Titus - KJV

Greetings

Tit 1:1 Paul,

- a servant of **God**,
- and an apostle of Jesus Christ,
- according to the faith of God's elect, and the acknowledging of the truth which is after godliness;
- Tit 1:2 In hope of eternal life, which God, that cannot lie, promised before the world began;
 - o Tit 1:3 But hath in due [proper] times manifested his word through preaching, which is committed unto me according to the commandment of God our Saviour;

Tit 1:4 To Titus,

• *mine* own son after the common faith:

Grace, mercy, and peace, from God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ our Saviour.

Teach what is proper behavior in the Church

Tit 1:5 For this cause left I thee in Crete, that thou shouldest set in order the things that are wanting,

and ordain elders in every city, as I had appointed thee:

Tit 1:6 If any be blameless.

the husband of one wife,

having faithful children not accused of riot or unruly.

Tit 1:7 For a **bishop** must be blameless, as the steward of God;

- not selfwilled,
- not soon angry,
- not given to wine,
- no striker, (Note: combative, aggressive, antagonistic, belligerent, warlike, quarrelsome, argumentative, contentious, disputatious, hostile, threatening, hot-tempered)
- not given to filthy lucre [dishonest gain];
- Tit 1:8 But a lover of hospitality,
- a lover of good men,
- sober [sensible],
- just,
- holy,
- temperate;
- Tit 1:9 Holding fast the faithful word as he hath been taught, that he may be able by sound doctrine both
 - to exhor
 - o and to convince the gainsayers [those who contradict].

Tit 1:10 For there are many unruly

and vain talkers and deceivers, specially they of the circumcision:

Tit 1:11 Whose mouths must be stopped,

- who subvert whole houses,
- teaching things which they ought not, for filthy lucre's sake.
- Tit 1:12 One of themselves, *even* a prophet of their own, said, The Cretians *are* alway liars, evil beasts, slow bellies. Tit 1:13 This witness is true.

Wherefore **rebuke them sharply**, that they may be sound in the faith; Tit 1:14 Not giving heed to Jewish fables, and commandments of men, that turn from the truth.

Tit 1:15 Unto the pure all things *are* pure:

but unto them that are defiled and unbelieving is nothing pure;

- but even their mind and conscience is defiled.
- Tit 1:16 They profess that they know God; but in works they deny him,
 - o being abominable, and disobedient,
 - o and unto every good work reprobate.

Tit 2:1 But speak thou the things which become sound doctrine:

Tit 2:2 That **the aged men** be

- sober,
- grave,
- temperate,
- sound in faith, in charity, in patience.

Tit 2:3 The aged women likewise, that they be

- in behaviour as becometh holiness,
- not false accusers,
- not given to much wine,
- teachers of good things;
- Tit 2:4 That they may teach **the young women**
 - o to be sober.
 - o to love their husbands,
 - o to love their children,
 - o Tit 2:5 To be discreet, chaste,
 - o keepers at home,
 - o good,
 - o obedient to their own husbands.

that the word of God be not blasphemed.

Tit 2:6 Young men likewise exhort to be sober minded.

Tit 2:7 In all things shewing thyself a pattern of good works:

- in doctrine *shewing* uncorruptness, gravity, sincerity,
- Tit 2:8 Sound speech, that cannot be condemned;

that he that is of the contrary part may be ashamed, having no evil thing to say of you.

Tit 2:9 *Exhort* servants

- to be obedient unto their own masters,
- and to please them well in all things;
- not answering again [not argumentative];
- Tit 2:10 Not purloining [pilfering],
- but shewing all good fidelity; that they may adorn the doctrine of God our Saviour in all things.

Tit 2:11 For the grace of God that bringeth salvation hath appeared to all men,

- Tit 2:12 Teaching us that, denying ungodliness and worldly lusts,
- we should live soberly, righteously, and godly, in this present world;
- Tit 2:13 Looking for that blessed hope, and the glorious appearing of the great God and our Saviour Jesus Christ; Tit 2:14 Who gave himself for us, that he might
 - o redeem us from all iniquity.
 - o and purify unto himself a peculiar people, zealous of good works.

Tit 2:15 **These things**

- speak,
- and exhort,
- and rebuke with all authority.

Let no man despise thee.

Be Ready for Every Good Work

Tit 3:1 Put them in mind

- to be subject to principalities and powers [rulers and authorities], to obey magistrates,
- to be ready to every good work,
- Tit 3:2 To speak evil of no man,
- to be no brawlers, but gentle, shewing all meekness unto all men.

Tit 3:3 For we ourselves also were sometimes foolish,

- disobedient.
- deceived,
- serving divers lusts and pleasures,
- living in malice and envy,
- hateful, *and* hating one another.

Tit 3:4 But after that the kindness and love of **God our Saviour** toward man appeared,

Tit 3:5b but according to his mercy he saved us,

- Tit 3:5a Not by works of righteousness which we have done,
- by the washing of regeneration, and renewing of the Holy Ghost;
 - o Tit 3:6 Which he shed on us abundantly through **Jesus Christ our Saviour**;
- Tit 3:7 That being justified by his grace, we should be made heirs according to the hope of eternal life.

Tit 3:8 This is a faithful saying,

and these things I will that thou affirm constantly,

that they which have believed in God might be careful to maintain good works.

These things are good and profitable unto men.

Tit 3:9 But avoid

- foolish questions,
- and genealogies,
- and contentions,
- and strivings about the law;

for they are unprofitable and vain.

Tit 3:10 A man that is an heretick [factious] after the first and second admonition reject;

Tit 3:11 Knowing that he that is such is subverted [perverted], and sinneth, being condemned of himself.

Final Instructions and Greetings

- Tit 3:12 When I shall send **Artemas** unto thee, or **Tychicus**, be diligent to come unto me to **Nicopolis**: for I have determined there to winter.
- Tit 3:13 Bring Zenas the lawyer and Apollos on their journey diligently, that nothing be wanting unto them.
- Tit 3:14 And let ours also learn to maintain good works for necessary uses, that they be not unfruitful.

Tit 3:15 All that are with me salute thee. Greet them that love us in the faith. Grace *be* with you all. Amen.

It was written to Titus, ordained the first bishop of the church of the Cretians, from Nicopolis of Macedonia.
