent from the Lord:

2Co 5:7 (For we walk by faith, not by sight:)

2Co 5:8 We are confident, I say,

and willing rather to be absent from the body, and to be present with the Lord.

The Judgment seat of Christ

2Co 5:9 Wherefore we labour, that, whether present or absent, we may be accepted of him.

2Co 5:10 For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ;

that every one may receive the things done in his body,

according to that he hath done, whether it be good or bad.

A Ministry of Reconciliation

2Co 5:11 Knowing therefore the terror of the Lord, we persuade men;

but we are made manifest unto God;

and I trust also are made manifest in your consciences.

Manifest: clear or obvious to the eye or mind

2Co 5:12 For we commend not ourselves again unto you,

but give you occasion to glory on our behalf,

that ye may have somewhat to answer them which glory [take pride in] in appearance, and not in heart.

2Co 5:13 For whether we be beside ourselves, it is to God:

or whether we be sober, it is for your cause.

2Co 5:14 For the love of **Christ** constraineth us:

because we thus judge, that if one died for all, then were all dead:

2Co 5:15 And that he died for all,

that they which live should not henceforth live unto themselves, but unto **him** which died for them, and rose again.

2Co 5:16 Wherefore henceforth know we no man after the flesh:

yea, though we have known **Christ** after the flesh,

yet now henceforth know [perceive] we him no more.

2Co 5:17 Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature:

old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new.

2Co 5:18 And all things are of God,

who hath reconciled us to himself by Jesus Christ,

and hath given to us the ministry of reconciliation;

2Co 5:19 To wit [namely], that

God was in Christ, reconciling the world unto himself,

not imputing their trespasses unto them;

and hath committed unto us the word of reconciliation.

2Co 5:20 Now then we are ambassadors for Christ,

as though God did beseech you by us:

Reconcile: restore friendly relations between, cause to coexist in harmony, make (one account) consistent with another, we pray you in **Christ**'s stead, be ye reconciled to **God**. 2Co 5:21 For he hath made him to be sin for us, who knew no sin; that we might be made the righteousness of **God** in him. **2Co 6:1** We then, as workers together with him, beseech you also that ye receive not the grace of God in vain. 2Co 6:2 (For he saith, I HAVE HEARD THEE IN A TIME ACCEPTED, AND IN THE DAY OF SALVATION HAVE I SUCCOURED [HELPED] THEE: Isa 49:8 Thus says the LORD, "In a favorable time I have answered You, And in a day of salvation I have helped You; And I will keep You and give You for a covenant of the people, To restore the land, to make them inherit the desolate heritages; behold, now is THE ACCEPTED TIME; behold, now is THE DAY OF SALVATION.) 2Co 6:3 Giving no offence in any thing, that the ministry be not blamed: 2Co 6:4 But in all *things* approving ourselves as the ministers of God, in much patience, in afflictions, in necessities [hardships], in distresses. 2Co 6:5 In stripes [beatings], in imprisonments, in tumults. in labours, in watchings [keeping awake], in fastings [hunger]; 2Co 6:6 By pureness, by knowledge, by longsuffering [patience], by kindness. by the Holy Ghost [Spirit], by love unfeigned [in genuine love], 2Co 6:7 By the word of truth, by the power of God, by the armour of righteousness on the right hand and on the left, (Eph 6:10-19) 2Co 6:8 By honour and dishonour, by evil report and good report: {regarded} as deceivers, and yet true; 2Co 6:9 As unknown, and yet well known; as dying, and, behold, we live; as chastened [punished], and not killed; 2Co 6:10 As sorrowful, yet alway rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, and yet possessing all things. 2Co 6:11 O ye Corinthians, our mouth is open unto you, our heart is enlarged. 2Co 6:12 Ye are not straitened in us, but ye are straitened in your own bowels [affections] 2Co 6:13 Now in a like exchange--I speak as to 2Co 6:13 Now for a recompence in the same, (I speak

I WILL DWELL IN THEM, AND WALK IN <i>THEM;</i> AND I WILL BE THEIR GOD, AND THEY SHALL BE MY PEOPLE.	Exo 29:45 And I will dwell among the children of Israel, and will be their God. Lev 26:12 And I will walk among you, and will be your God, and ye shall be my people.
2Co 6:17 WHEREFORE COME OUT FROM AMONG THEM, AND BE YE SEPARATE, saith the Lord,	Num 16:26 And he spake unto the congregation, saying, Depart, I pray you, from the tents of these wicked men, and touch nothing of theirs, lest ye be consumed in all their sins.

2Co 7:1 Having therefore these promises, dearly beloved, let us cleanse ourselves from all filthiness of the flesh and spirit, perfecting holiness in the fear of **God**.

Paul's Joy over the church in Corinth

2Co 7:2 Receive us;

we have wronged no man,

we have corrupted no man,

we have defrauded no man.

2Co 7:3 I speak not this to condemn you: for I have said before, that ye are in our hearts to die and live with you.

2Co 7:4 Great *is* my boldness of speech toward you, great *is* my glorying of you:

I am filled with comfort,

I am exceeding joyful in all our tribulation.

2Co 7:5 For, when we were come into **Macedonia**, our flesh had no rest,

but we were troubled [afflicted] on every side; without were fightings, within were fears.

2Co 7:6 Nevertheless **God**, that comforteth those that are cast down, comforted us by the coming of **Titus**; 2Co 7:7 And not by his coming only, but by the consolation wherewith he was comforted in you, when he told us your earnest desire, your mourning, your fervent mind toward me;

so that I rejoiced the more.

Godly Sorrow leading to Genuine Repentance

2Co 7:8 For though I made you sorry with a letter, I do not repent,

though I did repent: for I perceive that the same epistle hath made you sorry, though it were but for a season.

2Co 7:9 Now I rejoice, not that ye were made sorry, but that ye sorrowed to repentance:

for ye were made sorry after a godly manner,

that ye might receive damage by us in nothing.

2Co 7:10 For godly sorrow worketh repentance to salvation not to be repented of [without regret]:

but the sorrow of the world worketh death.

2Co 7:11 For behold this selfsame thing,

that ye sorrowed after a godly sort, what carefulness [earnestness] it wrought in you, yea,

what clearing [vindication] of yourselves,

yea, what indignation,

yea, what fear,

yea, what vehement desire,

yea, what zeal, yea,

what revenge!

In all *things* ye have approved yourselves to be clear in this matter.

2Co 7:12 Wherefore, though I wrote unto you,

I did it not for his cause that had done the wrong,

nor for his cause that suffered wrong,

but that our care for you in the sight of God might appear unto you.

The Joy of Titus

2Co 7:13 Therefore we were comforted in your comfort:

yea, and exceedingly the more joyed we for the joy of Titus,

because his spirit was refreshed by you all.

2Co 7:14 For if I have boasted any thing to him of you, I am not ashamed;

but as we spake all things to you in truth, even so our boasting, which I made before Titus, is found a truth.

2Co 7:15 And his inward affection is more abundant toward you, whilst he remembereth the obedience of you all, how with fear and trembling ye received him.

2Co 7:16 I rejoice therefore that I have confidence in you in all things.

The impoverished churches of Macedonia joyfully giving beyond their means

2Co 8:1 Moreover, brethren.

2Co 8:16 But thanks be to God, which put the same earnest care into the heart of Titus for you.
2Co 8:17 For indeed he accepted the exhortation;
but being more forward, of his own accord he went unto you.
2Co 8:18 And we have sent with him the brother, (Note: Apollos Act 18:24, 1Co 16:12, Tit 3:13)
whose praise is in the gospel throughout all the churches;
2Co 8:19 And not that only, but who was also chosen of the churches to travel with us with this grace [gracious
work],
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which is administered by us

to the glory of the same Lord,

and declaration of your ready mind:

2Co 8:20 Avoiding this, that no man should blame us in this abundance which is administered by us:

2Co 8:21 Providing for honest things,

not only in the sight of the Lord, but also in the sight of men.

2Co 8:22 And we have sent with them our brother,

2Co 9:11 Being enriched in every thing to all bountifulness,

which causeth through us thanksgiving to God.

2Co 9:12 For the administration of this service not only supplieth the want [needs] of the saints,

but is abundant also by many thanksgivings unto God;

2Co 9:13 Whiles by the experiment of this ministration

they glorify God

for your professed subjection unto the gospel of Christ,

and for your liberal distribution unto them, and unto all men;

2Co 9:14 And by their prayer for you, which long after you for the exceeding grace of God in you.

2Co 9:15 Thanks be unto God for his unspeakable gift.

Paul Defends His Ministry

2Co 10:1 Now I Paul myself beseech you by the meekness and gentleness of **Christ**,

who in presence am base among you,

but being absent am bold toward you:

2Co 10:2 But I beseech *you*, that I may not be bold when I am present with that confidence, wherewith I think to be bold against some, which think of us as if we walked according to the flesh.

2Co 10:3 For though we walk in the flesh, we do not war after the flesh:

2Co 10:4 (For the weapons of our warfare are not carnal,

but mighty through God to the pulling down of strong holds;)

2Co 10:5 Casting down imaginations, and every high thing that exalteth itself against the knowledge of **God**, and bringing into captivity every thought to the obedience of **Christ**;

2Co 10:6 And having in a readiness to revenge all disobedience, when your obedience is fulfilled.

2Co 10:7 Do ye look on things after the outward appearance?

If any man trust to himself that he is **Christ**'s, let him of himself think this again, that, as he *is* **Christ**'s, even so *are* we **Christ**'s.

2Co 10:8 For though I should boast somewhat more of our authority,

which the Lord hath given us for edification, and not for your destruction,

I should not be ashamed:

2Co 10:9 That I may not seem as if I would terrify you by letters.

2Co 10:10 For his letters, say

they, *are* weighty and powerful; but *his* bodily presence *is* weak,

and his speech contemptible.

2Co 10:11 Let such an one think this,

that, such as we are in word by letters when we are absent, such *will we be* also in deed when we are present.

2Co 10:12 For we dare not make ourselves of the number,

or compare ourselves with some that commend themselves:

but they measuring themselves by themselves.

and comparing themselves among themselves,

are not wise.

2Co 10:13 But we will not boast of things without our measure,

but according to the measure of the rule which God hath distributed to us,

a measure to reach even unto you.

2Co 10:14 For we stretch not ourselves beyond our measure, as though we reached not unto you:

for we are come as far as to you also in *preaching* the gospel of Christ:

2Co 10:15 Not boasting of things without our measure, that is, of other men's labours;

but having hope, when your faith is increased, that we shall be enlarged by you according to our rule abundantly,

2Co 10:16 To preach the gospel in the *regions* beyond you, *and* not to boast in another man's line of things made ready to our hand.

2Co 10:17 But HE THAT GLORIETH, LET HIM GLORY IN THE LORD.

2Co 10:18 For not he that commendeth himself is approved, but whom the Lord commendeth.

Warning about Infiltrators

2Co 11:1 Would to **God** ye could bear with me a little in *my* folly:

and indeed bear with me.

2Co 11:2 For I am jealous over you with godly jealousy:

for I have espoused you to one husband,

that I may present you as a chaste virgin to Christ.

2Co 11:3 But I fear, lest by any means, as the serpent beguiled Eve through his subtilty, so your minds should be corrupted from the simplicity that is in **Christ**.

2Co 11:4 For if he that cometh preacheth another **Jesus**, whom we have not preached, or *if* ye receive another spirit, which ye have not received, or another gospel, which ye have not accepted, ye might well bear with *him*.

2Co 11:5 For I suppose I was not a whit behind the very chiefest apostles.

2Co 11:6 But though *I be* rude in speech, yet not in knowledge;

but we have been throughly made manifest among you in all things.

2Co 11:7 Have I committed an offence in abasing myself that ye might be exalted, because I have preached to you the gospel of **God** freely?

2Co 11:8 I robbed other churches, taking wages of them, to do you service.

2Co 11:9 And when I was present with you, and wanted, I was chargeable to no man: for that which was lacking to me the brethren which came from **Macedonia** supplied:

and in all things I have kept myself from being burdensome unto you, and so will I keep myself.

2Co 11:10 As the truth of Christ is in me, no man shall stop me of this boasting in the regions of Achaia.

2Co 11:11 Wherefore? because I love you not? God knoweth.

2Co 11:12 But what I am doing, I will continue to do, that I may cut off opportunity from those who desire an opportunity to be regarded just as we are in the matter about which they are boasting. (NASV)

2Co 11:12 But what I do, that I will do, that I may cut off occasion from them which desire

occasion; that wherein they glory, they may be found

(NASV) even as we. (KJV poor translation here)

2Co 11:13 For such *are* false apostles, deceitful workers, transforming [disguising] themselves into [as] the apostles of Christ.

2Co 11:14 And no marvel; for Satan himself is transformed into [desguised as] an angel of light.

2Co 11:15 Therefore *it is* no great thing if **his ministers also be** transformed [desguised] as the ministers of righteousness;

whose end shall be according to their works.

Paul's Sufferings as an Apostle

2Co 11:16 I say again, Let no man think me a fool;

if otherwise, yet as a fool receive me, that I may boast myself a little.

2Co 11:17 That which I speak, I speak it not after the Lord, but as it were foolishly, in this confidence of boasting. 2Co 11:18 Seeing that many glory after the flesh, I will glory also. 2Co 11:19 For ye suffer [bear] fools gladly, seeing ye yourselves are wise. 2Co 11:20 For ye suffer [bear up], if a man bring you into bondage [slavery], if a man devour you, if a man take [advantage] of you, if a man exalt himself, if a man smite you on the face. 2Co 11:21 I speak as concerning reproach, as though we had been weak. Howbeit whereinsoever any is bold, (I speak foolishly,) I am bold also. 2Co 11:22 Are they Hebrews? so am I. Are they Israelites? so am I. Are they the seed of Abraham? so am I. 2Co 11:23 Are they ministers of Christ? (I speak as a fool) I am more; in labours more abundant, in prisons more frequent, in stripes [beatings] above measure, in {danger of} deaths oft. 2Co 11:24 Of the Jews five times received I forty *stripes* save one. 2Co 11:25 Thrice was I beaten with rods. once was I stoned. thrice I suffered shipwreck, a night and a day I have been in the deep; 2Co 11:26 In journeyings often, in perils of waters, in perils of robbers, in perils by mine own countrymen, *in* perils by the heathen, *in* perils in the city, *in* perils in the wilderness, *in* perils in the sea, *in* perils among false brethren; 2Co 11:27 In weariness and painfulness, in watchings [sleepless nights] often, in hunger and thirst, in fastings often, in cold and nakedness. 2Co 11:28 Beside those things that are without, that which cometh upon me daily, the care of all the churches. 2Co 11:29 Who is weak, and I am not weak? who is offended, and I burn not? [NASV: Who is led into sin without my intense concern?] 2Co 11:30 If I must needs glory, I will glory of the things which concern mine infirmities.

2Co 11:31 The God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, which is blessed for evermore, knoweth that I lie not.

2Co 11:32 In Damascus the governor under Aretas the king kept the city of the Damascenes with a garrison, desirous to apprehend me:

2Co 11:33 And through a window in a basket was I let down by the wall, and escaped his hands.

A thorn to prevent pride resulting from many visions

2Co 12:1 It is not expedient for me doubtless to glory.

I will come to visions and revelations of the Lord.

2Co 12:2 I knew a man in Christ above fourteen years ago.

(whether in the body, I cannot tell; or whether out of the body, I cannot tell: **God** knoweth;) such an one caught up to **the third heaven.**

2Co 12:3 And I knew such a man,

(whether in the body, or out of the body, I cannot tell: **God** knoweth;)

2Co 12:4 How that he was caught up into paradise,

and heard unspeakable words, which it is not lawful for a man to utter.

2Co 12:5 Of such an one will I glory:

yet of myself I will not glory, but in mine infirmities.

2Co 12:6 For though I would desire to glory, I shall not be a fool; for I will say the truth:

but now I forbear, lest any man should think of me above that which he seeth me to be, or that he heareth of me.

2Co 12:7 And lest I should be exalted above measure through the abundance of the revelations,

there was given to me a thorn in the flesh, the messenger of Satan to buffet me, lest I should be exalted above measure.

2Co 12:8 For this thing I besought the Lord thrice, that it might depart from me.

2Co 12:9 And he said unto me, My grace is sufficient for thee: for my strength is made perfect in weakness. Most gladly therefore will I rather glory in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me.

2Co 12:10 Therefore I take pleasure

- in infirmities,
- in reproaches,
- in necessities,
- in persecutions,
- in distresses

for Christ's sake: for when I am weak, then am I strong.

Concern for the Corinthian Church

2Co 12:11 I am become a fool in glorying;

ye have compelled me:

for I ought to have been commended of you:

for in nothing am I behind the very chiefest apostles, though I be nothing.

2Co 12:12 Truly the signs of an apostle were wrought among you

in all patience.

in signs, and wonders, and mighty deeds.

2Co 12:13 For what is it wherein ye were inferior to other churches,

except it be that I myself was not burdensome to you? forgive me this wrong.

2Co 12:14 Behold, the third time I am ready to come to you;

and I will not be burdensome to you:

for I seek not yours, but you:

for the children ought not to lay up for the parents, but the parents for the children.

2Co 12:15 And I will very gladly spend and be spent for you;

though the more abundantly I love you, the less I be loved.

2Co 12:16 But be it so, I did not burden you:

nevertheless, being crafty, I caught you with guile.

2Co 12:17 Did I make a gain of you by any of them whom I sent unto you?

2Co 12:18 I desired Titus, and with him I sent a brother.

Did Titus make a gain of you?

walked we not in the same spirit? walked we not in the same steps?

2Co 12:19 Again, think ye that we excuse ourselves unto you?

we speak before **God** in **Christ**: but we do all things, dearly beloved, for your edifying.

2Co 12:20 For I fear, lest, when I come,

I shall not find you such as I would,

and that I shall be found unto you such as ye would not:

lest there be debates, envyings, wraths, strifes, backbitings, whisperings, swellings, tumults:

2Co 12:21 *And* lest, when I come again, my **God** will humble me among you, and *that* I shall bewail many which have sinned already, and have not repented of the uncleanness and fornication and lasciviousness [lusting] which they have committed.

Final Warnings

2Co 13:1 This is the third time I am coming to you.

and being absent now I write to them which heretofore have sinned, and to all other,

that, if I come again, I will not spare:

2Co 13:3 Since ye seek a proof of Christ speaking in me,

which to you-ward is not weak, but is mighty in you.

2Co 13:4 For though he was crucified through weakness,

yet **he** liveth by the power of **God**.

For we also are weak in him,

but we shall live with him by the power of God toward you.

2Co 13:5 Examine yourselves, whether ye be in the faith;

prove your own selves.

Know ye not your own selves, how that Jesus Christ is in you, except ye be reprobates?

2Co 13:6 But I trust that ye shall know that we are not reprobates.

2Co 13:7 Now I pray to **God** that ye do no evil; not that we should appear approved,

but that ye should do that which is honest, though we be as reprobates.

2Co 13:8 For we can do nothing against the truth, but for the truth.

2Co 13:9 For we are glad, when we are weak, and ye are strong: and this also we wish, *even* your perfection.

2Co 13:10 Therefore I write these things being absent, lest being present I should use sharpness, according to the power which the Lord hath given me to edification, and not to destruction.

In Closing

2Co 13:11 Finally, brethren, farewell.

Be perfect,

be of good comfort,

be of one mind,

live in peace;

and the God of love and peace shall be with you.

2Co 13:12 Greet one another with an holy kiss.

2Co 13:13 All the saints salute you.

2Co 13:14 The grace of the **Lord Jesus Christ**, and the love of **God**, and the communion of **the Holy Ghost** [Spirit], *be* with you all. Amen.

The second epistle to the Corinthians was written from Philippi, a city of Macedonia, by Titus and Lucas.
