CB08 - KJV The Reign of Solomon

1Ki 2:12 Then sat **Solomon** upon the throne of **David** his father; and his kingdom was established greatly.

2Ch 1:1 And **Solomon** the son of **David** was strengthened in his kingdom, and **the LORD** his **God** was with him, and magnified him exceedingly.

Solomon has Adonijah, his usurping older stepbrother, put to death

- 1Ki 2:13 And Adonijah the son of Haggith came to Bathsheba the mother of Solomon. And she said, Comest thou peaceably? And he said, Peaceably.
- 1Ki 2:14 He said moreover, I have somewhat to say unto thee. And she said, Say on.
- 1Ki 2:15 And he said, Thou knowest that the kingdom was mine, and *that* all Israel set their faces on me, that I should reign: howbeit the kingdom is turned about, and is become my brother's: for it was his from the LORD.
- 1Ki 2:16 And now I ask one petition of thee, deny me not. And she said unto him, Say on.
- 1Ki 2:17 And he said, Speak, I pray thee, unto **Solomon** the king, (for he will not say thee nay,) that he give me **Abishag the Shunammite** to wife.
- 1Ki 2:18 And Bathsheba said, Well; I will speak for thee unto the king.
- 1Ki 2:19 **Bathsheba** therefore went unto king Solomon, to speak unto him for Adonijah. And the king rose up to meet her, and bowed himself unto her, and sat down on his throne, and caused a seat to be set for the king's mother; and she sat on his right hand.
- 1Ki 2:20 Then she said, I desire one small petition of thee; *I pray thee*, say me not nay. And the king said unto her, Ask on, my mother: for I will not say thee nay.
- 1Ki 2:21 And she said, Let **Abishag the Shunammite** be given to **Adonijah** thy brother to wife.
- 1Ki 2:22 And king Solomon answered and said unto his mother, And why dost thou ask Abishag the Shunammite for Adonijah? ask for him the kingdom also; for he *is* mine elder brother; even for him, and for Abiathar the priest, and for Joab the son of Zeruiah.
- 1Ki 2:23 Then king Solomon sware by the LORD, saying, God do so to me, and more also, if Adonijah have not spoken this word against his own life.
- 1Ki 2:24 Now therefore, as the LORD liveth, which hath established me, and set me on the throne of David my father, and who hath made me an house, as he promised, Adonijah shall be put to death this day.
- 1Ki 2:25 And king Solomon sent by the hand of Benaiah the son of Jehoiada; and he fell upon him that he died. Note: Benaiah was one of David's mighty men.

Solomon removes Abiathar from priesthood

- 1Ki 2:26 And unto **Abiathar the priest** said the king, Get thee to Anathoth, unto thine own fields; for thou *art* worthy of death: but I will not at this time put thee to death, because thou barest the ark of the Lord GOD before **David** my father, and because thou hast been afflicted in all wherein my father was afflicted.
- 1Ki 2:27 So Solomon thrust out **Abiathar** from being priest **unto the LORD**; that he might fulfil the word **of the LORD**, which he spake concerning the house of Eli in Shiloh.

Note: Abiathar the priest and Joab who was originally David's commander had aligned themselves with Adonijah when Adonijah exalted himself as king in place of Solomon, whom God designated to be heir to David's throne instead of David's oldest son

Solomon has Joab put to death

- 1Ki 2:28 Then tidings came to Joab: for Joab had turned after Adonijah, though he turned not after Absalom. And Joab fled unto the tabernacle of the LORD, and caught hold on the horns of the altar.
- 1Ki 2:29 And it was told king Solomon that Joab was fled unto the tabernacle of the LORD; and, behold, he is by the altar. Then Solomon sent Benaiah the son of Jehoiada, saying, Go, fall upon him.
- 1Ki 2:30 And **Benaiah** came to **the tabernacle of the LORD**, and said unto him, Thus saith the king, Come forth. And he said, Nay; but I will die here. And **Benaiah** brought the king word again, saying, Thus said **Joab**, and thus he answered me.
- 1Ki 2:31 And the king said unto him, Do as he hath said, and fall upon him, and bury him; that thou mayest take away the innocent blood, which Joab shed, from me, and from the house of my father.

1Ki 2:32 And the LORD shall return his blood upon his own head, who fell upon two men more righteous and better than he, and slew them with the sword, my father David not knowing thereof, to wit,

- Abner the son of Ner, captain of the host of Israel,
- and Amasa the son of Jether, captain of the host of Judah.

1Ki 2:33 Their blood shall therefore return upon the head of Joab, and upon the head of his seed for ever: but upon David, and upon his seed, and upon his house, and upon his throne, shall there be peace for ever from the LORD.

1Ki 2:34 So Benaiah the son of Jehoiada went up, and fell upon him, and slew him: and he was buried in his own house in the wilderness.

New appointments to replace the old

1Ki 2:35 And the king put **Benaiah** the son of **Jehoiada** in his room over the host: and **Zadok** the priest did the king put in the room of **Abiathar**.

Solomon has Shimei, who cursed David, put to death

1Ki 2:35 And the king put **Benaiah** the son of **Jehoiada** in his room over the host: and **Zadok** the priest did the king put in the room of **Abiathar**.

1Ki 2:36 And the king sent and called for **Shimei**, and said unto him, Build thee **an house** in **Jerusalem**, and dwell there, and go not forth thence any whither.

1Ki 2:37 For it shall be, *that* on the day thou goest out, and passest over **the brook Kidron**, thou shalt know for certain that thou shalt surely die: thy blood shall be upon thine own head.

1Ki 2:38 And **Shimei** said unto the king, The saying *is* good: as my lord the king hath said, so will thy servant do. And **Shimei** dwelt in **Jerusalem** many days.

1Ki 2:39 And it came to pass at the end of three years, that two of the servants of **Shimei** ran away unto **Achish son** of **Maachah king of Gath**. And they told **Shimei**, saying, Behold, thy servants be in **Gath**.

1Ki 2:40 And **Shimei** arose, and saddled his ass, and went to **Gath** to **Achish** to seek his servants: and **Shimei** went, and brought his servants from **Gath**.

1Ki 2:41 And it was told Solomon that Shimei had gone from Jerusalem to Gath, and was come again.

1Ki 2:42 And the king sent and called for **Shimei**, and said unto him, Did I not make thee to swear by **the LORD**, and protested unto thee, saying, Know for a certain, on the day thou goest out, and walkest abroad any whither, that thou shalt surely die? and thou saidst unto me, The word *that* I have heard *is* good.

1Ki 2:43 Why then hast thou not kept the oath of the LORD, and the commandment that I have charged thee with?

1Ki 2:44 The king said moreover to **Shimei**, Thou knowest all **the wickedness** which thine heart is privy to, that thou didst to **David** my father: therefore **the LORD** shall return thy **wickedness** upon thine own head;

1Ki 2:45 And king Solomon shall be blessed, and the throne of David shall be established before the LORD for ever.

1Ki 2:46a So the king commanded Benaiah the son of Jehoiada; which went out, and fell upon him, that he died.

1Ki 2:46b And the kingdom was established in the hand of Solomon.

A marriage alliance with Egypt

1Ki 3:1 And **Solomon** made affinity [marriage alliance] with **Pharaoh king of Egypt**, and took **Pharaoh's daughter**, and brought her into the city of **David**, until he had made an end of building his own house, and **the house of the LORD**, and the wall of **Jerusalem** round about.

A house for Solomon and his Egyptian wife

1Ki 9:24 But **Pharaoh's daughter** came up out of the city of **David** unto her house which **Solomon** had built for her:

then did he build Millo.

2Ch 8:11 And Solomon brought up the daughter of Pharaoh out of the city of David unto the house that he had built for her: for he said, My wife shall not dwell in the house of David king of Israel, because the places are holy, whereunto the ark of the LORD hath come.

Solomon's sacrifices in the high places in Gibeon of Benjamin

Ki 3:2 Only the people sacrificed in high places, because there was no house built unto the name of the LORD, until those days.

1Ki 3:3 And Solomon loved the LORD, walking in the statutes of David his father: only he sacrificed and burnt incense in high places.

1Ki 3:4 And the king went to **Gibeon** to sacrifice there; for that *was* the great high place: a thousand **burnt offerings** did **Solomon** offer upon that altar.

2Ch 1:2 Then **Solomon** spake unto **all Israel**, to the captains of thousands and of hundreds, and to the judges, and to every governor in **all Israel**, the chief of the fathers.

2Ch 1:3 So Solomon, and all the congregation with him, went to the high place that was at Gibeon; for there was the tabernacle of the congregation of God, which Moses the servant of the LORD had made in the wilderness.

2Ch 1:4 But the ark of God had David brought up from Kirjathjearim to the place which David had prepared for it: for he had pitched a tent for it at Jerusalem.

2Ch 1:5 Moreover the brasen altar, that Bezaleel the son of Uri, the son of Hur, had made, he put before the tabernacle of the LORD: and Solomon and the congregation sought unto it.

2Ch 1:6 And Solomon went up thither to the brasen altar before the LORD, which was at the tabernacle of the congregation, and offered a thousand burnt offerings upon it.

Asking for wisdom above all else

1Ki 3:5 In **Gibeon the LORD** appeared to **Solomon** in a dream by night: and **God** said, Ask what I shall give thee.

1Ki 3:6 And Solomon said, Thou hast shewed unto thy servant David my father great mercy, according as he walked before thee in truth, and in righteousness, and in uprightness of heart with thee; and thou hast kept for him this great kindness, that thou hast given him a son to sit on his throne, as it is this day.

1Ki 3:7 And now, O LORD my God, thou hast made thy servant king instead of David my father: and I am but a little child: I know not how to go out or come in.

1Ki 3:8 And thy servant is in the midst of thy people which thou hast chosen, a great people, that cannot be numbered nor counted for multitude.

1Ki 3:9 Give therefore thy servant an understanding heart to judge thy people, that I may discern between good and bad: for who is able to judge this thy so great a people?

2Ch 1:7 In that night did God appear unto Solomon, and said unto him, Ask what I shall give thee.

2Ch 1:8 And Solomon said unto God, Thou hast shewed great mercy unto David my father, and hast made me to reign in his stead.

2Ch 1:9 Now, O LORD **God**, let thy promise unto **David** my father be established:

for thou hast made me king over a people like the dust of the earth in multitude.

2Ch 1:10 Give me now wisdom and knowledge, that I may go out and come in before this people: for who can judge this thy people, that is so great?

1Ki 3:10 And the speech pleased the Lord, that **Solomon** had asked this thing.

1Ki 3:11 And God said unto him, Because thou hast asked this thing, and hast not asked for thyself long life; neither hast asked riches for thyself, nor hast asked the life of thine enemies; but hast asked for thyself understanding to discern judgment;

1Ki 3:12 Behold, I have done according to thy words: lo, I have given thee a wise and an **understanding** heart; so that there was none like thee before thee, neither after thee shall any arise like unto thee.

1Ki 3:13 And I have also given thee that which thou hast not asked, both **riches**, and **honour**: so that there shall not be any among the kings like unto thee all thy days.

1Ki 3:14 And if thou wilt walk in my ways, to keep my **statutes** and my **commandments**, as thy father **David** did walk, then I will lengthen thy days.

1Ki 3:15 And Solomon awoke; and, behold, it was a dream.

And he came to Jerusalem, and stood before the ark of the covenant of the LORD, and offered up burnt offerings, and offered peace offerings, and made a feast to all his servants.

2Ch 1:11 And God said to Solomon, Because this was in thine heart,

and thou hast not asked **riches**, wealth, or **honour**, nor the **life** of thine enemies, neither yet hast asked long **life**; but hast asked **wisdom** and **knowledge** for thyself, that thou mayest judge **my people**, over whom I have made thee king:

2Ch 1:12 **Wisdom** and **knowledge** *is* granted unto thee;

and I will give thee **riches**, and wealth, and **honour**, such as none of the kings have had that *have been* before thee, neither shall there any after thee have the like.

2Ch 1:13 Then **Solomon** came *from his journey* to the high place that *was* at **Gibeon** to **Jerusalem**, from before the tabernacle of the congregation,

and reigned over Israel.

Discovering the true mother of a child switched at birth

1Ki 3:16 Then came there two women, that were harlots, unto the king, and stood before him.

1Ki 3:17 And the one woman said,

O my lord, I and this woman dwell in one house; and I was delivered of a child with her in the house

1Ki 3:18 And it came to pass the third day after that I was delivered, that this woman was delivered also: and we *were* together; *there was* no stranger with us in **the house**, save we two in **the house**.

1Ki 3:19 And this woman's child died in the night; because she overlaid it.

1Ki 3:20 And she arose at midnight, and took my son from beside me, while thine handmaid slept, and laid it in her bosom, and laid her dead child in my bosom.

1Ki 3:21 And when I rose in the morning to give my child suck, behold, it was dead: but when I had considered it in the morning, behold, it was not my son, which I did bear.

1Ki 3:22 And the other woman said,

Nay; but the living is my son, and the dead is thy son.

And this said,

No; but the dead is thy son, and the living is my son. Thus they spake before the king.

1Ki 3:23 Then said the king,

The one saith, This *is* my son that liveth, and thy son *is* the dead: and the other saith, Nay; but thy son *is* the dead, and my son *is* the living.

- 1Ki 3:24 And the king said, Bring me a sword. And they brought a sword before the king.
- 1Ki 3:25 And the king said, **Divide the living child in two**, and give half to the one, and half to the other.
- 1Ki 3:26 Then spake the woman whose the living child *was* unto the king, for her bowels yearned upon her son, and she said, O my lord, give her the living child, and in no wise slay it. But the other said, Let it be neither mine nor thine, *but* divide *it*.
- 1Ki 3:27 Then the king answered and said, Give her the living child, and in no wise slay it: she is the mother thereof
- 1Ki 3:28 And all Israel heard of the judgment which the king had judged; and they feared the king: for they saw that the wisdom of God was in him, to do judgment.

The leadership in Solomon's kingdom

1Ki 4:1 So king Solomon was king over all Israel.

1Ki 4:2 And these were the princes which he had;

- Azariah the son of Zadok the priest,
- 1Ki 4:3 Elihoreph and Ahiah, the sons of Shisha, scribes;
- Jehoshaphat the son of Ahilud, the recorder.
- 1Ki 4:4 And Benaiah the son of Jehoiada was over the host:
- and Zadok and Abiathar were the priests:
 - o Note: 1Ki 2:27 ... Solomon terminated Abiathar from being priest to the LORD...
- 1Ki 4:5 And Azariah the son of Nathan was over the officers:
- and Zabud the son of Nathan was principal officer, and the king's friend:
- 1Ki 4:6 And Ahishar was over the household:
- and Adoniram the son of Abda was over the tribute.

1Ki 4:7 **And Solomon had twelve officers over all Israel,** which provided victuals for the king and his household: each man his month in a year made provision.

1Ki 4:8 And these are their names:

- The son of Hur, in mount Ephraim:
- 1Ki 4:9 The son of Dekar, in Makaz, and in Shaalbim, and Bethshemesh, and Elonbethhanan:
- 1Ki 4:10 The son of Hesed, in Aruboth; to him *pertained* Sochoh, and all the land of Hepher:
- 1Ki 4:11 The son of Abinadab, in all the region of Dor; which had Taphath the daughter of **Solomon** to wife:
- 1Ki 4:12 Baana the son of Ahilud; *to him pertained* Taanach and Megiddo, and all Bethshean, which *is* by Zartanah beneath Jezreel, from Bethshean to Abelmeholah, *even* unto *the place that is* beyond Jokneam:
- 1Ki 4:13 The son of Geber, in Ramothgilead; to him *pertained* the towns of Jair the son of Manasseh, which *are* in Gilead; to him *also pertained* the region of Argob, which *is* in Bashan, threescore great cities with walls and brasen bars:
- 1Ki 4:14 Ahinadab the son of Iddo had Mahanaim:
- 1Ki 4:15 Ahimaaz was in Naphtali; he also took Basmath the daughter of Solomon to wife:
- 1Ki 4:16 Baanah the son of Hushai was in Asher and in Aloth:
- 1Ki 4:17 Jehoshaphat the son of Paruah, in Issachar:
- 1Ki 4:18 **Shimei** the son of Elah, in Benjamin:
- 1Ki 4:19 Geber the son of Uri was in the country of Gilead, in the country of Sihon king of the Amorites, and of Og king of Bashan; and he was the only officer which was in the land.

Solomon's dominion

1Ki 4:20 **Judah** and **Israel** *were* many, as the sand which *is* by the sea in multitude, eating and drinking, and making merry.

Note:

Judah - southern kingdom including Judah and Simeon,

Israel - northern kingdom including the tribes on the east side of the Jordan River.

1Ki 4:21 And Solomon reigned over all kingdoms from the river (note Gen 15:18, Deu 11:24,

2 Sam 8:3: Euphrates) unto the land of the Philistines, and unto the border of Egypt: they brought presents, and served Solomon all the days of his life.

1Ki 4:22 And Solomon's provision for one day was

- thirty measures of fine flour,
- and threescore measures of meal,
- 1Ki 4:23 Ten fat **oxen**,
- and twenty **oxen** out of the pastures,
- and an hundred sheep, beside harts, and roebucks, and fallowdeer, and fatted fowl.

1Ki 4:24 For he had dominion

- over all *the region* on this side the river, from Tiphsah even to Azzah,
- over all the kings on this side the river:

and he had peace on all sides round about him.

1Ki 4:25 And Judah and Israel dwelt safely, every man under his vine and under his fig tree, from Dan even to Beersheba, all the days of Solomon.

1Ki 4:26 And Solomon had forty thousand stalls of horses for his chariots, and twelve thousand horsemen.

1Ki 4:27 And those officers provided victual for king Solomon, and for all that came unto king Solomon's table, every man in his month: they lacked nothing.

1Ki 4:28 Barley also and straw for the horses and dromedaries brought they unto the place where *the officers* were, every man according to his charge.

God gives Unsurpassed Wisdom, Discernment, and Knowledge to Solomon

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1Ki 4:29 And God gave Solo	mon wisdom and	1Ki 4:29 Now God gave Solomon wisdom and very
understanding exceeding mu	ach, <mark>and</mark> largeness of	great discernment and breadth of mind, like the sand
heart, even as the sand that is	on the sea shore. (KJV)	that is on the seashore. (NASV)

1Ki 4:30 And Solomon's wisdom excelled

- the wisdom of all the children of the east country,
- and all the wisdom of Egypt.

1Ki 4:31 For he was wiser than all men;

- than Ethan the Ezrahite.
- and Heman, and Chalcol,
- and Darda,
- the sons of Mahol:

and his fame was in all nations round about.

1Ki 4:32 And he spake three thousand proverbs: and his songs were a thousand and five.

Note: Not all of these are recorded in the Biblical canon.

1Ki 4:33 And he spake of trees, from the cedar tree that *is* in **Lebanon** even unto the hyssop that springeth out of the wall: he spake also of beasts, and of fowl, and of creeping things, and of fishes.

1Ki 4:34 And there came of all people to hear the **wisdom** of **Solomon**, from all kings of the earth, which had heard of his **wisdom**.

- Pro 1:6 To understand a proverb, and the interpretation; the words of the wise, and their dark sayings.
- Pro 1:8 My son, hear the **instruction** of thy father, and forsake not the **law** of thy mother:
- Pro 1:9 For they shall be an ornament of grace unto thy head, and chains [necklace] about thy neck.
- Pro 27:11 My son, be wise, and make my heart glad, that I may answer him that reproacheth me.

The Fear of the LORD

- Pro 1:7 The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge: but fools despise wisdom and instruction.
- Pro 8:13 The fear of the LORD is to hate evil: pride, and arrogancy, and the evil way, and the froward mouth, do I hate.
- Pro 9:10 The fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom: and the knowledge of the holy is understanding. Pro 9:11 For by me thy days shall be multiplied, and the years of thy life shall be increased.
- Pro 10:27 The fear of the LORD prolongeth days: but the years of the wicked shall be shortened.
- Pro 14:26 In the fear of the LORD is strong confidence: and his children shall have a place of refuge.
- Pro 14:27 The fear of the LORD is a fountain of life, to depart from the snares of death.
- Pro 15:33 The fear of the LORD is the instruction of wisdom; and before honour is humility.

- Pro 1:11 If they say, Come with us, let us lay wait for blood, let us lurk privily for the innocent without cause:

- Pro 1:12 Let us swallow them up alive as the grave; and whole, as those that go down into the pit:
- Pro 1:13 We shall find all precious substance, we shall fill our houses with spoil:
- Pro 1:14 Cast in thy lot among us; let us all have one purse:
- Pro 1:15 My son, walk not thou in the way with them; refrain thy foot from their path:
- Pro 1:16 For their feet run to evil, and make haste to shed blood.
- Pro 1:17 Surely in vain the net is spread in the sight of any bird.
- Pro 1:18 And they lay wait for their *own* blood; they lurk privily for their *own* lives.
- Pro 1:19 So are the ways of every one that is greedy of gain [who gains by violence]; which taketh away the life of the owners thereof.

A warning to the Naïve and Complacent

- Pro 24:10 If thou faint [are slack] in the day of adversity, thy strength is small.
- Pro 24:11 If thou forbear [restrain, fail, are unconcerned] to deliver them that are drawn unto death, and those that are ready to be slain;
- Pro 24:12 If thou sayest, Behold, we knew it not; doth not he that pondereth the heart consider *it*? and he that keepeth thy soul, doth *not* he know *it*? and shall *not* he render to *every* man according to his works?
- Pro 1:20 **Wisdom** crieth without; she uttereth her voice in the streets:
- Pro 1:21 She crieth in the chief place of concourse, in the openings of the gates: in the city she uttereth her words, *saying*,
 - Pro 1:22 How long, ye simple ones, will ye love simplicity? and the scorners delight in their scorning, and fools hate knowledge?
 - Pro 1:23 Turn you at my reproof: behold, I will pour out my spirit unto you, I will make known my words unto you.
 - Pro 1:24 Because I have called, and ye refused; I have stretched out my hand, and no man regarded;
 - Pro 1:25 But ye have set at nought all my counsel, and would none of my reproof:
 - Pro 1:26 I also will laugh at your calamity; I will mock when your fear cometh;
 - Pro 1:27 When your fear cometh as desolation, and your destruction cometh as a whirlwind; when distress and anguish cometh upon you.
 - Pro 1:28 Then shall they call upon me, but I will not answer; they shall seek me early, but they shall not find me:
 - Pro 1:29 For that they hated **knowledge**, and did not choose the fear **of the LORD**:
 - Pro 1:30 They would none of my counsel: they despised all my reproof.
 - Pro 1:31 Therefore shall they eat of the fruit of their own way, and be filled with their own devices.
 - Pro 1:32 For the turning away of the **simple** shall slay them, and the prosperity of **fools** shall destroy them.
- Pro 1:33 But whoso hearkeneth [listens] unto me shall dwell safely, and shall be quiet from fear of evil.

Pro 2:1 My son,

- receive my words, and hide my commandments with thee;
- Pro 2:2 So that thou incline thine ear unto wisdom, and apply thine heart to understanding;
- Pro 2:3 Yea, if thou criest after knowledge, and liftest up thy voice for understanding;
- Pro 2:4 If thou seekest her as silver, and searchest for her as for hid treasures;

Pro 2:5

Then shalt thou

- understand the fear of the LORD,
- and find the **knowledge of God**.

Pro 2:6 For the LORD giveth wisdom: out of his mouth cometh knowledge and understanding.

Pro 2:7 He layeth up sound wisdom for the righteous:

he is a buckler [shield] to them that walk uprightly.

- Pro 2:8 He keepeth the paths of judgment,
- and preserveth the way of his saints.

Pro 2:9

Then shalt thou understand

righteousness, and judgment, and equity; yea, every good path.

Pro 2:10, 11

When

- wisdom entereth into thine heart,
- and knowledge is pleasant unto thy soul;
- Pro 2:11 **Discretion** shall preserve thee,
- understanding shall keep thee:

Pro 2:12

To deliver thee

from the way of the evil man,

from the man that speaketh **froward** [perverse, fraudulent] things;

Pro 2:13 Who leave the paths of uprightness, to walk in the ways of darkness;

- Pro 2:14 Who rejoice to do evil, and delight in the frowardness of the wicked;
- Pro 2:15 Whose ways are crooked, and they froward in their paths:

Pro 2:16

To deliver thee

from the strange woman, even from the stranger [adultress] which flattereth with her words;

Pro 2:17 Which forsaketh the guide of her youth, and forgetteth the covenant of her God.

Pro 2:18 For her house inclineth unto death, and her paths unto the dead.

Pro 2:19 None that go unto her return again, neither take they hold of the paths of life.

- Pro 2:20 That thou mayest walk in the way of good men, and keep the paths of the righteous.
- Pro 2:21 For the upright shall dwell in the land, and the perfect [blameless] shall remain in it.
- Pro 2:22 But the wicked shall be cut off from the earth, and the transgressors [treacherous, covert] shall be rooted out of it.

Pro 3:1 My son, forget not my law; but let thine heart keep my commandments: Pro 3:2 For length of days, and long life, and peace, shall they add to thee.

Pro 3:3 Let not mercy and truth forsake thee: bind them about thy neck; write them upon the table of thine heart:

Pro 3:4 So shalt thou find favour and good **understanding** in the sight **of God** and man.

Pro 3:5 Trust in the LORD with all thine heart; and lean not unto thine own understanding.

Pro 3:6 In all thy ways acknowledge him, and he shall direct thy paths.

- Pro 3:7 Be not wise in thine own eyes: fear the LORD, and depart from evil.

- Pro 3:11 My son, despise not the chastening of the LORD; neither be weary of his correction:
- Pro 3:12 For whom the LORD loveth he correcteth; even as a father the son in whom he delighteth.

The value of Wisdom and Understanding

- Pro 3:13 Happy is the man that findeth wisdom, and the man that getteth understanding.
- Pro 3:14 For the merchandise [profit] of it is better than the merchandise of silver, and the gain thereof than fine gold.
- Pro 3:15 She is more precious than rubies: and all the things thou canst desire are not to be compared unto her.
- Pro 3:16 Length of days is in her right hand; and in her left hand riches [wealth] and honour.
- Pro 3:17 Her ways are ways of pleasantness, and all her paths are peace.
- Pro 3:18 She is a tree of life to them that lay hold upon her: and happy is every one that retaineth her.
- Pro 3:21 My son,

let not them depart from thine eyes:

keep sound wisdom and discretion:

- Pro 3:22 So shall they be life unto thy soul, and grace to thy neck.
- Pro 3:23 Then shalt thou walk in thy way safely, and thy foot shall not stumble.
- Pro 3:24 When thou liest down, thou shalt not be afraid: yea, thou shalt lie down, and thy sleep shall be sweet.
- Pro 3:25 Be not afraid of sudden fear, neither of the desolation of the wicked, when it cometh.
- Pro 3:26 For the LORD shall be thy confidence, and shall keep thy foot from being taken.

Seek and Keep Knowledge and Truth

- Pro 20:15 There is gold, and a multitude of rubies: but the lips of **knowledge** are a precious jewel.
- Pro 22:17 Bow down thine ear, and hear the words of the wise, and apply thine heart unto my knowledge.
- Pro 22:18 For it is a pleasant thing if thou keep them within thee; they shall withal [ready] be fitted in thy lips.
- Pro 22:19 That thy trust may be in the LORD, I have made known to thee this day, even to thee.
- Pro 22:20 Have not I written to thee excellent things in counsels and knowledge,
- Pro 22:21 That I might make thee know the certainty of the **words of truth**; that thou mightest answer **the words of truth** to them that send unto thee?
- Pro 18:15 The heart of the prudent getteth knowledge; and the ear of the wise seeketh knowledge.

Seek Wisdom and Understanding

- Pro 23:15 My son, if thine heart be wise, my heart shall rejoice, even mine.
- Pro 23:16 Yea, my reins shall rejoice, when thy lips speak right things.
- Pro 23:18 For surely there is an end; and thine expectation shall not be cut off.
- Pro 23:19 Hear thou, my son, and be wise, and guide thine heart in the way.
- Pro 23:22 Hearken unto thy father that begat thee, and despise not thy mother when she is old.
- Pro 23:23 **Buy** the truth, and sell it not; also wisdom, and instruction, and understanding.
- Pro 24:3 Through wisdom is an house builded; and by understanding it is established:
- Pro 24:4 And by **knowledge** shall the chambers be filled with all precious and pleasant riches.
- Pro 23:26 My son, give me thine heart, and let thine eyes observe my ways.

Pro 4:1 Hear, ye children, the instruction of a father, and attend to know understanding.Pro 4:2 For I give you good doctrine, forsake ye not my law.

Pro 4:3 For I was my father's son, tender and only beloved in the sight of my mother.

Pro 4:4

He taught me also, and said unto me,

Let thine heart retain my words:

keep my commandments, and live.

Pro 4:5 **Get wisdom**, get understanding: forget it not;

neither decline from the words of my mouth.

Pro 4:6 **Forsake her not**, and she shall preserve thee:

love her, and she shall keep thee.

Pro 4:7 **Wisdom** is the principal thing;

therefore get wisdom: and with all thy getting get understanding.

Pro 4:8 **Exalt her,** and she shall promote thee:

she shall bring thee to honour, when thou dost embrace her.

- Pro 4:9 She shall give to thine head an ornament of grace:
- a crown of glory shall she deliver to thee.

Pro 4:10

Hear, O my son, and receive my sayings;

and the years of thy **life** shall be many.

- Pro 4:11 I have taught thee in the way of wisdom; I have led thee in right paths.
- Pro 4:12 When thou goest, thy steps shall not be straitened [in straits, vexed, narrowed]; and when thou runnest, thou shalt not stumble.
- Pro 4:13 Take fast hold of instruction; let her not go: keep her; for she is thy life.

Skilled

Pro 22:29 Seest thou a man diligent in his business? he shall stand before kings; he shall not stand before mean [dark, obscure] *men*.

Light verses Darkness

- Pro 4:14 Enter not into the path of the wicked, and go not in the way of evil men.
- Pro 4:15 Avoid it, pass not by it, turn from it, and pass away.
- Pro 4:16 For they sleep not, except they have done mischief; and their sleep is taken away, unless they cause *some* to fall.
- Pro 4:17 For they eat the bread of wickedness, and drink the wine of violence.
- Pro 4:18 But the path of the just is as the shining light, that shineth more and more unto the perfect [full, noon] day.
- Pro 4:19 The way of the wicked is as darkness: they know not at what they stumble.

Diligence in righteousness

Pro 4:20 My son, attend to my words; incline thine ear unto my sayings.

- Pro 4:21 Let them not depart from thine eyes; keep them in the midst of thine heart.
- Pro 4:22 For they are life unto those that find them, and health to all their flesh.
- Pro 4:23 **Keep thy heart** with all **diligence**; for out of it *are* the issues of **life**.
- Pro 4:24 Put away from thee a froward [deceitful] mouth, and perverse lips put far from thee.
- Pro 4:25 Let thine eyes look right on, and let thine eyelids look straight before thee.
- Pro 4:26 **Ponder the path of thy feet,** and let all thy ways be established.
- Pro 4:27 Turn not to the right hand nor to the left: **remove** thy foot **from evil**.

About giving in to sexual temptation

Pro 5:1-2

My son, attend unto my wisdom, and bow thine ear to my understanding: That thou mayest regard discretion, and that thy lips may keep knowledge.

- Pro 5:3 For the lips of a strange woman drop as an honeycomb, and her mouth is smoother than oil:
- Pro 5:4 But her end is bitter as wormwood, sharp as a twoedged sword.
- Pro 5:5 Her feet go down to death; her steps take hold on hell.
- Pro 5:6 Lest thou shouldest ponder the path of life, her ways are moveable, that thou canst not know them.
- Pro 5:7 Hear me now therefore, O ye children, and depart not from the words of my mouth.
- Pro 5:8 Remove thy way far from her, and come not night he door of her house:
 - Pro 5:9 Lest thou give thine honour unto others, and thy years unto the cruel:
 - Pro 5:10 Lest strangers be filled with thy wealth; and thy labours be in the house of a stranger;
 - Pro 5:11 And thou mourn at the last, when thy flesh and thy body are consumed,
 - Pro 5:12 And say, How have I hated instruction, and my heart despised reproof;
 - Pro 5:13 And have not obeyed the voice of my teachers, nor inclined mine ear to them that instructed me!
 - Pro 5:14 I was almost in all evil in the midst of the congregation and assembly.
- Pro 5:15 Drink waters out of thine own cistern, and running waters out of thine own well.
- Pro 5:16 Let thy [Context: Should your] fountains be dispersed abroad, and rivers of waters in the streets. [?]
- Pro 5:17 Let them be only thine own, and not strangers' with thee.
- Pro 5:18 Let thy fountain be blessed: and rejoice with the wife of thy youth.
- Pro 5:19 Let her be as the loving hind and pleasant roe; let her breasts satisfy thee at all times; and be thou ravished always with her love.
- Pro 5:20 And why wilt thou, my son, be ravished with a **strange woman**, and embrace the bosom of a stranger?
- Pro 5:21 For the ways of man *are* before the eyes **of the LORD**, and he pondereth all his goings.
- Pro 5:22 His own iniquities shall take the wicked himself, and he shall be holden with the cords of his sins.
- Pro 5:23 He shall die without **instruction**; and in the greatness of his folly he shall go astray.

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My son, keep thy father's commandment, and forsake not the **law** of thy mother: **Bind them** continually upon thine heart, and tie them about thy neck.

Pro 6:22

When thou goest, it shall lead thee; when thou sleepest, it shall keep thee; and *when* thou awakest, it shall talk with thee.

Pro 6:23 For

the **commandment** is a lamp; and the **law** is light; and reproofs of **instruction** are the way of **life**:

- Pro 6:24 To keep thee from the evil woman, from the flattery of the tongue of a strange [adulteress] woman.
- Pro 6:25 Lust not after her beauty in thine heart; neither let her take thee with her eyelids.
- Pro 6:26 For by means of a whorish woman *a man is brought* to a piece of bread: and the adulteress will hunt for **the precious life**.
- Pro 6:27 Can a man take fire in his bosom, and his clothes not be burned?
- Pro 6:28 Can one go upon hot coals, and his feet not be burned?
- Pro 6:29 So he that goeth in to his neighbour's wife; whosoever toucheth her shall not be innocent.
- Pro 6:32 But whoso committeth adultery with a woman lacketh **understanding**: he *that* doeth it destroyeth his own soul.
- Pro 6:33 A wound and dishonour shall he get; and his reproach shall not be wiped away.
- Pro 6:34 For jealousy is the rage of a man: therefore he will not spare in the day of vengeance.
- Pro 6:35 He will not regard any ransom; neither will he rest content, though thou givest many gifts.

Pro 7:1-5

My son, keep my words,

and lay up my commandments with thee.

Keep my commandments, and live;

and my law as the apple of thine eye.

Bind them upon thy fingers,

write them upon the table of thine heart.

Say unto **wisdom**, Thou *art* my sister; and call **understanding** *thy* kinswoman:

That they may keep thee from the **strange woman**, from the stranger *which* flattereth with her words.

- Pro 7:6 For at the window of my house I looked through my casement,
- Pro 7:7 And beheld among the simple ones, I discerned among the youths, a young man void of understanding,
- Pro 7:8 Passing through the street near her corner; and he went the way to her house,
- Pro 7:9 In the twilight, in the evening, in the black and dark night:
- Pro 7:10 And, behold, there met him a woman with the attire of an harlot, and subtil of heart.
- Pro 7:11 (She is loud and stubborn; her feet abide not in her house:
- Pro 7:12 Now is she without, now in the streets, and lieth in wait at every corner.)
- Pro 7:13 So she caught him, and kissed him, and with an impudent face said unto him,
- Pro 7:14 I have peace offerings with me; this day have I payed my vows.
- Pro 7:15 Therefore came I forth to meet thee, diligently to seek thy face, and I have found thee.
- Pro 7:16 I have decked my bed with coverings of tapestry, with carved works, with fine linen of Egypt.
- Pro 7:17 I have perfumed my bed with myrrh, aloes, and cinnamon.
- Pro 7:18 Come, let us take our fill of love until the morning: let us solace ourselves with loves.
- Pro 7:19 For the goodman is not at home, he is gone a long journey:
- Pro 7:20 He hath taken a bag of money with him, and will come home at the day appointed.

- Pro 7:21 With her much fair speech she caused him to yield, with the flattering of her lips she forced him.
- Pro 7:22 He goeth after her straightway, as an ox goeth to the slaughter, or as a fool to the correction of the stocks;
- Pro 7:23 Till a dart strike through his liver; as a bird hasteth to the snare, and knoweth not that it is for his life.
- Pro 7:24 Hearken unto me now therefore, O ye children, and attend to the words of my mouth.
- Pro 7:25 Let not thine heart decline to her ways, go not astray in her paths.
- Pro 7:26 For she hath cast down many wounded: yea, many strong *men* have been slain by her.
- Pro 7:27 Her house is the way to hell, going down to the chambers of death.
- Pro 9:13 A **foolish** woman *is* clamorous: *she is* **simple**, and knoweth nothing.
- Pro 9:14 For she sitteth at the door of her house, on a seat in the high places of the city,
- Pro 9:15 To call passengers who go right on their ways:
- Pro 9:16 Whoso is **simpl**e, let him turn in hither: and as for him that wanteth **understanding**, she saith to him,
- Pro 9:17 Stolen waters are sweet, and bread eaten in secret is pleasant.
- Pro 9:18 But he knoweth not that the dead *are* there; and that her guests are in the depths of hell.
- Pro 22:14 The mouth of strange women is a deep pit: he that is abhorred of the LORD shall fall therein.
- Pro 23:27 For a whore is a deep ditch; and a strange woman is a narrow pit.
- Pro 23:28 She also lieth in wait as for a prey, and increaseth the transgressors among men.

Laziness results in Poverty

- Pro 6:6 Go to the ant, thou **sluggard**; consider her ways, and be wise:
- Pro 6:7 Which having no guide, overseer, or ruler,
- Pro 6:8 Provideth her meat in the summer, and gathereth her food in the harvest.
- Pro 6:9 How long wilt thou sleep, O sluggard? when wilt thou arise out of thy sleep?
- Pro 6:10 *Yet* a little sleep, a little slumber, a little folding of the hands to sleep:
- Pro 6:11 So shall thy poverty come as one that travelleth, and thy want as an armed man.
- Pro 24:30 I went by the field of the **slothful**, and by the vineyard of the man void of **understanding**;
- Pro 24:31 And, lo, it was all grown over with thorns, *and* nettles had covered the face thereof, and the stone wall thereof was broken down.
- Pro 24:32 Then I saw, and considered it well: I looked upon it, and received instruction.
- Pro 24:33 Yet a little sleep, a little slumber, a little folding of the hands to sleep:
- Pro 24:34 So shall thy poverty come as one that travelleth; and thy want as an armed man.
- Pro 19:24 A slothful man hideth his hand in his bosom, and will not so much as bring it to his mouth again.
- Pro 20:4 The **sluggard** will not plow by reason of the cold; *therefore* shall he beg in harvest, and *have* nothing.
- Pro 20:13 Love not sleep, lest thou come to poverty; open thine eyes, and thou shalt be satisfied with bread.
- Pro 21:25 The desire of the **slothful** killeth him; for his hands refuse to labour.
- Pro 21:26 He coveteth greedily all the day long: but the righteous giveth and spareth not.
- Pro 22:13 The **slothful** man saith, There is a lion without, I shall be slain in the streets.

A thief

- Pro 6:30 Men do not despise a thief, if he steal to satisfy his soul when he is hungry;
- Pro 6:31 But if he be found, he shall restore sevenfold; he shall give all the substance of his house.

Do not take on responsibility for your neighbor's debts

- Pro 6:1 My son, if thou be surety for thy friend, if thou hast stricken thy hand with a stranger,
- Pro 6:2 Thou art snared with the words of thy mouth, thou art taken with the words of thy mouth.
- Pro 6:3 Do this now, my son, and deliver thyself, when thou art come into the hand of thy friend; go, humble thyself, and make sure thy friend.

- Pro 6:4 Give not sleep to thine eyes, nor slumber to thine eyelids.
- Pro 6:5 Deliver thyself as a roe from the hand of the hunter, and as a bird from the hand of the fowler.
- Pro 11:15 He that is surety for a **stranger** shall smart *for it*: and he that hateth suretiship is sure.
- Pro 22:26 Be not thou *one* of them that strike hands, *or* of them that are sureties for debts.
- Pro 22:27 If thou hast nothing to pay, why should he take away thy bed from under thee?
- Pro 20:16 Take his garment that is surety for a stranger: and take a pledge of him for a strange woman.
- Pro 27:13 Take his garment that is surety for a stranger, and take a pledge of him for a strange woman.

A Worthless Person

Pro 6:12 A naughty [worthless] person, a wicked man,

- walketh with a **froward** mouth.
- He winketh with his eyes,
- he speaketh [signals] with his feet,
- he teacheth [points] with his fingers;
- Frowardness [perversity] *is* in his heart,
- he deviseth mischief continually;
- he soweth discord.

Pro 6:15 Therefore shall his calamity come suddenly; suddenly shall he be broken without remedy.

The Abominable

- Pro 16:5 Every one that is proud in heart is an abomination to the LORD: though hand join in hand, he shall not be unpunished.
- Pro 16:27 An ungodly man diggeth up evil: and in his lips there is as a burning fire.
- Pro 16:28 A froward man soweth strife: and a whisperer separateth chief friends.
- Pro 16:29 A violent man enticeth his neighbour, and leadeth him into the way that is not good.
- Pro 16:30 a He shutteth his eyes to devise froward things:...
- Pro 17:4 A wicked doer giveth heed to false lips; and a liar giveth ear to a naughty tongue.
- Pro 17:5 Whoso mocketh the poor reproacheth his Maker: and he that is glad at calamities shall not be unpunished.
- Pro 17:11 An evil man seeketh only rebellion: therefore a cruel messenger shall be sent against him.
- Pro 17:13 Whoso rewardeth evil for good, evil shall not depart from his house.
- Pro 17:19 **He loveth transgression** that loveth strife: and he that exalteth his gate seeketh destruction.
- Pro 17:20 He that hath a **froward heart** findeth no good: and he that hath a **perverse tongue** falleth into mischief.
- Pro 18:3 When the wicked cometh, then cometh also contempt, and with ignominy reproach.
- Pro 18:8 The words of a talebearer are as wounds, and they go down into the innermost parts of the belly.
- Pro 18:9 He also that is **slothful** in his work is brother to him that is a great waster.
- **Pro 19:1** Better is the poor that walketh in his integrity, than he that is perverse in his lips, and is a fool.
- Pro 20:19 He that goeth about as a talebearer revealeth secrets: therefore meddle not with him that flattereth with his lins.
- Pro 21:8 The way of man is **froward** and strange: but as for the pure, his work is right.
- Pro 21:10 The soul of the wicked desireth evil: his neighbour findeth no favour in his eyes.
- Pro 21:13 Whoso stoppeth his ears at the cry of the poor, he also shall cry himself, but shall not be heard.
- Pro 21:24 **Proud and haughty scorner** is his name, who dealeth in **proud** wrath.
- Pro 21:28 A false witness shall perish: but the man that heareth speaketh constantly.
- Pro 21:29 A wicked man hardeneth his face: but as for the upright, he directeth his way.
- **Pro 22:5** Thorns and snares are in the way of the **froward**: he that doth keep his soul shall be far from them.
- Pro 22:8 He that soweth iniquity shall reap vanity: and the rod of his anger shall fail.
- Pro 22:12 The eyes of the LORD preserve knowledge, and he overthroweth the words of the transgressor.

Abominations

These six things doth the LORD hate: yea, seven are an abomination unto him:

- A proud look,
- a lying tongue,
- and hands that shed innocent blood,
- An heart that deviseth wicked imaginations [plans],
- feet that be swift in running to mischief,
- A false witness *that* speaketh lies,
- and he that soweth discord among brethren.
- Pro 3:27 Withhold not good from them to whom it is due, when it is in the power of thine hand to do it.
- Pro 3:28 Say not unto thy neighbour, Go, and come again, and to morrow I will give; when thou hast it by thee.
- Pro 3:29 Devise not evil against thy neighbour, seeing he dwelleth securely by thee.
- Pro 3:30 Strive not with a man without cause, if he have done thee no harm.
- Pro 3:31 Envy thou not the oppressor, and choose none of his ways.
- Pro 22:22 Rob not the poor, because he is poor: neither oppress the afflicted in the gate:
- Pro 22:23 For the LORD will plead their cause, and spoil the soul of those that spoiled them.
- Pro 24:15 Lay not wait, O wicked man, against the dwelling of the righteous; spoil not his resting place:
- Pro 24:16 For a just man falleth seven times, and riseth up again: but the wicked shall fall into mischief [adversity].
- Pro 21:6 The getting of treasures by a lying tongue is a vanity tossed to and fro of them that seek death.
- Pro 22:28 Remove not the ancient landmark, which thy fathers have set.
- Pro 23:10 Remove not the old landmark; and enter not into the fields of the fatherless:
- Pro 23:11 For their redeemer is mighty; he shall plead their cause with thee.
- Pro 3:32 For the froward is abomination to the LORD; but his secret is with the righteous.
- Pro 3:33 The curse of the LORD is in the house of the wicked; but he blesseth the habitation of the just.
- Pro 3:34 Surely he scorneth the scorners: but he giveth grace unto the lowly.
- Pro 3:35 The wise shall inherit glory: but shame shall be the promotion of fools.
- Pro 24:8 He that deviseth to do evil shall be called a mischievous person.
- Pro 24:9 The thought of foolishness is sin: and the scorner is an abomination to men.
- **Pro 11:1** A false balance is abomination to the LORD: but a just weight is his delight.
- PPro 12:22 Lying lips are abomination to the LORD; but they that deal truly are his delight.
- Pro 15:8 The sacrifice of the wicked is an abomination to the LORD: but the prayer of the upright is his delight
- Pro 21:27 The sacrifice of the wicked is abomination: how much more, when he bringeth it with a wicked mind?
- Pro 15:9 The way of the wicked is an abomination unto the LORD: but he loveth him that followeth after righteousness.
- Pro 15:26 The thoughts of the wicked are an abomination to the LORD: but the words of the pure are pleasant words.
- Pro 20:10 Divers [different] weights, and divers measures, both of them are alike abomination to the LORD.
- Pro 20:23 Divers weights are an abomination unto the LORD; and a false balance is not good.
- Pro 21:4 An high look, and a proud heart, and the plowing of the wicked, is sin.

God sees everything

- Pro 15:3 The eyes of the LORD are in every place, beholding the evil and the good.
- Pro 15:11 Hell and destruction are before the LORD: how much more then the hearts of the children of men?

Pro 8:1

Doth not wisdom cry? and understanding put forth her voice?

- Pro 8:2 She standeth in the top of high places, by the way in the places of the paths.
- Pro 8:3 She crieth at the gates, at the entry of the city, at the coming in at the doors.
 - Pro 8:4 Unto you, O men, I call; and my voice is to the sons of man.

- Pro 14:31 He that oppresseth the poor reproacheth [taunts] his Maker: but he that honoureth him hath mercy on the poor.
- Pro 28:3 A poor man that oppresseth the poor is like a sweeping rain which leaveth no food.

Wealth and Prosperity verses Poverty and Adversity

- Pro 25:18 A man that beareth false witness against his neighbour is a maul, and a sword, and a sharp arrow.
- Pro 25:19 Confidence in an unfaithful man in time of trouble is like a broken tooth, and a foot out of joint.
- Pro 25:20 As he that taketh away a garment in cold weather, and as vinegar upon nitre, so is he that singeth songs to an heavy heart.
- Pro 25:23 The north wind driveth away rain: so doth an angry countenance a backbiting tongue.
- Pro 25:25 As cold waters to a thirsty soul, so is good news from a far country.
- Pro 25:26 A righteous man falling down before the wicked is as a troubled fountain, and a corrupt spring.
- Pro 25:27 It is not good to eat much honey: so for men to search their own glory is not glory.
- Pro 25:28 He that hath no rule over his own spirit is like a city that is broken down, and without walls.
- Pro 26:1 As snow in summer, and as rain in harvest, so honour is not seemly for a fool.
- Pro 26:2 As the bird by wandering, as the swallow by flying, so the curse causeless shall not come.
- Pro 26:3 A whip for the horse, a bridle for the ass, and a rod for the **fool**'s back.
- Pro 27:8 As a bird that wandereth from her nest, so is a man that wandereth from his place.
- Pro 27:9 Ointment and perfume rejoice the heart: so doth the sweetness of a man's friend by hearty counsel.
- Pro 27:17 Iron sharpeneth iron; so a man sharpeneth the countenance of his friend.
- Pro 27:18 Whoso keepeth the fig tree shall eat the fruit thereof: so he that waiteth on his master shall be honoured.
- Pro 27:19 As in water face *answereth* to face, so the heart of man to man.
- Pro 27:20 Hell and destruction are never full; so the eyes of man are never satisfied.
- Pro 27:21 As the fining pot for silver, and the furnace for gold; so is a man to his praise.

Analogies: The Naïve and the Fool

- Pro 27:22 Though thou shouldest bray a **fool** in a mortar among wheat with a pestle, *yet* will not his **foolishness** depart from him.
- Pro 26:6 He that sendeth a message by the hand of a fool cutteth off the feet, and drinketh damage.
- Pro 26:7 The legs of the lame are not equal: so is a parable in **the mouth** of **fools**.
- Pro 26:8 As he that bindeth a stone in a sling, so is he that giveth honour to a fool.
- Pro 26:9 As a thorn goeth up into the hand of a drunkard, so is a parable in the mouth of fools.
- Pro 26:10 The great *God* that formed all *things* both rewardeth the *fool*, and rewardeth transgressors.
- Pro 26:11 As a dog returneth to his vomit, so a **fool** returneth to his folly.

Those who kindle Strife

- Pro 26:17 He that passeth by, and meddleth with strife belonging not to him, is like one that taketh a dog by the ears
- Pro 26:18 As a mad *man* who casteth firebrands, arrows, and death, Pro 26:19 So is the man that deceiveth his neighbour, and saith, Am not I in sport?
- Pro 26:20 Where no wood is, there the fire goeth out: so where there is no talebearer, the strife ceaseth.
- Pro 26:21 As coals are to burning coals, and wood to fire; so is a contentious man to kindle strife.
- Pro 26:22 The words of a talebearer are as wounds, and they go down into the innermost parts of the belly.
- Pro 26:23 Burning lips and a wicked heart are like a potsherd covered with silver dross.
- Pro 26:24 He that hateth dissembleth with his lips, and layeth up deceit within him;
- Pro 26:25 When he speaketh fair [with false humility covering hatred], believe him not: for *there are* seven abominations in his heart.
- Pro 26:26 Whose hatred is covered by deceit, his wickedness shall be shewed before the whole congregation.
- Pro 26:27 Whoso diggeth a pit shall fall therein: and he that rolleth a stone, it will return upon him.
- Pro 26:28 A lying tongue hateth those that are afflicted by it; and a flattering mouth worketh ruin.
- Pro 27:3 A stone is heavy, and the sand weighty; but a fool's wrath is heavier than them both.
- Pro 27:4 Wrath is cruel, and anger is outrageous; but who is able to stand before envy?

Humility verses Arrogance

Pro 27:2 Let another man praise thee, and not thine own mouth; a stranger, and not thine own lips.

Reproving

- Pro 27:5 Open rebuke is better than secret love.
- Pro 27:6 Faithful are the wounds of a friend; but the kisses of an enemy are deceitful.

Perspective

- Pro 27:7 The full soul loatheth an honeycomb; but to the hungry soul every bitter thing is sweet.
- Pro 28:1 The wicked flee when no man pursueth: but the righteous are bold as a lion.

Prudent verse Naive

Pro 27:12 A prudent man foreseeth the evil, and hideth himself; but the simple pass on, and are punished.

Keeping or Rejecting God's Law

- Pro 28:7 Whoso keepeth the law is a wise son: but he that is a companion of riotous men shameth his father.
- Pro 28:9 He that turneth away his ear from hearing the law, even his prayer shall be abomination.
- Pro 28:4 They that forsake the law praise the wicked: but such as keep the law contend with them.
- Pro 29:13 The poor and the deceitful man meet together: the LORD lighteneth both their eyes.
- Pro 29:18 Where there is no vision, the people perish: but he that keepeth the law, happy is he.

Leaders and Teachers

- Pro 28:10 Whoso causeth the righteous to go astray in an evil way, he shall fall himself into his own pit: but the upright shall have good *things* in possession.
- Pro 28:16 The prince that wanteth understanding is also a great oppressor: but he that hateth covetousness shall prolong his days.

Slaves

- Pro 29:19 A servant will not be corrected by words: for though he understand he will not answer.
- Pro 29:21 He that delicately bringeth up his servant from a child shall have him become his son at the length.

Repentance

Pro 28:13 He that covereth his sins shall not prosper: but whoso confesseth and forsaketh them shall have mercy.

Violence, Bloodshed

- Pro 28:17 A man that doeth violence to the blood of any person shall flee to the pit; let no man stay [support]
- Pro 29:10 The bloodthirsty hate the upright: but the just seek his soul.
- Pro 29:22 An angry man stirreth up strife, and a furious man aboundeth in transgression.

Flattery

- Pro 28:23 He that rebuketh a man afterwards shall find more favour than he that flattereth with the tongue.
- Pro 29:5 A man that flattereth his neighbour spreadeth a net for his feet.

Pro 30:1

The words of Agur the son of Jakeh, *even* the prophecy: the man spake unto Ithiel, even unto Ithiel and Ucal, (Note: This is the only mention of any man named Agur in the Bible)

Pro 30:2 Surely I am more brutish than any man, and have not the **understanding** of a man.

Pro 30:3 I neither learned wisdom, nor have the knowledge of the holy.

The nature of God

Pro 30:4

- Who hath ascended up into heaven, or descended?
- who hath gathered the wind in his fists?
- who hath bound the waters in a garment?
- who hath established all the ends of the earth?
- what is his name, and what is his son's name,

if thou canst tell?

Pro 30:5 Every word of God is pure [H6884: refined, tested]: he is a shield unto them that put their trust in him.

Pro 30:6 Add thou not unto his words, lest he reprove thee, and thou be found a liar.

Integrity and Contentment

Pro 30:7 Two things have I required of thee; deny me them not before I die:

- Pro 30:8 Remove far from me vanity and lies:
- give me neither poverty nor riches; feed me with food convenient for me:
 - o Pro 30:9 Lest I be full, and deny thee, and say, Who is the LORD?
 - o or lest I be poor, and steal, and take the name of my God in vain.

Arrogance-Abominations

- Pro 30:10 Accuse not a servant unto his master, lest he curse thee, and thou be found guilty.
- Pro 30:11 There is a generation that curseth their father, and doth not bless their mother.
- Pro 30:17 The eye *that* mocketh at *his* father, and despiseth to obey *his* mother, the ravens of the valley shall pick it out, and the young eagles shall eat it.
- Pro 30:12 There is a generation that are pure in their own eyes, and yet is not washed from their filthiness.
- Pro 30:13 There is a generation, O how lofty are their eyes! and their eyelids are lifted up.
- Pro 30:14 *There is* a generation, whose teeth *are as* swords, and their jaw teeth *as* knives, to devour the poor from off the earth, and the needy from *among* men.
- Pro 30:32 If thou hast done **foolish**ly in lifting up thyself, or if thou hast thought **evil**, *lay* thine hand upon thy mouth
- Pro 30:33 Surely the churning of milk bringeth forth butter, and the wringing of the nose bringeth forth blood: so the forcing of wrath bringeth forth strife.
- Pro 30:15 The horseleach hath two daughters, *crying*, Give, give.

Pro 30:15b

There are three things that are never satisfied, yea, four things say not, It is enough:

- Pro 30:16 The grave;
- and the barren womb;
- the earth *that* is not filled with water;
- and the fire *that* saith not, *It is* enough.

Pro 30:18

There be three things which are too wonderful for me, yea, four which I know not:

- Pro 30:19 The way of an eagle in the air;
- the way of a serpent upon a rock;
- the way of a ship in the midst of the sea;
- and the way of a man with a maid.

Pro 30:20

Such is the way of an adulterous woman;

• she eateth, and wipeth her mouth, and saith, I have done no wickedness.

Pro 30:21

For three things the earth is disquieted, and for four which it cannot bear:

- Pro 30:22 For a servant when he reigneth;
- and a **fool** when he is filled with meat:
- Pro 30:23 For an odious woman when she is married;
- and an handmaid that is heir to her mistress.

Pro 30:24

There be four things which are little upon the earth, but they are exceeding wise:

- Pro 30:25 The ants are a people not strong, yet they prepare their meat in the summer;
- Pro 30:26 The conies are but a feeble folk, yet make they their houses in the rocks;
- Pro 30:27 The locusts have no king, yet go they forth all of them by bands;
- Pro 30:28 The spider taketh hold with her hands, and is in kings' palaces.

Pro 30:29

There be three things which go well, yea, four are comely in going:

- Pro 30:30 A lion which is strongest among beasts,
- and turneth not away for any;
- Pro 30:31 A greyhound; an he goat also;
- and a king, against whom there is no rising up.

Pro 31:1

The words of king Lemuel, the prophecy that his mother taught him.

(Note: This is the only mention of any man named Lemuel in the Bible whose identity remains uncertain)

Pro 31:2

What, my son? and what, the son of my womb? and what, the son of my vows?

Government, Rulers, Justice

- Pro 31:3 Give not thy strength unto women, nor thy ways to that which destroyeth kings.
- Pro 31:4 It is not for kings, O Lemuel, it is not for kings to drink wine; nor for princes strong drink:
- Pro 31:5 Lest they drink, and forget the law, and pervert the judgment of any of the afflicted.
 - Pro 31:8 Open thy mouth for the dumb in the cause of all such as are appointed to destruction.
 - Pro 31:9 Open thy mouth, judge righteously, and plead the cause of the poor and needy.

Numbing a bitter life

- Pro 31:6 Give strong drink unto him that is ready to perish, and wine unto those that be of heavy hearts.
- Pro 31:7 Let him drink, and forget his poverty, and remember his misery no more.

Pro 31:10

Who can find a virtuous woman?

for her price is far above rubies.

- Pro 31:11 The heart of her husband doth safely trust in her, so that he shall have no need of spoil.
- Pro 31:12 She will do him good and not evil all the days of her life.
- Pro 31:13 She seeketh wool, and flax, and worketh willingly with her hands.
- Pro 31:14 She is like the merchants' ships; she bringeth her food from afar.
- Pro 31:15 She riseth also while it is yet night, and giveth meat to her household, and a portion to her maidens.
- Pro 31:16 She considereth a field, and buyeth it: with the fruit of her hands she planteth a vineyard.
- Pro 31:17 She girdeth her loins with strength, and strengtheneth her arms.
- Pro 31:18 She perceiveth that her merchandise is good: her candle goeth not out by night.
- Pro 31:19 She layeth her hands to the spindle, and her hands hold the distaff.

Psa 127:3 Lo, children are an heritage of the LORD: and the fruit of the womb is his reward.

The Reign of Solomon - Continued

2Ch 2:1

And Solomon determined to build an house for the name of the LORD, and an house for his kingdom.

1Ki 6:11 And the word of the LORD came to Solomon, saying,

1Ki 6:12 Concerning this house which thou art in building,

if

- thou wilt walk in **my statutes**,
- and execute **my judgments**,
- and keep all **my commandments** to walk in them;

then

- will I perform **my word** with thee, which I spake unto **David** thy father:
- 1Ki 6:13 And I will dwell among the children of Israel,
- and will not forsake my people Israel.

1Ki 6:14 So Solomon built the house, and finished it. (Note: as follows below)

Solomon notifies Hiram king of Tyre of his intent to build the house of the Lord and palace for himself

11Ki 5:1 And Hiram king of Tyre sent his servants unto Solomon; for he had heard that they had anointed him king in the room of his father: for Hiram was ever a lover of David.

1Ki 5:2 And Solomon sent to Hiram, saying,

1Ki 5:3 Thou knowest how that David my father could not build an house unto the name of the LORD his God for the wars which were about him on every side, until the LORD put them under the soles of his feet.

1Ki 5:4 But now the LORD my God hath given me rest on every side, so that there is neither adversary nor evil occurrent.

1Ki 5:5 And, behold, I purpose to build an house unto the name of the LORD my God, as the LORD spake unto David my father, saying, Thy son, whom I will set upon thy throne in thy room, he shall build an house unto my name.

2Ch 2:3 And Solomon sent to Huram the king of Tyre, saying, As thou didst deal with David my father, and didst send him cedars to build him an house to dwell therein, even so deal with me.

2Ch 2:4 Behold, I build an house to the name of the LORD my God, to dedicate it to him, and to burn before him sweet incense, and for the continual shewbread, and for the burnt offerings morning and evening, on the sabbaths, and on the new moons, and on the solemn feasts of the LORD our God. This is an ordinance for ever to Israel.

2Ch 2:5 And the house which I build is great: for great is our **God** above all gods.

2Ch 2:6 But who is able to build him an house, seeing the heaven and heaven of heavens cannot contain him? who *am* I then, that I should build him an house, save only to burn sacrifice before him?

2Ch 2:7 Send me now therefore a man cunning [skillful] to work in gold, and in silver, and in brass, and in iron, and in purple, and crimson, and blue, and that can skill to grave with the cunning men that *are* with me in **Judah** and in **Jerusalem**, whom **David** my father did provide.

1Ki 5:6 Now therefore command thou that they hew me **cedar trees** out of **Lebanon**; and my servants shall be with thy servants: and unto thee will I give hire for thy servants according to all that thou shalt appoint: for thou knowest that *there is* not among us any that can skill [has the skill} to hew {cut] timber like unto the **Sidonians**.

1Ki 5:7 And it came to pass, when Hiram heard the words of Solomon, that he rejoiced greatly, and said, Blessed be the LORD this day, which hath given unto David a wise son over this great people.

2Ch 2:8 Send me also **cedar trees**, fir **trees**, and **algum trees**, out of **Lebanon**: for I know that thy servants can skill to cut timber in **Lebanon**; and, behold, my servants *shall be* with thy servants,

2Ch 2:9 Even to prepare me timber in abundance: for the house which I am about to build *shall be* wonderful great.

2Ch 2:10 And, behold, I will give to thy servants, the hewers that cut timber,

- twenty thousand measures of beaten wheat,
- and twenty thousand measures of barley,
- and twenty thousand baths of wine,
- and twenty thousand baths of oil. (Discrepancy with 1Kings 5:11 (20 kors). There are only 10 baths per kor.) Difficult to interpret

2Ch 2:11 Then Huram the king of Tyre answered in

writing, which he sent to **Solomon**, Because **the LORD** hath loved his people, he hath made thee king over

Hiram, king of Tyre, supplies the raw materials and craftsmen for the house of the Lord and palace for Solomon

1Ki 5:8 And Hiram sent to Solomon, saying, I have considered the things which thou sentest to me for:

2Ch 2:12 **Huram** said moreover, Blessed *be* **the LORD God of Israel**, that made heaven and earth, who hath given to **David** the king a wise son, endued with prudence and **understanding**, that might build **an house**

for the LORD, and an house for his kingdom. 2Ch 2:13 And now I have sent a cunning man, endued with understanding, of Huram my father's,

2Ch 2:14 The son of a woman of the daughters of Dan, and his father was a man of Tyre, skilful to work in gold, and in silver, in brass, in iron, in stone, and in timber, in purple, in blue, and in fine linen, and in crimson; also to grave any manner of graving [engraving], and to find out every device which shall be put to him, with thy cunning [skilled] men, and with the cunning [skilled] men of my lord David thy father.

2Ch 2:15 Now therefore the wheat, and the barley, the oil, and the wine, which my lord hath spoken of, let him send unto his servants:

2Ch 2:16 And we will cut wood out of **Lebanon**, as much as thou shalt need: and we will bring it to thee in floats by sea to Joppa; and thou shalt carry it up to **Jerusalem**.

and I will do all thy desire concerning timber of cedar, and concerning timber of fir.

1Ki 5:9 My servants shall bring *them* down from **Lebanon** unto the sea: and I will convey them by sea in floats unto the place that thou shalt appoint me, and will cause them to be discharged there, and thou shalt receive *them*: and thou shalt accomplish my desire, in giving food for my household.

1Ki 5:10 So Hiram gave Solomon cedar trees and fir trees according to all his desire.

1Ki 5:11 And Solomon gave Hiram

- twenty thousand measures of wheat for food to his household.
- and twenty measures {kors] of pure oil: Descrepancy - see 2Ch 2:10

thus gave Solomon to Hiram year by year.

1Ki 5:12 And the LORD gave Solomon wisdom, as he promised him: and there was peace between Hiram and Solomon; and they two made a league together.

Slave labor from the conquered nations that worshipped demonic gods

1Ki 5:13 And king Solomon raised a levy out of all Israel; and the levy was thirty thousand men.

• 1Ki 5:14 And he sent them to **Lebanon**, ten thousand a month by courses: a month they were in **Lebanon**, and two months at home: and Adoniram was over the levy.

1Ki 5:15 And Solomon had threescore and ten thousand that bare burdens, and fourscore thousand hewers in the mountains;

1Ki 5:16 Beside the chief of **Solomon**'s officers which were over the work, three thousand and three hundred, which ruled over the people that wrought in the work.

Discrepancy with 2Ch 2:17-18

2Ch 2:17 And Solomon numbered all the strangers that were in the land of Israel, after the numbering wherewith David his father had numbered them; and they were found an hundred and fifty thousand and three thousand and six hundred.

2Ch 2:18 And he set threescore and ten thousand of them *to be* bearers of burdens, and fourscore thousand *to be* hewers in the mountain,

and three thousand and six hundred overseers to set the people a work.

2Ch 2:2 And Solomon told out threescore and ten thousand men to bear burdens, and fourscore thousand to hew in the mountain, and three thousand and six hundred to oversee them.

Foundation of costly stones

1Ki 5:17 And the king commanded, and they brought great stones, costly stones, and hewed stones, to lay the foundation of the house.

1Ki 6:7 And the house, when it was in building, was built of stone made ready before it was brought thither:[there] so that there was neither hammer nor axe *nor* any tool of iron heard in the house, while it was in building. 1Ki 5:18 And Solomon's builders and Hiram's builders did hew [cut] *them*, and the stonesquarers: so they prepared timber and stones to build the house.

Note: <u>Proverbs_24:27</u> Prepare your work outside, And make it ready for yourself in the field; Afterwards, then, build your house.

Date when building began

1Ki 6:1 And it came to pass in the four hundred and eightieth year after the children of Israel were come out of the land of Egypt, in the fourth year of Solomon's reign over Israel, in the month Zif [Ziv], which is the second month, that he began to build the house of the LORD.

2Ch 3:1 Then **Solomon** began to build **the house of the LORD** at **Jerusalem** in mount Moriah, where **the LORD** appeared unto **David** his father, in the place that **David** had prepared in the threshingfloor of Ornan the Jebusite.

2Ch 3:2 And he began to build in the second *day* of the second month, in the fourth year of his reign.

Dimensions for the foundation of the Lord's house

1Ki 6:2 And the house which king Solomon built for the LORD,

- the length thereof was threescore cubits,
- and the breadth thereof twenty cubits,
- and the height thereof thirty cubits.

2Ch 3:3 Now these *are the things wherein* **Solomon** was instructed for the building of **the house of God**.

- The length by cubits after the first measure was threescore cubits,
- and the breadth twenty cubits.

Front Porch

1Ki 6:3 And the porch before the temple of the house,

- twenty cubits was the length thereof, according to the breadth of the house;
- and ten cubits was the breadth thereof before the house.

2Ch 3:4 And the porch that was in the front of the house,

- the length of it was according to the breadth of the house, twenty cubits,
- and the height was an hundred and twenty:

and he overlaid it within with pure gold.

Overlays and Carvings

2Ch 3:5 And the greater house he cieled [overlaid] with fir tree [or cypress wood], which he overlaid with fine gold, and set thereon palm trees and chains.

2Ch 3:6 And he garnished the house with precious stones for beauty: and the gold was gold of Parvaim.

2Ch 3:7 He overlaid also **the house**, the beams, the posts, and the walls thereof, and the doors thereof, with gold; and graved [engraved] cherubims on the walls.

Windows

1Ki 6:4 And for the house he made windows of narrow lights.

Side Chambers - Three Stories - each different widths and each 5 cubits high

1Ki 6:5 And against the wall of the house he built chambers round about, against the walls of the house round about, both

- of the temple
- and of the oracle [inner sanctuary]:

and he made chambers round about:

- 1Ki 6:6 The nethermost [lowest] chamber was five cubits broad,
- and the middle was six cubits broad,
- and the third was seven cubits broad:

for without [on the outside] *in the wall* of **the house** he made narrowed rests round about, that *the beams* should not be fastened in the walls of **the house**.

1Ki 6:8 The door for the middle chamber was in the right side of the house:

and they went up with Winding Stairs into the middle chamber, and out of the middle into the third.

1Ki 6:9 So he built the house, and finished it; and covered the house with beams and boards of cedar.

1Ki 6:10 And *then* he built chambers against all the house, five cubits high: and they rested on the house with timber of cedar.

Boards for the walls and floors

Ki 6:15 And he **built the walls** of **the house** within **with** boards of cedar, both the floor of **the house**, and the walls of the cieling [ceiling]: *and* he covered *them* on the inside with wood,

and covered the floor of the house with planks of fir [or cypress].

1Ki 6:16 And he built twenty cubits on the sides of the house, both the floor and the walls with boards of cedar: he even built *them* for it within, *even* for the oracle, *even* for the most holy *place*.

1Ki 6:17 And the house, that is, the temple [palace] before it, was forty cubits long.

1Ki 6:18 And the cedar of the house within was carved with knops and open flowers: all was cedar; there was no stone seen.

THE INNER SANCTUARY – THE MOST HOLY PLACE HOLY OF HOLIES

Overall dimensions

1Ki 6:19 And the oracle he prepared in the house within, to set there the ark of the covenant of the LORD.

1Ki 6:20 And the oracle in the forepart was

- twenty cubits in length,
- and twenty cubits in breadth,
- and twenty cubits in the height thereof:

and he overlaid it with pure gold;

and so covered the altar which was of cedar.

2Ch 3:8 And he made the most holy house,

the length whereof was according to the breadth of the house, twenty cubits,

and the breadth thereof twenty cubits:

and he overlaid it with fine gold, *amounting* to six hundred talents.

2Ch 3:9 And the weight of the nails *was* fifty shekels of gold. And he overlaid the upper chambers with gold.

Overlays of gold

1Ki 6:21 So Solomon overlaid the house within with pure gold: and he made a partition by the chains of gold before the oracle; and he overlaid it with gold.

1Ki 6:22 And the whole house he overlaid with gold, until he had finished all the house:

also the whole altar that was by the oracle he overlaid with gold.

Two cherubim for the inner sanctuary made of olive wood overlaid with gold

1Ki 6:23 And within the oracle [inner sanctuary] he made two cherubims of olive tree,

- each ten cubits high.
- 1Ki 6:24 And five cubits was the one wing of the cherub, and five cubits the other wing of the cherub:
- from the uttermost part of the one wing unto the uttermost part of the other were ten cubits.
- 1Ki 6:25 And the other cherub was ten cubits: both the cherubims were of one measure and one size.
- 1Ki 6:26 The height of the one cherub *was* ten cubits, and so *was it* of the other cherub.

2Ch 3:10 And in the most holy house he made two cherubims of image work, and overlaid them with gold.

2Ch 3:11 And the wings of the cherubims were twenty cubits long:

- one wing of the one cherub was five cubits, reaching to the wall of the house:
- and the other wing was likewise five cubits, reaching to the wing of the other cherub.
- 2Ch 3:12 And *one* wing of the other cherub was five cubits, reaching to the wall of the house:
- and the other wing was five cubits also, joining to the wing of the other cherub.

2Ch 3:13 The wings of these cherubims spread themselves forth twenty cubits: and they stood on their feet, and their faces *were* inward.

1Ki 6:27 And he set **the cherubims** within the inner house: and they stretched forth the wings of **the cherubims**, so that the wing of the one touched the *one* wall, and the wing of the other cherub touched the other wall; and their wings touched one another in the midst of **the house**.

1Ki 6:28 And he overlaid the cherubims with gold.

Veil

2Ch 3:14 And he made the vail of blue, and purple, and crimson, and fine linen, and wrought cherubims thereon.

Entrance of the inner sanctuary

1Ki 6:31 And for the entering of the oracle he made

- doors *of* olive tree:
- the lintel
- and side posts were a fifth part of the wall.

1Ki 6:32 The two doors also were of olive tree;

- and he carved upon them carvings of cherubims and palm trees and open flowers,
- and overlaid them with gold,
- and spread gold upon the cherubims, and upon the palm trees.

Comment - Beginning and ending dates of building the house of the Lord

1Ki 6:37 In the fourth year was the foundation of the house of the LORD laid, in the month Zif [Ziv]: 1Ki 6:38 And in the eleventh year, in the month Bul, which *is* the eighth month, was the house finished throughout all the parts thereof, and according to all the fashion of it.

So was he seven years in building it.

Overlays and Carvings

1Ki 6:29 And he carved all the walls of the house round about with carved figures of cherubims and palm trees and open flowers, within and without.

1Ki 6:30 And the floor of the house he overlaid with gold, within and without.

Entrance of the nave

1Ki 6:33 So also made he for the door of the temple posts

- of olive tree, a fourth part of the wall.
- 1Ki 6:34 And the two doors were of fir tree [or cypress wood]:
 - o the two leaves of the one door were folding.
 - o and the two leaves of the other door were folding.
 - o 1Ki 6:35 And he carved *thereon* cherubims and palm trees and open flowers:
 - o and covered *them* with gold fitted upon the carved work.

Inner Court

1Ki 6:36 And he built the inner court with three rows of hewed [cut] stone, and a row of cedar beams.

1Ki 7:1

But [Now] **Solomon** was building his own house

thirteen years,

and he finished all his house.

1Ki 7:2 He built also the house of the forest of Lebanon;

the length thereof was an hundred cubits, and the breadth thereof fifty cubits, and the height thereof thirty cubits,

Note: The house of the LORD was 60 x 20 x 30 cubits (1Ki 6:2); smaller than Solomon's own house.

- upon four rows of cedar pillars, with cedar beams upon the pillars.
- 1Ki 7:3 And it was covered with cedar above upon the beams, that lay on forty five pillars, fifteen in a row.
- 1Ki 7:4 And there were windows in three rows, and light was against light in three ranks.
- 1Ki 7:5 And all the **doors and posts** were square, with the windows: and light was against light in three ranks
- 1Ki 7:6 And he made a **porch of pillars**; the length thereof *was* fifty cubits, and the breadth thereof thirty cubits: and the porch *was* before them: and the *other* pillars and the thick beam *were* before them.
- 1Ki 7:7 Then he made a **porch for the throne** where he might judge, *even* the porch of **judgment**: and *it* was covered with cedar from one side of the floor to the other.
- 1Ki 7:8 And his house where he dwelt had another court within the porch, which was of the like work.
 - o **Solomon** made also **an house** for **Pharaoh's daughter**, whom he had taken *to wife*, like unto this porch.

1Ki 7:9 All these were of costly stones,

- according to the measures of hewed stones,
- sawed with saws.
- within and without,
- even from the foundation unto the coping,
- and so on the outside toward the great court.
- 1Ki 7:10 And the foundation was of costly stones, even great stones,
 - stones of ten cubits, and stones of eight cubits.
- 1Ki 7:11 And above were costly stones,
 - after the measures of hewed stones, and cedars.
- 1Ki 7:12 And the great court round about was with
 - three rows of hewed stones,
 - and a row of cedar beams,

both for the inner court of the house of the LORD, and for the porch of the house.

THE HOUSE OF THE LORD CONTINUED

The craftsmanship of Hiram

1Ki 7:13 And king Solomon sent and fetched Hiram out of Tyre.

- 1Ki 7:14 He was a widow's son of the tribe of Naphtali,
- and his father was a man of Tyre, a worker in brass:
- and he was filled with wisdom, and understanding, and cunning [skilled] [skill] to work all works in brass

And he came to king Solomon, and wrought all his work.

Pillars and their Chains

Discrepancies in pink

1Ki 7:15 For he cast two pillars of brass,

- of eighteen cubits high apiece:
- and a line of twelve cubits did compass either of them about.

1Ki 7:16 And he made two chapiters of molten brass, to set upon the tops of the pillars:

- the height of the one chapiter was five cubits,
- and the height of the other chapiter was five cubits:

1Ki 7:17 And nets of checker work, and wreaths of chain work, for the chapiters which were upon the top of the pillars;

- seven for the one chapiter,
- and seven for the other chapiter.

1Ki 7:18 And he made the pillars,

- and two rows round about upon the one network, to cover the chapiters that *were* upon the top, with pomegranates:
- and so did he for the other chapiter.

1Ki 7:19 And the chapiters that *were* upon the top of the pillars *were* of lily work in the porch, four cubits.
1Ki 7:20 And the chapiters upon the two pillars *had* pomegranates also above, over against the belly which was by the network:

and the pomegranates were two hundred in rows round about upon the other chapiter.

1Ki 7:21 And he set up the pillars in the porch of the temple:

- and he set up the right pillar, and called the name thereof Jachin:
- and he set up the left pillar, and called the name thereof **Boaz**.

1Ki 7:22 And upon the top of the pillars was lily work:

so was the work of the pillars finished.

2Ch 3:15 Also he made before the house two pillars of thirty and five cubits high,

and the chapiter that was on the top of each of them was

2Ch 3:16 And he made chains, as in the oracle, and put *them* on the heads of the pillars;

and made an hundred pomegranates, and put *them* on the chains.

2Ch 3:17 And he reared [set] up the pillars before the temple, one on the right hand, and the other on the left;

- and called the name of that on the right hand **Jachin**,
- and the name of that on the left **Boaz**.

Bronze Altar

- 2Ch 4:1 Moreover he made an altar of brass,
 - twenty cubits the length thereof,
 - and twenty cubits the breadth thereof,
 - and ten cubits the height thereof.

The Sea

Discrepancy in pink

1Ki 7:23 And he made a molten sea.

- ten cubits from the one brim to the other:
- *it was* round all about,
- and his height was five cubits:
- and a line of thirty cubits did compass it round about.

1Ki 7:24 And under the brim of it round about

- *there were* knops compassing it, ten in a cubit, compassing the sea round about:
- the knops were cast in two rows, when it was cast.

1Ki 7:25 It stood upon twelve oxen,

- three looking toward the north,
- and three looking toward the west,
- and three looking toward the south,
- and three looking toward the east:

and the sea was set above upon them, and all their hinder parts were inward.

1Ki 7:26 And it *was* an hand breadth thick, and the brim thereof was wrought like the brim of a cup, with flowers of lilies: it contained two thousand baths.

2Ch 4:2 Also he made a molten sea

- of ten cubits from brim to brim,
- round in compass,
- and five cubits the height thereof;
- and a line of thirty cubits did compass it round about

2Ch 4:3 And under it *was* the similitude of **oxen**, which did compass it round about: ten in a cubit, compassing the sea round about. Two rows of **oxen** *were* cast, when it was cast.

2Ch 4:4 It stood upon twelve oxen,

- three looking toward the north,
- and three looking toward the west,
- and three looking toward the south,
- and three looking toward the east:

and the sea was set above upon them, and all their hinder parts were inward.

2Ch 4:5 And the thickness of it *was* an handbreadth, and the brim of it like the work of the brim of a cup, with flowers of lilies; *and* it received and held three thousand baths.

1Ki 7:39b and he set the sea on the right side of the house eastward over against the south.

2Ch 4:6c but the sea *was* for the priests to wash in. 2Ch 4:10 And he set the sea on the right side of the east end, over against the south.

Ten Brass Stands, each to hold a basin

1Ki 7:27 And he made ten bases of brass;

- four cubits was the length of one base,
- and four cubits the breadth thereof,
- and three cubits the height of it.

1Ki 7:37 After this manner he made the **ten bases:**

all of them had one casting, one measure, and one size.

1Ki 7:28 And the work of the bases was on this manner:

they had borders, and the borders were between the ledges:

1Ki 7:29 And on the borders that were between the ledges were lions, oxen, and cherubims:

and upon the ledges there was a base above:

and beneath the lions and oxen were certain additions [wreaths] made of thin [hanging] work.

1Ki 7:30a And every base had

four brasen wheels,

and plates of brass:

1Ki 7:32 And under the borders were four wheels;

- and the axletrees of the wheels were joined to the base:
- and the height of a wheel was a cubit and half a cubit.
- 1Ki 7:33 And the work of the wheels was like the work of a chariot wheel:
- their axletrees, and their naves, and their felloes, and their spokes, were all molten.

1Ki 7:34 And *there were* four undersetters [supports] to the four corners of one base: *and* the undersetters were of the very base itself.

1Ki 7:35 And in the top of the base *was there* a round compass of half a cubit high: and on the top of the base the ledges thereof and the borders thereof *were* of the same.

1Ki 7:36 For on the plates of the ledges thereof, and on the borders thereof, he graved [engraved] cherubims, lions, and palm trees, according to the proportion of every one, and additions round about.

Ten Basins to rinse things for the burnt offering

1Ki 7:38a Then made he ten lavers of brass:

2Ch 4:6a He made also ten lavers, ...to wash in them

- one laver contained forty baths:
- and every laver was four cubits:

1Ki 7:30b under the layer were undersetters molten, at the side of every addition.

1Ki 7:31 And the mouth of it within the chapiter [opening within the crown] and above was a cubit:

- but **the mouth** [opening] thereof was round after the work of the base, a cubit and an half:
- and also upon **the mouth** [opening] of it *were* graving [engraving]s [engraving [engraving]s] with their borders, foursquare [square], not round.

Stands with Basins - Five on the left and five on the right

1Ki 7:38b

and upon every one of the ten bases one laver.

1Ki 7:39a And he put

- five bases on the right side of the house,
- and five on the left side of the house

2Ch 4:6b (Referring to basins/lavers) and put

- five on the right hand,
- and five on the left,

such things as they offered for the burnt offering they washed in them

Ten Tables - Five on the left and five on the right

2Ch 4:8a He made also ten tables, and placed them in the temple,

- five on the right side,
- and five on the left.

Ten golden lampstands - Five on the left and five on the right

2Ch 4:7 And he made ten candlesticks of gold according to their form, and set them in the temple,

- five on the right hand,
- and five on the left.

100 Golden bowls

2Ch 4:8b And he made an hundred basons of gold.

Complimentary items for the bowls

1Ki 7:40a And Hiram made the lavers, and the shovels, and the basons.

2Ch 4:11a And Huram made the pots, and the shovels, and the basons.

Note Hiram was from Tyre and Huram was either an Israelite or Syrian according to Strong's Concordance. Hiram (H2438)

Huram (H2361)

However the context of both Kings and Chronicles make both appear to be the same person, ie. King of Tyre

Court of the priests 2Ch 4:9a

Furthermore he made the court of the priests,

The great court 2Ch 4:9b

and **the great court**, and doors for the court, and overlaid the doors of them with brass.

Summary of Hiram's/Huram's craftsmanship in building the house of the Lord

1Ki7:40b So **Hiram** made an end of doing all the work that he made **king Solomon** for **the house of the LORD**:

- 1Ki 7:41 The two pillars,
- and the *two* **bowls of the chapiters** that *were* on the top of the two pillars;
- and the **two networks**, to cover the two bowls of the chapiters which *were* upon the top of the pillars;
- 1Ki 7:42 And four hundred **pomegranates** for the two networks,
- *even* two rows of pomegranates for one network, to cover the two bowls of the chapiters that *were* upon the pillars;
- 1Ki 7:43 And the ten bases, and ten lavers on the bases:
- 1Ki 7:44 And one **sea**, and twelve **oxen** under the sea;
- 1Ki 7:45 And the **pots**, and the **shovels**, and the **basons**: and all these vessels, which **Hiram** made to **king Solomon** for **the house of the LORD**, were of bright brass.

2Ch 4:11b And Huram finished the work that he was to make for king Solomon for the house of God;

- 2Ch 4:12 To wit, the two pillars,
- and the **pommels**, and the **chapiters** which were on the top of the two pillars,
- and the **two wreaths** to cover the two pommels of the chapiters which *were* on the top of the pillars;
- 2Ch 4:13 And four hundred **pomegranates** on the two wreaths;
- two rows of pomegranates on each wreath, to cover the two pommels of the chapiters which *were* upon the pillars.
- 2Ch 4:14 He made also **bases**, and **lavers** made he upon the bases;
- 2Ch 4:15 One **sea**, and twelve **oxen** under it.
- 2Ch 4:16 The **pots** also, and the **shovels**, and the **fleshhooks**, and all their instruments, did **Huram** his father make to **king Solomon** for the house of the LORD of bright brass.

The things Solomon made for the Most Holy Place

1Ki 7:46 In **the plain of Jordan** did the king cast them, in the clay ground between Succoth and Zarthan.

1Ki 7:47 And **Solomon** left all the vessels *unweighed*, because they were exceeding many: neither was the weight of the brass found out.

1Ki 7:48 And Solomon made all the vessels that *pertained* unto the house of the LORD:

- the altar of gold,
- and the table of gold, whereupon the shewbread was,
- 1Ki 7:49 And the candlesticks of pure gold,
 - o five on the right side,
 - o and five on the left,
 - o before the oracle,
- with the flowers, and the lamps, and the tongs of gold,
- 1Ki 7:50 And the bowls, and the snuffers, and the basons, and the spoons, and the censers of pure gold;
- and the hinges of gold, both for the doors of the inner house, the most holy place, and for the doors of the house, to wit, of the temple.

1Ki 7:51 So was ended all the work that king Solomon made for the house of the LORD.

And **Solomon** brought in the things which **David** his father had dedicated; *even* the **silver**, and the gold, and the vessels, did he put among the treasures of **the house of the LORD**.

2Ch 4:17 In **the plain of Jordan** did the king cast them, in the clay ground between Succoth and Zeredathah.

2Ch 4:18 Thus Solomon made all these vessels in great abundance: for the weight of the brass could not be found out

2Ch 4:19 And Solomon made all the vessels that were for the house of God,

- the golden altar also,
- and the tables whereon the shewbread was set:
- 2Ch 4:20 Moreover the candlesticks with their lamps, that they should burn after the manner before the oracle, of pure gold;
- 2Ch 4:21 And the flowers, and the lamps, and the tongs, made he of gold, and that perfect gold;
- 2Ch 4:22 And the **snuffers**, and the **basons**, and the **spoons**, and the **censers**, *of* pure gold:
- and the entry of **the house**, the inner doors thereof for the most holy *place*, and the doors of **the house** of **the temple**, *were of* gold.

2Ch 5:1 Thus all the work that **Solomon** made for **the house of the LORD** was finished:

and **Solomon** brought in *all* the things that **David** his father had dedicated; and the **silver**, and the gold, and all the instruments, put he among the treasures of **the** house of God.

A home for the ark

1Ki 8:1 Then Solomon assembled the elders of Israel, and all the heads of the tribes, the chief of the fathers of the children of Israel, unto king Solomon in Jerusalem, that they might bring up the ark of the covenant of the LORD out of the city of David, which is Zion.

1Ki 8:2 And all the men of **Israel** assembled themselves unto **king Solomon** at the feast **in the month Ethanim**, **which** *is* **the seventh month**.

1Ki 8:3 And all the elders of Israel came, and the priests took up the ark.

1Ki 8:4 And they brought up the ark of the LORD, and the tabernacle of the congregation, and all the holy vessels that were in the tabernacle, even those did the priests and the Levites bring up.

1Ki 8:5 And king Solomon, and all the congregation of Israel, that were assembled unto him, were with him before the ark, sacrificing sheep and oxen, that could not be told nor numbered for multitude.

1Ki 8:6 And the priests brought in the ark of the covenant of the LORD unto his place, into the oracle of the house, to the most holy *place*, even under the wings of the cherubims.

1Ki 8:7 For the cherubims spread forth *their* two wings over the place of the ark, and the cherubims covered the ark and the stayes thereof above.

1Ki 8:8 And they drew out the staves, that the ends of the staves were seen out in the holy *place* before the oracle, and they were not seen without: and there they are unto this day.

1Ki 8:9 *There was* nothing in **the ark** save the two tables of stone, which **Moses** put there at Horeb, when **the LORD** made *a covenant* with **the children of Israel**, when they came out of **the land of Egypt**.

1Ki 8:10 And it came to pass, when the priests were come out of the holy *place*,

2Ch 5:2 Then Solomon assembled the elders of Israel, and all the heads of the tribes, the chief of the fathers of the children of Israel, unto Jerusalem, to bring up the ark of the covenant of the LORD out of the city of David, which is Zion.

2Ch 5:3 Wherefore all the men of **Israel** assembled themselves unto the king in the feast which *was* in the seventh month.

2Ch 5:4 And all the elders of Israel came; and the Levites took up the ark.

2Ch 5:5 And they brought up the ark, and the tabernacle of the congregation, and all the holy vessels that *were* in the tabernacle, these did the priests *and* the Levites bring up.

2Ch 5:6 Also king Solomon, and all the congregation of Israel that were assembled unto him before the ark, sacrificed sheep and oxen, which could not be told nor numbered for multitude.

2Ch 5:7 And the priests brought in the ark of the covenant of the LORD unto his place, to the oracle of the house, into the most holy *place*, *even* under the wings of the cherubims:

2Ch 5:8 For the cherubims spread forth *their* wings over the place of the ark, and the cherubims covered the ark and the staves thereof above.

2Ch 5:9 And they drew out the staves of the ark, that the ends of the staves were seen from the ark before the oracle; but they were not seen without. And there it is unto this day.

2Ch 5:10 *There was* nothing in **the ark** save the two tables which **Moses** put *therein* at Horeb, when **the LORD** made *a covenant* with **the children of Israel**, when they came out of **Egypt**.

2Ch 5:11 And it came to pass, when the priests were come out of the holy *place*: (for all the priests *that were* present were sanctified, *and* did not *then* wait by course: 2Ch 5:12 Also the Levites *which were* the singers, all of them of Asaph, of Heman, of Jeduthun, with their sons and their brethren, *being* arrayed in white linen, having cymbals and psalteries and harps, stood at the east end of the altar, and with them an hundred and twenty priests sounding with trumpets:)
2Ch 5:13 It came even to pass, as the trumpeters and

singers were as one, to make one sound to be heard in praising and thanking the LORD; and when they lifted up their voice with the trumpets and cymbals and instruments of musick, and praised the LORD, saying, For he is good; for his mercy endureth for ever: that then the house was filled with a cloud, even the house of the LORD;

that the cloud filled the house of the LORD,

1Ki 8:11 So that the priests could not stand to minister because of the cloud: for the glory of the LORD had filled the house of the LORD.

1Ki 8:12 Then spake **Solomon**, **The LORD** said that he would dwell in the thick darkness.

1Ki 8:13 I have surely built thee an house to dwell in, a settled place for thee to abide in for ever.

1Ki 8:14 And the king turned his face about, and blessed all the congregation of Israel: (and all the congregation of Israel stood;)

1Ki 8:15 And he said, Blessed be the LORD God of Israel, which spake with his mouth unto David my father, and hath with his hand fulfilled it, saying, 1Ki 8:16 Since the day that I brought forth my people Israel out of Egypt, I chose no city out of all the tribes of Israel to build an house, that my name might be therein:

but I chose David to be over my people Israel.

1Ki 8:17 And it was in the heart of **David** my father to build an house for the name of the LORD God of Israel.

1Ki 8:18 And the LORD said unto David my father, Whereas it was in thine heart to build an house unto my name, thou didst well that it was in thine heart. 1Ki 8:19 Nevertheless thou shalt not build the house; but thy son that shall come forth out of thy loins, he shall build the house unto my name.

1Ki 8:20 And the LORD hath performed his word that he spake, and I am risen up in the room of David my father, and sit on the throne of Israel, as the LORD promised, and have built an house for the name of the LORD God of Israel.

1Ki 8:21 And I have set there a place for the ark, wherein is the covenant of the LORD, which he made with our fathers, when he brought them out of the land of Egypt.

2Ch 5:14 So that the priests could not stand to minister by reason of the cloud: for the glory of the LORD had filled the house of God.

2Ch 6:1 Then said Solomon, The LORD hath said that he would dwell in the thick darkness.

2Ch 6:2 But I have built an house of habitation for thee, and a place for thy dwelling for ever.

2Ch 6:3 And the king turned his face, and blessed the whole congregation of Israel: and all the congregation of Israel stood.

2Ch 6:4 And he said, Blessed be the LORD God of Israel, who hath with his hands fulfilled that which he spake with his mouth to my father David, saying, 2Ch 6:5 Since the day that I brought forth my people out of the land of Egypt I chose no city among all the tribes of Israel to build an house in, that my name might be there; neither chose I any man to be a ruler over my people Israel:

2Ch 6:6 But I have chosen Jerusalem, that my name might be there; and have chosen David to be over my people Israel.

2Ch 6:7 Now it was in the heart of **David** my father to build an house for the name of the LORD God of Israel.

2Ch 6:8 But the LORD said to David my father, Forasmuch as it was in thine heart to build an house for my name, thou didst well in that it was in thine heart: 2Ch 6:9 Notwithstanding thou shalt not build the house; but thy son which shall come forth out of thy loins, he shall build the house for my name. 2Ch 6:10 The LORD therefore hath performed his word that he hath spoken: for I am risen up in the room of David my father, and am set on the throne of Israel, as the LORD promised, and have built the house for the name of the LORD God of Israel.

2Ch 6:11 And in it have I put the ark, wherein is the covenant of the LORD, that he made with the children of Israel.

Prayer for restoration to those who repent

1Ki 8:22 And Solomon stood before the altar of the LORD in the presence of all the congregation of Israel,

and spread forth his hands toward heaven:

1Ki 8:23 And he said, LORD **God of Israel**, *there is* no **God** like thee, in heaven above, or on earth beneath, who keepest **covenant** and **mercy** with thy servants that walk before thee with all their heart:

1Ki 8:24 Who hast kept with thy servant **David** my father that thou promisedst him: thou spakest also with thy mouth, and hast fulfilled *it* with thine hand, as *it is* this day.

1Ki 8:25 Therefore now, LORD God of Israel, keep with thy servant David my father that thou promisedst him, saying, There shall not fail thee a man in my sight to sit on the throne of Israel; so that thy children take heed to their way, that they walk before me as thou hast walked before me.

1Ki 8:26 And now, O God of Israel, let thy word, I pray thee, be verified, which thou spakest unto thy servant David my father.

1Ki 8:27 But will **God** indeed dwell on the earth? behold, the heaven and heaven of heavens cannot contain thee; how much less **this house** that I have builded?

1Ki 8:28 Yet have thou respect unto the prayer of thy servant, and to his supplication, O LORD my God, to hearken unto the cry and to the prayer, which thy servant prayeth before thee to day:

1Ki 8:29 That thine eyes may be open toward this house night and day, even toward the place of which thou hast said, My name shall be there: that thou mayest hearken unto the prayer which thy servant shall make toward this place.

1Ki 8:30 And hearken thou to the supplication of thy servant, and of **thy people Israel**, when they shall pray toward this place: and hear thou in heaven thy dwelling place: and when thou hearest, forgive.

1Ki 8:31 If any man trespass against his neighbour, and an oath be laid upon him to cause him to swear, and the oath come before thine altar in this house:
1Ki 8:32 Then hear thou in heaven, and do, and judge thy servants, condemning the wicked, to bring his way upon his head; and justifying the righteous, to give him according to his righteousness.

2Ch 6:12 And he stood before the altar of the LORD in the presence of all the congregation of Israel, and spread forth his hands:

2Ch 6:13 For Solomon had made a brasen scaffold, of five cubits long, and five cubits broad, and three cubits high, and had set it in the midst of the court: and upon it he stood, and kneeled down upon his knees before all the congregation of Israel, and spread forth his hands toward heaven.

2Ch 6:14 And said, O LORD **God of Israel**, *there is* no **God** like thee in the heaven, nor in the earth; which keepest **covenant**, and *shewest* **mercy** unto thy servants, that walk before thee with all their hearts:

2Ch 6:15 Thou which hast kept with thy servant David my father that which thou hast promised him; and spakest with thy mouth, and hast fulfilled *it* with thine hand, as *it is* this day.

2Ch 6:16 Now therefore, O LORD God of Israel, keep with thy servant David my father that which thou hast promised him, saying, There shall not fail thee a man in my sight to sit upon the throne of Israel; yet so that thy children take heed to their way to walk in my law, as thou hast walked before me.

2Ch 6:17 Now then, O LORD **God of Israel**, let thy word be verified, which thou hast spoken unto thy servant **David**.

2Ch 6:18 But will **God** in very deed dwell with men on the earth? behold, heaven and the heaven of heavens cannot contain thee; how much less **this house** which I have built!

2Ch 6:19 Have respect therefore to the prayer of thy servant, and to his supplication, **O LORD my God**, to hearken unto the cry and the prayer which thy servant prayeth before thee:

2Ch 6:20 That thine eyes may be open upon this house day and night, upon the place whereof thou hast said that thou wouldest put thy name there; to hearken unto the prayer which thy servant prayeth toward this place.

2Ch 6:21 Hearken therefore unto the supplications of thy servant, and of **thy people Israel**, which they shall make toward this place: hear thou from thy dwelling place, *even* from heaven; and when thou hearest, forgive.

2Ch 6:22 If a man sin against his neighbour, and an oath be laid upon him to make him swear, and the oath come before thine altar in this house;

2Ch 6:23 Then hear thou from heaven, and do, and judge thy servants, by requiting **the wicked**, by recompensing his way upon his own head; and by justifying **the righteous**, by giving him according to his **righteousness**.

1Ki 8:33 When thy people Israel be smitten down before the enemy, because they have sinned against thee, and shall turn again to thee, and confess thy name, and pray, and make supplication unto thee in this house:

1Ki 8:34 Then hear thou in heaven, and forgive the sin of **thy people Israel**, and bring them again unto the land which thou gavest unto their fathers.

1Ki 8:35 When heaven is shut up, and there is no rain, because they have sinned against thee; if they pray toward this place, and confess thy name, and turn from their sin, when thou afflictest them:

1Ki 8:36 Then hear thou in heaven, and forgive the sin of thy servants, and of **thy people Israel**, that thou teach them the good way wherein they should walk, and give rain upon thy land, which thou hast given to thy people for an inheritance.

1Ki 8:37 If there be in the land famine, **if there be pestilence**, blasting, mildew, locust, *or* if there be caterpiller; if their enemy besiege them in the land of their cities; whatsoever plague, whatsoever sickness *there be*;

1Ki 8:38 What prayer and supplication soever be *made* by any man, *or* by all **thy people Israel**, which shall know every man the plague of his own heart, and spread forth his hands toward this house:

1Ki 8:39 Then hear thou in heaven thy dwelling place, and forgive, and do, and give to every man according to his ways, whose heart thou knowest; (for thou, *even* thou only, knowest the hearts of all the children of men;)

1Ki 8:40 That they may fear thee all the days that they live in the land which thou gavest unto our fathers.

1Ki 8:41 Moreover concerning a stranger, that is not of thy people Israel, but cometh out of a far country for thy name's sake;

1Ki 8:42 (For they shall hear of thy great name, and of thy strong hand, and of thy stretched out arm;) when he shall come and pray toward this house;

1Ki 8:43 Hear thou in heaven thy dwelling place, and do according to all that **the stranger** calleth to thee for: that all people of the earth may know thy name, to fear thee, as *do* **thy people Israel**; and that they may know that this house, which I have builded, is called by thy name.

1Ki 8:44 If thy people go out to battle against their enemy, whithersoever thou shalt send them, and shall pray unto the LORD toward the city which thou hast chosen, and *toward* the house that I have built for thy name:

1Ki 8:45 Then hear thou in heaven their prayer and their supplication, and maintain their cause.

2Ch 6:24 And if thy people Israel be put to the worse before the enemy, because they have sinned against thee; and shall return and confess thy name, and pray and make supplication before thee in this house;

2Ch 6:25 Then hear thou from the heavens, and forgive the sin of **thy people Israel**, and bring them again unto the land which thou gavest to them and to their fathers. 2Ch 6:26 **When the heaven is shut up, and there is no rain, because they have sinned against thee**; *yet* if they pray toward this place, and confess thy name, and turn from their sin, when thou dost afflict them; 2Ch 6:27 Then hear thou from heaven, and forgive the sin of thy servants, and of **thy people Israel**, when thou hast taught them the good way, wherein they should walk; and send rain upon thy land, which thou hast given unto thy people for an inheritance.

2Ch 6:28 If there be dearth in the land, **if there be pestilence**, if there be blasting, or mildew, locusts, or caterpillers; if their enemies besiege them in the cities of their land; whatsoever sore or whatsoever sickness *there he*:

2Ch 6:29 *Then* what prayer *or* what supplication soever shall be made of any man, or of all **thy people Israel**, when every one shall know his own sore and his own grief, and shall spread forth his hands in this house: 2Ch 6:30 Then hear thou from heaven thy dwelling place, and forgive, and render unto every man according unto all his ways, whose heart thou knowest; (for thou only knowest the hearts of the children of men:) 2Ch 6:31 That they may fear thee, to walk in thy ways, so long as they live in the land which thou gavest unto **our fathers**.

2Ch 6:32 Moreover concerning the stranger, which is not of thy people Israel, but is come from a far country for thy great name's sake,

and thy mighty hand, and thy stretched out arm; if they come and pray in this house;

2Ch 6:33 Then hear thou from the heavens, *even* from thy dwelling place, and do according to all that **the stranger** calleth to thee for; that all people of the earth may know thy name, and fear thee, as *doth* **thy people Israel**, and may know that this house which I have built is called by thy name.

2Ch 6:34 If thy people go out to war against their enemies by the way that thou shalt send them, and they pray unto thee toward this city which thou hast chosen, and the house which I have built for thy name;

2Ch 6:35 Then hear thou from the heavens their prayer and their supplication, and maintain their cause.

1Ki 8:46 If they sin against thee, (for *there is* no man that sinneth not,) and thou be angry with them, and deliver them to the enemy, so that they carry them away captives unto the land of the enemy, far or near;

1Ki 8:47 *Yet* if they shall bethink themselves in the land whither they were carried captives, and repent, and make supplication unto thee in the land of them that carried them captives, saying, We have sinned, and have done perversely, we have committed wickedness;

1Ki 8:48 And so return unto thee with all their heart, and with all their soul, in the land of their enemies, which led them away captive, and pray unto thee toward their land, which thou gavest unto their fathers, the city which thou hast chosen, and the house which I have built for thy name:

1Ki 8:49 Then hear thou their prayer and their supplication in heaven thy dwelling place, and maintain their cause,

1Ki 8:50 And forgive thy people that have sinned against thee, and all their transgressions wherein they have transgressed against thee, and give them compassion before them who carried them captive, that they may have compassion on them:

1Ki 8:51 For they be thy people, and thine inheritance, which thou broughtest forth out of Egypt, from the midst of the furnace of iron:

1Ki 8:52 That thine eyes may be open unto the supplication of thy servant, and unto the supplication of thy people Israel, to hearken unto them in all that they call for unto thee.

1Ki 8:53 For thou didst separate them from among all the people of the earth, to be thine inheritance, as thou spakest by the hand of Moses thy servant, when thou broughtest our fathers out of Egypt, O Lord GOD.

2Ch 6:36 If they sin against thee, (for *there is* no man which sinneth not,) and thou be angry with them, and deliver them over before *their* enemies, and they carry them away captives unto a land far off or near; (Note: such as the upcoming exiles to Assyria and Babylon) 2Ch 6:37 Yet *if* they bethink themselves in the land whither they are carried captive, and turn and pray unto thee in the land of their captivity, saying, We have sinned, we have done amiss, and have dealt wickedly;

2Ch 6:38 If they return to thee with all their heart and with all their soul in the land of their captivity, whither they have carried them captives, and pray toward their land, which thou gavest unto their fathers, and *toward* the city which thou hast chosen, and toward the house which I have built for thy name: 2Ch 6:39 Then hear thou from the heavens, *even* from

thy dwelling place, their prayer and their supplications, and maintain their cause,

and forgive thy people which have sinned against thee.

2Ch 6:40 Now, my God, let, I beseech thee, thine eyes be open, and *let* thine ears *be* attent unto the prayer *that is made* in this place.

2Ch 6:41 Now therefore arise, O LORD God, into thy resting place, thou, and the ark of thy strength: let thy priests, O LORD God, be clothed with salvation, and let thy saints rejoice in goodness.

2Ch 6:42 O LORD **God**, turn not away the face of thine anointed: remember the mercies of **David** thy servant.

Admonishment to be wholly devoted to the Lord

1Ki 8:54 And it was *so*, that when **Solomon** had made an end of praying all this prayer and supplication **unto the LORD**, he arose from before **the altar of the LORD**, from kneeling on his knees with his hands spread up to heaven.

1Ki 8:55 And he stood, and blessed all the congregation of Israel with a loud voice, saying,

1Ki 8:56 Blessed be the LORD,

- that hath given rest unto his people Israel, according to all that he promised:
- there hath not failed one word of all his good promise, which he promised by the hand of Moses his servant.

1Ki 8:57 The LORD our God be with us,

- as he was with our fathers: let him not leave us, nor forsake us:
- 1Ki 8:58 That he may incline our hearts unto him,
 - o to walk in all his ways,
 - and to keep his commandments, and his statutes, and his judgments, which he commanded our fathers.

1Ki 8:59 And let these **my words**, wherewith I have made supplication before **the LORD**, be nigh **unto the LORD** our **God** day and night, that he maintain the cause of his servant, and the cause of **his people Israel** at all times, as the matter shall require:

1Ki 8:60 That all the people of the earth may know that the LORD is God, and that there is none else.

1Ki 8:61 Let your heart therefore be perfect with the LORD our God, to walk in his statutes, and to keep his commandments, as at this day.

Dedication of the altar

2Ch 7:1 Now when Solomon had made an end of 1Ki 8:62 And the king, and all Israel with him, offered sacrifice before the LORD. praying, the fire came down from heaven, and consumed 1Ki 8:63 And Solomon offered a sacrifice of peace the burnt offering and the sacrifices; and the glory of the LORD filled the house. offerings, 2Ch 7:2 And the priests could not enter into the house of the LORD, because the glory of the LORD had filled the LORD'S house. 2Ch 7:3 And when all the children of Israel saw how the fire came down, and the glory of the LORD upon the house, they bowed themselves with their faces to the ground upon the pavement, and worshipped, and praised the LORD, saying, For he is good; for his mercy endureth for ever. 2Ch 7:4 Then the king and all the people offered sacrifices before the LORD. which he offered unto the LORD, two and twenty 2Ch 7:5 And king Solomon offered a sacrifice of twenty thousand oxen, and an hundred and twenty thousand and two thousand oxen, and an hundred and twenty sheep. thousand **sheep**: So the king and all the children of Israel dedicated so the king and all the people dedicated the house of the house of the LORD.

2Ch 7:6 And the priests waited on their offices: **the Levites** also with instruments of musick **of the LORD**, which **David** the king had made to praise **the LORD**, because his **mercy** *endureth* for ever, when **David** praised by their ministry; and the priests sounded trumpets before them, and **all Israel** stood.

Consecration of the middle of the court

1Ki 8:64 The same day

did the king hallow the middle of the court that was before the house of the LORD: for there he offered burnt offerings, and meat [grain] offerings, and the fat of the peace offerings: because the brasen altar that was before the LORD was too little to receive the burnt offerings, and meat [grain] offerings, and the fat of the peace offerings.

1Ki 8:65 And at that time **Solomon** held a feast, and all **Israel** with him, a great congregation, from the entering in of Hamath unto the river of **Egypt**,

- before the LORD our God, seven days
- and seven days,

even fourteen days.

1Ki 8:66 On the eighth day he sent the people away: and they blessed the king, and went unto their tents joyful and glad of heart for all the goodness that the LORD had done for David his servant, and for Israel his people.

2Ch 7:7 Moreover Solomon hallowed the middle of the court that was before the house of the LORD: for there he offered burnt offerings, and the fat of the peace offerings, because the brasen altar which Solomon had made was not able to receive the burnt offerings, and the meat [grain] offerings, and the fat.

2Ch 7:8 Also at the same time **Solomon** kept the feast seven days, and all Israel with him, a very great congregation, from the entering in of Hamath unto the river of **Egypt**.

2Ch 7:9 And in the eighth day they made a solemn assembly: for they kept

- the dedication of the altar seven days,
- and the feast seven days.
- •

2Ch 7:10 And on the three and twentieth day of the seventh month he sent the people away into their tents, glad and merry in heart for the goodness that the LORD had shewed unto David, and to Solomon, and to Israel his people.

See Leviticus 23:33-44 - The eight day in 1 Ki 8:66 is relative to the 15th day when the feast began. 15+8=23

2Ch 7:12 And the LORD appeared to Solomon by night,

This area disappeared from the map of the world due to seawater flooding twice and now, with its various cities and villages, lies beneath the Indian Ocean. - Ecc 1:5 The sun also ariseth, and the sun goeth down, and hasteth to his place where he arose.
- Ecc 1:6 The wind goeth toward the south, and turneth about unto the north; it whirleth about continually, and the wind returneth again according to his circuits.

- Ecc 2:22 For what hath man of all his labour, and of the vexation of his heart, wherein he hath laboured under the sun?
- Ecc 2:23 For all his days *are* sorrows, and his travail grief; yea, his heart taketh not rest in the night. This is also vanity.

No Joy without God

- Ecc 2:24 *There is* nothing better for a man, *than* that he should eat and drink, and *that* he should make his soul enjoy good in his labour. This also I saw, that it *was* from the hand **of God**.
- Ecc 2:25 For who can eat, or who else can hasten hereunto, more than I?
- Ecc 2:26 For *God* giveth to a man that *is* good in his sight **wisdom**, and **knowledge**, and joy: but to **the sinner** he giveth travail, to gather and to heap up, that he may give to *him that is* good before **God**. This also *is* vanity and vexation of spirit.

A season for Every Purpose

- Ecc 3:1 To every *thing there is* a season, and a time to every purpose under the heaven:
- Ecc 3:2 A time to be born, and a time to die; a time to plant, and a time to pluck up that which is planted;
- Ecc 3:3 A time to kill, and a time to heal; a time to break down, and a time to build up;
- Ecc 3:4 A time to weep, and a time to laugh; a time to mourn, and a time to dance;
- Ecc 3:5 A time to cast away stones, and a time to gather stones together; a time to embrace, and a time to refrain from embracing;
- Ecc 3:6 A time to get, and a time to lose; a time to keep, and a time to cast away;
- Ecc 3:7 A time to rend, and a time to sew; a time to keep silence, and a time to speak;
- Ecc 3:8 A time to love, and a time to hate; a time of war, and a time of peace.

Eternal Perspective

- Ecc 3:9 What profit hath he that worketh in that wherein he laboureth?
- Ecc 3:10 I have seen the travail, which God hath given to the sons of men to be exercised in it.
- Ecc 3:11 He hath made every *thing* beautiful in his time: also he hath set the world in their heart, so that no man can find out the work that **God** maketh from the beginning to the end.
- Ecc 3:12 I know that there is no good in them, but for a man to rejoice, and to do good in his life.
- Ecc 3:13 And also that every man should eat and drink, and enjoy the good of all his labour, it is the gift of God.
- Ecc 3:14 I know that, whatsoever **God** doeth, it shall be for ever: nothing can be put to it, nor any thing taken from it: and **God** doeth *it.* that *men* should fear before him.
- Ecc 3:15 That which hath been is now; and that which is to be hath already been; and God requireth that which is past.

Judgment

- Ecc 3:16 And moreover I saw under the sun the place of **judgment**, that **wickedness** was there; and the place of **righteousness**, that iniquity was there.
- Ecc 3:17 I said in mine heart, **God** shall judge **the righteous** and **the wicked**: for *there is* a time there for every purpose and for every work.

Man and Beasts - both die

- Ecc 3:18 I said in mine heart concerning the estate of the sons of men, that God might manifest them, and that they might see that they themselves are beasts.
- Ecc 3:19 For that which befalleth the sons of men befalleth beasts; even one thing befalleth them: as the one dieth, so dieth the other; yea, they have all one breath; so that a man hath no preeminence above a beast: for all *is* vanity. Ecc 3:20 All go unto one place; all are of the dust, and all turn to dust again.
- Ecc 3:21 Who knoweth the spirit of man that goeth upward, and the spirit of the beast that goeth downward to the earth?
- Ecc 3:22 Wherefore I perceive that *there is* **nothing better**, **than that a man should rejoice in his own works**; for that *is* his portion: for who shall bring him to see what shall be after him?

Oppression

- **Ecc 4:1** So I returned, and considered all the oppressions that are done under the sun: and behold the tears of *such* as were oppressed, and they had no comforter; and on the side of their oppressors *there was* power; but they had no comforter.
- Ecc 4:2 Wherefore I praised the dead which are already dead more than the living which are yet alive.
- Ecc 4:3 Yea, better *is he* than both they, which hath not yet been, who hath not seen the **evil** work that is done under the sun.

Miscellaneous

- Ecc 4:4 Again, I considered all travail, and every right work, that for this a man is envied of his neighbour. This is also vanity and vexation of spirit.
- Ecc 4:5 The **fool** foldeth his hands together, and eateth his own flesh.
- Ecc 4:6 Better is an handful with quietness, than both the hands full with travail and vexation of spirit.

Striving after excessive wealth

- Ecc 4:7 Then I returned, and I saw vanity under the sun.
- Ecc 4:8 There is one *alone*, and *there is* not a second; yea, he hath neither child nor brother: yet *is there* no end of all his labour; neither is his eye **satisfied** with **riches**; neither *saith he*, For whom do I labour, and bereave my soul of good? This *is* also vanity, yea, it *is* a sore travail.

It is not good to be alone

- Ecc 4:9 Two are better than one; because they have a good reward for their labour.
- Ecc 4:10 For if they fall, the one will lift up his fellow: but woe to him *that is* alone when he falleth; for *he hath* not another to help him up.
- Ecc 4:11 Again, if two lie together, then they have heat: but how can one be warm alone?
- Ecc 4:12 And if one prevail against him, two shall withstand him; and a threefold cord is not quickly broken.

A foolish king

- Ecc 4:13 Better is a poor and a wise child than an old and foolish king, who will no more be admonished.
- Ecc 4:14 For out of prison he cometh to reign; whereas also he that is born in his kingdom becometh poor.
- Ecc 4:15 I considered all the living which walk under the sun, with the second child that shall stand up in his stead.
- Ecc 4:16 *There is* no end of all the people, *even* of all that have been before them: they also that come after shall not rejoice in him. Surely this also *is* vanity and vexation of spirit.

Proper conduct before God

- Ecc 5:1 Keep thy foot when thou goest to the house of God, and be more ready to hear, than to give the sacrifice of fools: for they consider not that they do evil.
- Ecc 5:2 Be not rash with thy mouth, and let not thine heart be hasty to utter *any* thing before **God**: for **God** *is* in heaven, and thou upon earth: therefore let thy words be few.
- Ecc 5:3 For a dream cometh through the multitude of business; and a **fool**'s voice *is known* by multitude of words.
- Ecc 5:4 When thou vowest a vow unto God, defer not to pay it; for *he hath* no pleasure in fools: pay that which thou hast vowed.
- Ecc 5:5 Better is it that thou shouldest not vow, than that thou shouldest vow and not pay.
- Ecc 5:6 Suffer not thy mouth to cause thy flesh to sin; neither say thou before the angel, that it was an error:
- wherefore should **God** be angry at thy voice, and destroy the work of thine hands?
- Ecc 5:7 For in the multitude of dreams and many words there are also divers vanities: but fear thou God.

Politics

- Ecc 5:8 If thou seest the oppression of the poor, and violent **pervert**ing of **judgment** and **justice** in a province, marvel not at the matter: for *he that is* higher than the highest regardeth; and *there be* higher than they.
- Ecc 5:9 Moreover the profit of the earth is for all: the king himself is served by the field.

Money and Wealth are not the foundation for happiness, God is

- Ecc 5:10 He that loveth silver shall not be satisfied with silver; nor he that loveth abundance with increase: this *is* also vanity.
- Ecc 5:11 When goods increase, they are increased that eat them: and what good *is there* to the owners thereof, saving the beholding *of them* with their eyes?
- Ecc 5:12 The sleep of a labouring man *is* sweet, whether he eat little or much: but the abundance of the rich will not suffer him to sleep.
- Ecc 5:13 There is a sore **evil** which I have seen under the sun, namely, **riches** kept for the owners thereof to their hurt.
- Ecc 5:14 But those riches perish by evil travail: and he begetteth a son, and there is nothing in his hand.
- Ecc 5:15 As he came forth of his mother's womb, naked shall he return to go as he came, and shall take nothing of his labour, which he may carry away in his hand.
- Ecc 5:16 And this also is a sore evil, that in all points as he came, so shall he go: and what profit hath he that hath laboured for the wind?
- Ecc 5:17 All his days also he eateth in darkness, and he hath much sorrow and wrath with his sickness.
- Ecc 5:18 Behold *that* which I have seen: *it is* good and comely *for one* to eat and to drink, and to enjoy the good of all his labour that he taketh under the sun all the days of his life, which God giveth him: for it *is* his portion.
- Ecc 5:19 Every man also to whom God hath given riches and wealth, and hath given him power to eat thereof, and

to take his portion, and to rejoice in his labour; this is the gift of God.

Ecc 5:20 For he shall not much remember the days of his life; because God answereth him in the joy of his heart.

The curse of others consuming your wealth

- Ecc 6:1 There is an evil which I have seen under the sun, and it is common among men:
- Ecc 6:2 A man to whom **God** hath given **riches**, wealth, and **honour**, so that he wanteth nothing for his soul of all that he desireth, yet **God** giveth him not power to eat thereof, but a **stranger** eateth it: this *is* vanity, and it *is* an **evil** disease.
- Ecc 6:3 If a man beget an hundred *children*, and live many years, so that the days of his years be many, and his soul be not filled with good, and also *that* he have no burial; I say, *that* an untimely birth *is* better than he.
- Ecc 6:4 For he cometh in with vanity, and departeth in darkness, and his name shall be covered with darkness.
- Ecc 6:5 Moreover he hath not seen the sun, nor known any thing: this hath more rest than the other.
- Ecc 6:6 Yea, though he live a thousand years twice told, yet hath he seen no good: do not all go to one place?
- Ecc 6:7 All the labour of man is for **his mouth**, and yet the appetite is not filled.
- Ecc 6:8 For what hath the wise more than the fool? what hath the poor, that knoweth to walk before the living?
- Ecc 6:9 Better is the sight of the eyes than the wandering of the desire: this is also vanity and vexation of spirit.
- Ecc 6:10 That which hath been is named already, and it is known that it is man: neither may he contend with him that is mightier than he.
- Ecc 6:11 Seeing there be many things that increase vanity, what is man the better?
- Ecc 6:12 For who knoweth what is good for man in this life, all the days of his vain life which he spendeth as a shadow? for who can tell a man what shall be after him under the sun?

The mindset of the depressed

- Ecc 7:1 A good name is better than precious ointment; and the day of death than the day of one's birth.
- Ecc 7:2 *It is* better to go to the house of mourning, than to go to the house of feasting: for that is the end of all men; and the living will lay it to his heart.
- Ecc 7:3 Sorrow is better than laughter: for by the sadness of the countenance the heart is made better.
- Ecc 7:4 The heart of the wise is in the house of mourning; but the heart of fools is in the house of mirth.

Miscellaneous

- Ecc 7:5 It is better to hear the rebuke of the wise, than for a man to hear the song of fools.
- Ecc 7:6 For as the crackling of thorns under a pot, so is the laughter of the **fool**: this also is vanity.
- Ecc 7:7 Surely oppression maketh a wise man mad; and a gift destroyeth the heart.
- Ecc 7:8 Better is the end of a thing than the beginning thereof: and the patient in spirit is better than the **proud** in spirit.
- Ecc 7:9 Be not hasty in thy spirit to be angry: for anger resteth in the bosom of **fools**.
- Ecc 7:10 Say not thou, What is *the cause* that the former days were better than these? for thou dost not enquire wisely concerning this.
- Ecc 7:11 **Wisdom** is good with an inheritance: and by it there is profit to them that see the sun.
- Ecc 7:12 For **wisdom** is a defence, and money is a defence: but the excellency of **knowledge** is, that **wisdom** giveth **life** to them that have it.
- Ecc 7:13 Consider the work of God: for who can make that straight, which he hath made crooked?
- Ecc 7:14 In the day of prosperity be joyful, but in the day of adversity consider: **God** also hath set the one over against the other, to the end that man should find nothing after him.

The mindset of those who compromise their integrity

- Ecc 7:15 All *things* have I seen in the days of my vanity: there is a just man that perisheth in his **righteousness**, and there is a **wicked** man that prolongeth his *life* in his **wickedness**.
- Ecc 7:16 Be not righteous over much; neither make thyself over wise: why shouldest thou destroy thyself?
- Ecc 7:17 Be not over much wicked, neither be thou foolish: why shouldest thou die before thy time?

Miscellaneous

- Ecc 7:18 *It is* good that thou shouldest take hold of this; yea, also from this withdraw not thine hand: for he that feareth **God** shall come forth of them all.
- Ecc 7:19 **Wisdom** strengtheneth the wise more than ten mighty *men* which are in the city.
- Ecc 7:20 For there is not a just man upon earth, that doeth good, and sinneth not.
- Ecc 7:21 Also take no heed unto all words that are spoken; lest thou hear thy servant curse thee:
- Ecc 7:22 For oftentimes also thine own heart knoweth that thou thyself likewise hast cursed others.

Wisdom is evasive to the one lacking Integrity

- Ecc 7:23 All this have I proved by wisdom: I said, I will be wise; but it was far from me.
- Ecc 7:24 That which is far off, and exceeding deep, who can find it out?
- Ecc 7:25 I applied mine heart to know, and to search, and to seek out **wisdom**, and the reason *of things*, and to know **the wickedness** of folly, even of **foolish**ness *and* madness:
- Ecc 7:26 And I find more bitter than death the woman, whose heart *is* snares and nets, *and* her hands *as* bands: whose pleaseth **God** shall escape from her; but **the sinner** shall be taken by her.
- Ecc 7:27 Behold, this have I found, saith the preacher, *counting* one by one, to find out the account:
- Ecc 7:28 Which yet my soul seeketh, but I find not: one man among a thousand have I found; but a woman among all those have I not found.
- Ecc 7:29 Lo, this only have I found, that God hath made man upright; but they have sought out many inventions.

Behavior before a King

- **Ecc 8:1** Who *is* as **the wise man?** and who knoweth the interpretation of a thing? a man's **wisdom** maketh his face to shine, and the boldness of his face shall be changed.
- Ecc 8:2 I counsel thee to keep the king's commandment, and that in regard of the oath of God.
- Ecc 8:3 Be not hasty to go out of his sight: stand not in an evil thing; for he doeth whatsoever pleaseth him.
- Ecc 8:4 Where the word of a king is, there is power: and who may say unto him, What doest thou?
- Ecc 8:5 Whoso keepeth the commandment shall feel no evil thing: and a wise man's heart discerneth both time and judgment.

Confused?

- Ecc 8:6 Because to every purpose there is time and **judgment**, therefore the misery of man is great upon him.
- Ecc 8:7 For he knoweth not that which shall be: for who can tell him when it shall be?

Exercising Authority

- Ecc 8:8 *There is* no man that hath power over the spirit to retain the spirit; neither *hath he* power in the day of death: and *there is* no discharge in *that* war; neither shall **wickedness** deliver those that are given to it.
- Ecc 8:9 All this have I seen, and applied my heart unto every work that is done under the sun: *there is* a time wherein one man ruleth over another to his own hurt.
- Ecc 8:10 And so I saw **the wicked** buried, who had come and gone from the place of the holy, and they were forgotten in the city where they had so done: this *is* also vanity.

Slow Justice breeds Evil

Ecc 8:11 Because sentence against an evil work is not executed speedily, therefore the heart of the sons of men is fully set in them to do evil.

Justice

Ecc 8:12 Though a sinner do evil an hundred times, and his *days* be prolonged, yet surely I know that it shall be well with them that fear God, which fear before him:

Ecc 8:13 But it shall not be well with **the wicked**, neither shall he prolong *his* days, *which are* as a shadow; because he feareth not before **God**.

Injustice

Ecc 8:14 There is a vanity which is done upon the earth; that there be just *men*, unto whom it happeneth according to the work of **the wicked**; again, there be **wicked** *men*, to whom it happeneth according to the work of **the righteous**: I said that this also *is* vanity.

God's ways cannot be discovered by man's own effort

Ecc 8:15 Then I commended mirth, because a man hath no better thing under the sun, than to eat, and to drink, and to be merry: for that shall abide with him of his labour the days of his life, which God giveth him under the sun. Ecc 8:16 When I applied mine heart to know wisdom, and to see the business that is done upon the earth: (for also there is that neither day nor night seeth sleep with his eyes:)

Ecc 8:17 Then I beheld all the work of God, that a man cannot find out the work that is done under the sun: because though a man labour to seek *it* out, yet he shall not find *it*; yea further; though a wise man think to know *it*, yet shall he not be able to find *it*.

Everyone dies eventually whether good or evil

Ecc 9:1 For all this I considered in my heart even to declare all this, that the righteous, and the wise, and their works, are in the hand of God: no man knoweth either love or hatred by all that is before them.

Ecc 9:2 All *things come* alike to all: *there is* one event to **the righteous**, and to **the wicked**; to the good and to the clean, and to the unclean; to him that sacrificeth, and to him that sacrificeth not: as *is* the good, so *is* **the sinner**; *and* he that sweareth, as *he* that feareth an oath.

Ecc 9:3 This is an evil among all things that are done under the sun, that there is one event unto all: yea, also the heart of the sons of men is full of evil, and madness is in their heart while they live, and after that they go to the dead.

Ecc 9:4 For to him that is joined to all the living there is hope: for a living dog is better than a dead lion.

Ecc 9:5 For the living know that they shall die: but the dead know not any thing, neither have they any more a reward; for the memory of them is forgotten.

Ecc 9:6 Also their love, and their hatred, and their envy, is now perished; neither have they any more a portion for ever in any *thing* that is done under the sun.

Enjoy life while you still have it

Ecc 9:7 Go thy way, eat thy bread with joy, and drink thy wine with a merry heart; for God now accepteth thy works.

Ecc 9:8 Let thy garments be always white; and let thy head lack no ointment.

Ecc 9:9 Live joyfully with the wife whom thou lovest all the days of the **life** of thy vanity, which he hath given thee under the sun, all the days of thy vanity: for that *is* thy portion in *this* **life**, and in thy labour which thou takest under the sun.

Ecc 9:10 Whatsoever thy hand findeth to do, do *it* with thy might; for *there is* no work, nor device, nor **knowledge**, nor **wisdom**, in the grave, whither thou goest.

Wisdom Better than Folly

No Guarantees

Ecc 9:11 I returned, and saw under the sun, that the race *is* not to the swift, nor the battle to the strong, neither yet bread to **the wise**, nor yet **riches** to men of **understanding**, nor yet favour to men of skill; but time and chance happeneth to them all.

Ecc 9:12 For man also knoweth not his time: as the fishes that are taken in an **evil** net, and as the birds that are caught in the snare; so *are* the sons of men snared in an **evil** time, when it falleth suddenly upon them.

Wisdom heeded then later despised

- Ecc 9:13 This wisdom have I seen also under the sun, and it seemed great unto me:
- Ecc 9:14 *There was* a little city, and few men within it; and there came a great king against it, and besieged it, and built great bulwarks against it:
- Ecc 9:15 Now there was found in it a poor wise man, and he by his wisdom delivered the city; yet no man remembered that same poor man.
- Ecc 9:16 Then said I, **Wisdom** is better than strength: nevertheless the poor man's **wisdom** is despised, and his words are not heard.

Wisdom is better than...

- Ecc 9:17 The words of wise *men are* heard in quiet more than the cry of him that ruleth among fools.
- Ecc 9:18 Wisdom is better than weapons of war: but one sinner destroyeth much good.

Fools

- **Ecc 10:1** Dead flies cause the ointment of the apothecary to send forth a stinking savour: *so doth* a little folly him that is in reputation for wisdom and honour.
- Ecc 10:2 A wise man's heart is at his right hand; but a fool's heart at his left.
- Ecc 10:3 Yea also, when he that is a **fool** walketh by the way, his wisdom faileth *him*, and he saith to every one *that* he *is* a **fool**.
- Ecc 10:12 The words of a wise man's mouth are gracious; but the lips of a fool will swallow up himself.
- Ecc 10:13 The beginning of the words of **his mouth** is **foolish**ness: and the end of his talk is mischievous madness.
- Ecc 10:14 A fool also is full of words: a man cannot tell what shall be; and what shall be after him, who can tell him?
- Ecc 10:15 The labour of the foolish wearieth every one of them, because he knoweth not how to go to the city.
- Ecc 10:16 Woe to thee, O land, when thy king is a child, and thy princes eat in the morning!

Handling an angry king

Ecc 10:4 If the spirit of the ruler rise up against thee, leave not thy place; for yielding pacifieth great offences.

The opposite of normal observed

- Ecc 10:5 There is an evil which I have seen under the sun, as an error which proceedeth from the ruler:
- Ecc 10:6 Folly is set in great dignity, and the rich sit in low place.
- Ecc 10:7 I have seen servants upon horses, and princes walking as servants upon the earth.

Miscellaneous

- Ecc 10:8 He that diggeth a pit shall fall into it; and whoso breaketh an hedge, a serpent shall bite him.
- Ecc 10:9 Whoso removeth stones shall be hurt therewith; and he that cleaveth wood shall be endangered thereby.
- Ecc 10:10 If the iron be blunt, and he do not whet the edge, then must he put to more strength: but **wisdom** *is* profitable to direct.
- Ecc 10:11 Surely the serpent will bite without enchantment; and a babbler is no better.
- Ecc 10:17 Blessed *art* thou, O land, when thy king *is* the son of nobles, and thy princes eat in due season, for strength, and not for drunkenness!
- Ecc 10:18 By much **slothful**ness the building decayeth; and through idleness of the hands the house droppeth through.
- Ecc 10:19 A feast is made for laughter, and wine maketh merry: but money answereth all things.
- Ecc 10:20 Curse not the king, no not in thy thought; and curse not the rich in thy bedchamber: for a bird of the air shall carry the voice, and that which hath wings shall tell the matter.
- Ecc 11:1 Cast thy bread upon the waters: for thou shalt find it after many days.
- Ecc 11:2 Give a portion to seven, and also to eight; for thou knowest not what evil shall be upon the earth.
- Ecc 11:3 If the clouds be full of rain, they empty *themselves* upon the earth: and if the tree fall toward the south, or toward the north, in the place where the tree falleth, there it shall be.

- Ecc 11:4 He that observeth the wind shall not sow; and he that regardeth the clouds shall not reap.
- Ecc 11:5 As thou knowest not what *is* the way of the spirit, *nor* how the bones *do grow* in the womb of her that is with child: even so thou knowest not the works **of God** who maketh all.
- Ecc 11:6 In the morning sow thy seed, and in the evening withhold not thine hand: for thou knowest not whether shall prosper, either this or that, or whether they both *shall be* alike good.
- Ecc 11:7 Truly the light is sweet, and a pleasant thing it is for the eyes to behold the sun:
- Ecc 11:8 But if a man live many years, *and* rejoice in them all; yet let him remember the days of darkness; for they shall be many. All that cometh *is* vanity.

Enjoy life but do so with wisdom

Ecc 11:9 Rejoice, O young man, in thy youth; and let thy heart cheer thee in the days of thy youth, and walk in the ways of thine heart, and in the sight of thine eyes: but know thou, that for all these *things* **God** will bring thee into **judgment**.

Ecc 11:10 Therefore remove sorrow from thy heart, and put away evil from thy flesh: for childhood and youth are vanity.

Ecc 12:1 Remember now thy Creator in the days of thy youth, while the evil days come not, nor the years draw nigh, when thou shalt say, I have no pleasure in them:

- Ecc 12:2 While the sun, or the light, or the moon, or the stars, be not darkened, nor the clouds return after the rain:
- Ecc 12:3 In the day when the keepers of the house shall tremble, and the strong men shall bow themselves, and the grinders cease because they are few, and those that look out of the windows be darkened,
- Ecc 12:4 And the doors shall be shut in the streets, when the sound of the grinding is low, and he shall rise up at the voice of the bird, and all the daughters of musick shall be brought low;
- Ecc 12:5 Also *when* they shall be afraid of *that which is* high, and fears *shall be* in the way, and the almond tree shall flourish, and the grasshopper shall be a burden, and desire shall fail: because man goeth to his long home, and the mourners go about the streets:
- Ecc 12:6 Or ever the silver cord be loosed, or the golden bowl be broken, or the pitcher be broken at the fountain, or the wheel broken at the cistern.
- Ecc 12:7 Then shall the dust return to the earth as it was: and the spirit shall return unto God who gave it.
- Ecc 12:8 Vanity of vanities, saith the preacher; all is vanity.

The futility of studying the wisdom of men

- Ecc 12:9 And moreover, because the preacher was wise, he still taught the people **knowledge**; yea, he gave good heed, and sought out, *and* set in order many proverbs.
- Ecc 12:10 The preacher sought to find out acceptable words: and that which was written was upright, even words of truth.
- Ecc 12:11 The words of the wise are as goads, and as nails fastened by the masters of assemblies, which are given from one shepherd.
- Ecc 12:12 And further, by these, my son, be admonished: of making many books *there is* no end; and much study *is* a weariness of the flesh.

Accountable before God

- Ecc 12:13 Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter: Fear God, and keep his commandments: for this is the whole *duty* of man.
- Ecc 12:14 For God shall bring every work into judgment, with every secret thing, whether it be good, or whether it be evil.

Other literature containing records of Solomon

1Ki 11:41 And the rest of the acts of **Solomon**, and all that he did, and his **wisdom**, *are* they not written in **the book of the acts of Solomon?**

2Ch 9:29 Now the rest of the acts of **Solomon**, first and last, *are* they not written in

- the book of Nathan the prophet,
- and in the prophecy of Ahijah the Shilonite,
- and in the visions of Iddo the seer against Jeroboam the son of Nebat?
