Jeroboam 2, wicked **king of Israel** Son of Jehoash (Joash) wicked **king of Israel** In parallel reign with Amaziah king of Judah

Brief summary of the life of Jeroboam 2

2Ki 14:23 In the fifteenth year of Amaziah the son of Joash king of Judah

Jeroboam the son of Joash king of Israel began to reign in Samaria,

- and reigned forty and one years.
- 2Ki 14:24 And he did that which was evil in the sight of the LORD: he departed not from all the sins of **Jeroboam the son of Nebat,** who made **Israel** to sin.

God through Jeroboam restores the borders of Israel

2Ki 14:25 He restored the coast [border] of **Israel** from the entering of Hamath unto the sea of the plain [Arabah], according to the word of the LORD God of **Israel**, which he spake by the hand of his servant Jonah, the son of Amittai, the prophet, which was of Gathhepher.

(Note; these specific prophecies of Jonah are not recorded in the Old Testament).

From Josephus, Antiquities of the Jews, Book 9, Chapter 10, paragraph 1

IN the fifteenth year of the reign of Amaziah, Jeroboam the son of Joash reigned over Israel in Samaria forty years. This king was guilty of contumely against God, and became very wicked in worshipping of idols, and in many undertakings that were absurd and foreign. He was also the cause of ten thousand misfortunes to the people of Israel. Now one Jonah, a prophet, foretold to him that he should make war with the Syrians, and conquer their army, and enlarge the bounds of his kingdom on the northern parts to the city Hamath (Note: located in west cental Syria), and on the southern to the lake Asphaltitis (Note: Dead Sea); for the bounds of the Canaanites originally were these, as Joshua their general had determined them. So Jeroboam made an expedition against the Syrians, and overran all their country, as Jonah had foretold.

Note: **Hamath** is also called Hama in Syria. The Dead Sea is also known by other names such as the Salt Sea, the Sea of Arabah, and Lake Asphaltitus.

2Ki 14:26 For the LORD saw the affliction of **Israel**, that it was very bitter: for there was not any shut up, nor any left, nor any helper for **Israel**.

2Ki 14:27 And the LORD said not that he would blot out the name of **Israel** from under heaven: but he saved them by the hand of **Jeroboam the son of Joash**.

More records of Jeroboam 2 king of Israel

2Ki 14:28 Now the rest of the acts of **Jeroboam**, and all that he did, and his might, how he warred, and how he recovered **Damascus**, and **Hamath**, which belonged to **Judah**, for **Israel**, are they not written in the book of the chronicles of the kings of **Israel**?

Note: This is not the 1,2 Chronicles of the Bible but it is recommended reading.

Jon 1:1

Now the word of the LORD came unto Jonah the son of Amittai,

saying,

Jon 1:2 Arise, go to Nineveh, that great city, and cry against it;

(Note: Nineveh is the capital of Syria in this time period)

for their wickedness is come up before me.

Jon 1:3 But Jonah rose up to flee unto Tarshish

from the presence of the LORD,

and went down to **Joppa**; and he found a ship going to **Tarshish**: so he paid the fare thereof, and went down into it, to go with them unto **Tarshish** (Note: **Tarshish** is believed to be on the SSW coast of Spain though not all scholars agree.) from the presence of the LORD.

Note: One of the methods of torture the Assyrians used was to peel the skin off their victims bodies and fillet them. Prophesying to bring repentance in any city of Assyria made one a candidate for such persecution.

Jon 1:4 But the LORD sent out a great wind into the sea, and there was a mighty tempest in the sea, so that the ship was like to be broken.

Jon 1:5 Then the mariners were afraid, and cried every man unto his god, and cast forth the wares that *were* in the ship into the sea, to lighten *it* of them.

But **Jonah** was gone down into the sides of the ship; and he lay, and was fast asleep.

Jon 1:6 So the shipmaster came to him, and said unto him, What meanest thou, O sleeper? arise, call upon thy God, if so be that God will think upon us, that we perish not.

Jon 1:7 And they said every one to his fellow, Come, and let us cast lots, that we may know for whose cause this evil *is* upon us. So they cast lots, and the lot fell upon Jonah.

Jon 1:8 Then said they unto him, Tell us, we pray thee, for whose cause this evil *is* upon us; What *is* thine occupation? and whence comest thou? what *is* thy country? and of what people *art* thou?

Jon 1:9 And he said unto them, I *am* an Hebrew; and I fear the LORD, the God of heaven, which hath made the sea and the dry *land*.

Jon 1:10 Then were the men exceedingly afraid, and said unto him, Why hast thou done this? For the men knew that he fled

from the presence of the LORD.

because he had told them.

Jon 1:11 Then said they unto him,

What shall we do unto thee, that the sea may be calm unto us? for the sea wrought, and was tempestuous.

on 1:12 And he said unto them, Take me up, and cast me forth into the sea;

so shall the sea be calm unto you:

for I know that for my sake this great tempest is upon you.

Jon 1:13 Nevertheless the men rowed hard to bring it to the land;

but they could not: for the sea wrought, and was tempestuous against them.

Jon 1:14 Wherefore they cried unto the LORD, and said,

We beseech thee, O LORD, we beseech thee,

let us not perish for this man's life,

and lay not upon us innocent blood:

for thou, O LORD, hast done as it pleased thee.

Jon 1:15 So they took up Jonah, and cast him forth into the sea: and the sea ceased from her raging.

Jon 1:16 Then the men feared the LORD exceedingly, and offered a sacrifice unto the LORD, and made vows.

Jon 1:17 Now the LORD had prepared a great fish to swallow up **Jonah**. And **Jonah** was in the belly of the fish three days and three nights.

Jon 2:1 Then Jonah prayed unto the LORD his God out of the fish's belly, Jon 2:2 And said,

I cried by reason of mine affliction unto the LORD, and he heard me;

out of the belly of hell cried I, and thou heardest my voice.

Jon 2:3 For thou hadst cast me into the deep, in the midst of the seas;

and the floods compassed me about: all thy billows and thy waves passed over me.

Jon 2:4 Then I said, I am cast out of thy sight;

yet I will look again toward thy holy temple.

Jon 2:5 The waters compassed me about, even to the soul:

the depth closed me round about,

the weeds were wrapped about my head.

Jon 2:6 I went down to the bottoms of the mountains:

the earth with her bars was about me for ever:

yet hast thou brought up my life from corruption, O LORD my God.

Jon 2:7 When my soul fainted within me I remembered the LORD:

and my prayer came in unto thee, into thine holy temple.

Jon 2:8 They that observe lying vanities forsake their own mercy.

Jon 2:9 But I will sacrifice unto thee with the voice of thanksgiving;

I will pay that I have vowed.

Salvation is of the LORD.

Jon 2:10 And the LORD spake unto the fish, and it vomited out Jonah upon the dry land.

Jon 3:1 And the word of the LORD came unto Jonah the second time, saying,

Jon 3:2 Arise, go unto Nineveh, that great city, and preach unto it the preaching that I bid thee.

Jon 3:3 So Jonah arose, and went unto Nineveh, according to the word of the LORD.

Now Nineveh was an exceeding great city of three days' journey.

Jon 3:4 And Jonah began to enter into the city a day's journey,

and he cried, and said, Yet forty days, and Nineveh shall be overthrown.

Note: Assyria had several enemies including **Egypt**, <u>Babylonia</u>, <u>Elam</u>, <u>Phrygia</u>, <u>Urartu</u>, <u>Persia</u> and <u>Media</u> Their economy and military had been weakened by their many conquests of surrounding regions. They were also plagued with numerous rebellions. (Source: Wikipedia)

Jon 3:5 So the people of Nineveh believed God, and proclaimed a fast, and put on sackcloth, from the greatest of them even to the least of them.

The People of Nineveh Repent

Jon 3:6 For word came unto the king of Nineveh, and he arose from his throne, and he laid his robe from him, and covered *him* with sackcloth, and sat in ashes.

Jon 3:7

And he caused it to be proclaimed and published through Nineveh by the decree of the king and his nobles, saying,

Let neither man nor beast, herd nor flock, taste any thing: let them not feed, nor drink water:

Jon 3:8 But let man and beast be covered with sackcloth, and cry mightily unto God: yea, let them turn every one from his evil way, and from the violence that *is* in their hands.

Jon 3:9 Who can tell *if* God will turn and repent, and turn away from his fierce anger, that we perish not?

Jon 3:10 And God saw their works, that they turned from their evil way; and God repented of the evil, that he had said that he would do unto them; and he did it not.

Jon 4:1 But it displeased Jonah exceedingly, and he was very angry.

Jon 4:2 And he prayed unto the LORD, and said,

I pray thee, O LORD, was not this my saying, when I was yet in my country? Therefore I fled before unto Tarshish:

for I knew that thou *art* a gracious God, and merciful, slow to anger, and of great kindness, and repentest thee of the evil.

Jon 4:3 Therefore now, O LORD, take, I beseech thee, my life from me; for *it is* better for me to die than to live.

Jon 4:4 Then said the LORD, Doest thou well to be angry?

Jon 4:5 So Jonah went out of the city, and sat on the east side of the city, and there made him a booth, and sat under it in the shadow, till he might see what would become of the city.

Jon 4:6 And the LORD God prepared a gourd,

and made *it* to come up over **Jonah**, that it might be a shadow over his head, to deliver him from his grief. So **Jonah** was exceeding glad of the gourd.

Jon 4:7 But God prepared a worm when the morning rose the next day,

and it smote the gourd that it withered.

Jon 4:8 And it came to pass, when the sun did arise,

that God prepared a vehement east wind;

and the sun beat upon the head of **Jonah**, that he fainted, and wished in himself to die, and said, *It is* better for me to die than to live.

Jon 4:9 And God said to Jonah, Doest thou well to be angry for the gourd? And he said, I do well to be angry, *even* unto death.

Jon 4:10 Then said the LORD, Thou hast had pity on the gourd, for the which thou hast not laboured, neither madest it grow; which came up in a night, and perished in a night:

Jon 4:11 And should not I spare Nineveh,

that great city, wherein are more than sixscore thousand persons that cannot discern between their right hand and their left hand; and also much cattle?

Azariah (Uzziah), righteous then wicked king of Judah Son of Amaziah king of Judah

Brief summary of the life of Azariah (Uzziah)

2Ki 15:1 In the twenty and seventh year of Jeroboam king of Israel

Azariah son of Amaziah king of Judah to reign.

- 2Ki 15:2 Sixteen years old was he when he began to reign,
- and he reigned two and fifty years in Jerusalem.
- And his mother's name was Jecholiah of Jerusalem.
- 2Ki 15:3 And he did *that which was* right in the sight of the LORD, according to all that his father **Amaziah** had done;
- 2Ki 15:4 Save that the high places were not removed: the people sacrificed and burnt incense still on the high places.

- 2Ch 26:3 Sixteen years old *was* Uzziah when he began to reign,
- and he reigned fifty and two years in **Jerusalem**.
- His mother's name also was Jecoliah of Jerusalem.
- 2Ch 26:4 And he did *that which was* right in the sight of the LORD, according to all that his father **Amaziah** did.
- 2Ch 26:5 And he sought God in the days of Zechariah, who had understanding in the visions of God: and as long as he sought the LORD, God made him to prosper.

From: Josephus, Antiquities of the Jews, Book 9, Chapter 10, Paragraph 3

"... Uzziah, the son of Amaziah, begin to reign over the two tribes in Jerusalem, in the fourteenth year of the reign of Jeroboam."

Note: This suggests that Uzziah was co-regent with Amaziah for 13 years (27-14=13)

God prospers Azariah (Uzziah) with military might and victories, and real estate - when obedient

2Ch 26:6 And he went forth and warred against the **Philistines**, and brake down

- the wall of **Gath**,
- and the wall of **Jabneh**,
- and the wall of **Ashdod**,

and built cities about Ashdod, and among the Philistines.

2Ch 26:7 And God helped him

- against the Philistines,
- and against the Arabians that dwelt in Gurbaal,
- and the Mehunims.

2Ch 26:8 And the Ammonites gave gifts to Uzziah: and his name spread abroad *even* to the entering in of **Egypt**; for he strengthened *himself* exceedingly.

2Ch 26:9 Moreover Uzziah built towers in Jerusalem

- at the corner gate,
- and at the valley gate,
- and at the turning *of the wall*, and fortified them.

2Ch 26:10a Also he built towers in the desert,

2Ch 26:10b and digged many wells: for he had much cattle, both in the low country, and in the plains: husbandmen *also*, and vine dressers in the mountains, and in Carmel: for he loved husbandry.

2Ch 26:11 Moreover Uzziah had an host of fighting men, that went out to war by bands, according to the number of their account by the hand of **Jeiel the scribe** and **Maaseiah the ruler**, under the hand of **Hananiah**, *one* of the king's captains.

2Ch 26:12 The whole number of the chief of the fathers of the mighty men of valour were two thousand and six hundred.

• 2Ch 26:13 And under their hand *was* an army, three hundred thousand and seven thousand and five hundred, that made war with mighty power, to help the king against the enemy.

2Ch 26:14 And Uzziah prepared for them throughout all the host shields, and spears, and helmets, and habergeons, and bows, and slings to cast stones.

2Ch 26:15 And he made in Jerusalem engines, invented by cunning men,

to be on the towers and upon the bulwarks, to shoot arrows and great stones withal.

And his name spread far abroad; for he was marvellously helped, till he was strong.

Azariah (Uzziah) becomes corrupt after being blessed

2Ch 26:16a But when he was strong, his heart was lifted up to his destruction: for he transgressed against the LORD his God,...

Amo 1:1 The words of Amos,

who was among the herdmen of Tekoa,
which he saw concerning Israel
in the days of Uzziah king of Judah,
and in the days of Jeroboam the son of Joash king of Israel,

two years before the earthquake. See also (Isaiah 2:10-21; 5:25; Micah 1:3-6).

Amo 1:2 And he said,
The LORD will roar from **Zion**,
and utter his voice from **Jerusalem**;
and the habitations of the shepherds shall mourn,
and the top of **Carmel** shall wither.

Aramean kingdom to be conquered by the Assyrian Empire

Note: Aram in the Old Testament is a region inside of Syria, Syria and Assyria are not the same kingdom. **Damascus** and **Nineveh** are cities of Syria.

Amo 1:3 Thus saith the LORD;

For three transgressions of **Damascus**, and for four,

I will not turn away the punishment thereof;

because they have threshed Gilead with threshing instruments of iron:

Amo 1:4 But I will send a fire into the house of Hazael,

(Note: Hazael, whom Elijah anointed to become king over Aram (1 Kings 19:15) became king of Damascus after the death of Benhadad 1, See 2 Kings chapters 8-13. Hazael himself was conquered by Shalmaneser III (859-824 BC) king of Assyria prior to this prophesy of his offspring)

which shall devour the palaces of Benhadad.

(Note: king of Aram Damascus, contemporary of kings Baasha and Ahab of the northern kingdom of Israel and Asa of the southern kingdom of Judah)

Amo 1:5 "I will also break also the bar of Damascus,

(Note: present day capital of Syria)

and cut off the inhabitant from the plain of Aven,

(Note: The "plain of Aven" (R. V. "valley of Aven"), applies to the valley of Cœle-Syria, between Lebanon and Anti-Libanus, noted for the idolatrous worship of the sun at the temple of Baalbek. The valley is now called "Beka'a" (Baedeker-Socin, "Palestine) Source: JewishEncyclopedia.com)

and him that holdeth the sceptre from the house of Eden [Beth-Eden]:

(Note: A city or region of Syria, called sometimes Bit Adini in Assyrian sources, was an <u>Aramaean</u> state that existed as an independent kingdom during the 10th and 9th Centuries BC, with its capital at <u>Til Barsib</u> (now <u>Tell Ahmar</u>). In 856 BC, the kingdom was conquered and absorbed into the <u>Assyrian Empire</u> during the reign of <u>Shalmaneser III</u>. It is usually thought to have been in the bend of the <u>Euphrates River</u>, south of <u>Carchemish</u>. Source: Wikipedia

and the people of Syria shall go into captivity unto Kir,

(Note: 2Ki_16:9 So the king of Assyria(Tiglath-pileser) listened to him (king Ahaz of Judah); and the king of Assyria went up against Damascus and captured it, and carried the people of it away into exile to Kir, and put Rezin(king of Aram) to death.) saith the LORD.

Distant Future distruction of **Philistines**, **Tyre**, **Edom**, **Ammon**, and **Moab**

The destruction of the **Philistines**

Amo 1:6 Thus saith the LORD;

For three transgressions of Gaza, and for four,

I will not turn away the punishment thereof;

because they carried away captive the whole captivity, to deliver them up to **Edom**:

Note: Edom was founded by Esau (whom God hated for his scheming deceitfulness), a region located south of **Judah** and the Dead Sea

Amo 1:7 But I will send a fire on the wall of Gaza,

which shall devour the palaces thereof:

Amo 1:8 And I will cut off the inhabitant from Ashdod,

and him that holdeth the sceptre from Ashkelon,

and I will turn mine hand against Ekron:

and the remnant of the Philistines shall perish,

saith the LORD God.

Note: The Philistine Pentapolis: Ashkelon, Ashdod, Ekron, Gath, and Gaza, all combined to make Philistia.

Prophecy partially fulfilled in 2Ch 26:6

Amo 1:9 Thus saith the LORD;

For three transgressions of Tyrus [Tyre], and for four,

I will not turn away the punishment thereof;

because they delivered up the whole captivity to **Edom**, and remembered not the brotherly covenant:

Amo 1:10 But I will send a fire on the wall of Tyrus [Tyre], (Note: a coastal city in south Lebanon) which shall devour the palaces thereof.

Amo 1:11 Thus saith the LORD;

For three transgressions of **Edom**, and for four,

(Note: Esau is also called **Edom**)

I will not turn away the punishment thereof;

because he did pursue his brother with the sword, and did cast off all pity, and his anger did tear perpetually, and he kept his wrath for ever:

Amo 1:12 But I will send a fire upon Teman, (Note: Teman was the first born son of Esau) which shall devour the palaces of Bozrah. (Note: located in southern Jordan)

Amo 1:13 Thus saith the LORD;

For three transgressions of the children of Ammon, and for four,

I will not turn away the punishment thereof;

because they have ripped up the women with child of Gilead, that they might enlarge their border:

Amo 1:14 But I will kindle a fire in the wall of Rabbah,

and it shall devour the palaces thereof,

with shouting in the day of battle,

with a tempest in the day of the whirlwind:

Amo 1:15 And their king shall go into captivity, he and his princes together, saith the LORD.

(Note: Prophecy partially fulfilled in 2Ch 26:8)

Amo 2:1 Thus saith the LORD;

For three transgressions of **Moab**, and for four,

I will not turn away the punishment thereof;

because he burned the bones of the king of **Edom** into lime:

Amo 2:2 But I will send a fire upon Moab,

and it shall devour the palaces of **Kerioth**:

and Moab shall die with tumult, with shouting, and with the sound of the trumpet:

Amo 2:3 And I will cut off the judge from the midst thereof,

and will slay all the princes thereof with him,

saith the LORD.

Israel and Judah to be troubled by the kings of Assyria

Amo 2:4 Thus saith the LORD;

For three transgressions of Judah, and for four,

I will not turn away the punishment

thereof; because they have despised the law of the LORD,

and have not kept his commandments,

and their lies caused them to err,

after the which their fathers have walked:

Amo 2:5 But I will send a fire upon Judah,

and it shall devour the palaces of Jerusalem

Amo 2:6 Thus saith the LORD;

For three transgressions of Israel, and for four,

I will not turn away the punishment thereof;

because

they sold the righteous for silver, and the poor for a pair of shoes;

Amo 2:7 That pant after the dust of the earth on the head of the poor, and turn aside the way of the meek:

and a man and his father will go in unto [have intercourse with] the *same* maid, to profane my holy name: Amo 2:8 And they lay *themselves* down upon clothes laid to pledge by every altar, and they drink the wine of the condemned [those who have been fined] *in* the house of their god.

Amo 2:9 Yet destroyed I the Amorite before them, whose height was like the height of the cedars, and he was strong as the oaks; yet I destroyed his fruit from above, and his roots from beneath.

Amo 2:10 Also I brought you up from the land of Egypt, and led you forty years through the wilderness, to possess the land of the Amorite.

Amo 2:11 And I raised up of your sons for **prophets**, and of your young men for **Nazarites**.

Is it not even thus, O ye children of Israel? saith the LORD.

Amo 2:12 But ye gave the **Nazarites** wine to drink; and commanded **the prophets**, saying, Prophesy not.

Amo 2:13 Behold, I am pressed under you, as a cart is pressed *that is* full of sheaves.

Punishment

Amo 2:14 Therefore the flight shall perish from the swift, and the strong shall not strengthen his force, neither shall the mighty deliver himself:

Amo 2:15 Neither shall he stand that handleth the bow; and he that is swift of foot shall not deliver himself:
neither shall he that rideth the horse deliver himself.

Amo 2:16 And he that is courageous among the mighty shall flee away naked in that day, saith the LORD.

Samaria to be taken into captivity

Amo 3:1

Hear this word that the LORD hath spoken against you, **O** children of Israel, against the whole family which I brought up from the land of Egypt, saying,

Amo 3:2 You only have I known of all the families of the earth: therefore I will punish you for all your iniquities.

The order of things

Amo 3:3 Can two walk together, except they be agreed?

Amo 3:4 Will a lion roar in the forest, when he hath no prey?

will a young lion cry out of his den, if he have taken nothing?

Amo 3:5 Can a bird fall in a snare upon the earth, where no gin [bait] is for him? shall one take up a snare [trap] from the earth, and have taken nothing at all?

Amo 3:6 Shall a trumpet be blown in the city, and the people not be afraid?

shall there be evil in a city, and the LORD hath not done it?

Amo 3:7

Surely the LORD God will do nothing, but [unless] he revealeth his secret unto his servants the prophets. Amo 3:8 The lion hath roared, who will not fear? the LORD God hath spoken, who can but prophesy?

Amo 3:9 Publish in the palaces at Ashdod, and in the palaces in the land of Egypt, and say,

Assemble yourselves upon the mountains of Samaria,

and behold the great tumults in the midst thereof, and the **oppressed** in the midst thereof.

Amo 3:10 For they know not to do right, saith the LORD,

who store up violence and robbery in their palaces.

Amo 3:11 Therefore thus saith the LORD God;

An adversary *there shall be* even round about the land; and he shall bring down thy strength from thee, and thy palaces shall be spoiled.

(Note: referring to impending takeover by the Assyrian empire)

Amo 3:12 Thus saith the LORD;

As the shepherd taketh out of the mouth of the lion two legs, or a piece of an ear; so shall **the children**

- of Israel be taken out that dwell in Samaria in the corner of a bed, and
- in Damascus in a couch.

Judgment on Bethel

Amo 3:13

Hear ye, and testify in the house of Jacob, saith the LORD God, the God of hosts,

Amo 3:14 That in the day that I shall visit the transgressions of Israel upon him

I will also visit the altars of **Bethel**:

and the horns of the altar shall be cut off, and fall to the ground.

Amo 3:15 And I will smite the winter house with the summer house;

and the houses of ivory shall perish,

and the great houses shall have an end,

saith the LORD.

Note: Bethel was a shared border city between Judah and Israel.

Amo 4:1

Hear this word, ye kine [cows] of **Bashan**, that *are* in the mountain of **Samaria**,

which oppress the poor, which crush the needy,

which say to their masters, Bring, and let us drink.

Note: The "cows of **Bashan**" is a metaphor for the wives of the princes and officers.

Amo 4:2 The LORD God hath sworn by his holiness,

that, lo, the days shall come upon you,

that he will take you away with **hooks**, and your posterity with **fishhooks**. Amo 4:3 And ye shall go out at the breaches, every *cow at that which is* before her; and ye shall cast *them* into the palace,

saith the LORD.

Amo 4:4 Come to **Bethel**, and transgress; (**Note:** located on the border of **Israel** and **Judah** where **Jeroboam** built his southern temple to the golden calf - I Kings 12:25-33 - Source:http://www.davelivingston.com/bethel14.htm) at **Gilgal** multiply transgression; (**Note:** Scholars speculate it's location)

Amo 4:5 And offer a sacrifice of thanksgiving with leaven, and proclaim and publish the free offerings: for this liketh you, O ye **children of Israel**, saith the LORD God.

Punishments did not result in repentance for Israel

Amo 4:6 And I also have given you cleanness of teeth in all your cities, and want of bread in all your places:

yet have ye not returned unto me, saith the LORD.

Amo 4:7 And also I have withholden the rain from you, when there were yet three months to the harvest: and I caused it to rain upon one city, and caused it not to rain upon another city: one piece was rained upon, and the piece whereupon it rained not withered.

Amo 4:8 So two or three cities wandered unto one city, to drink water; but they were not satisfied:

vet have ve not returned unto me, saith the LORD.

Amo 4:9 I have smitten you with blasting [scorching wind] and mildew:

when your gardens and your vineyards and your fig trees and your olive trees increased, the palmerworm devoured them:

yet have ye not returned unto me, saith the LORD.

Amo 4:10 I have sent among you the pestilence after the manner of Egypt: your young men have I slain with the sword, and have taken away your horses; and I have made the stink of your camps to come up unto your nostrils:

yet have ye not returned unto me, saith the LORD.

Amo 4:11 I have overthrown some of you, as God overthrew **Sodom** and **Gomorrah**, and ye were as a firebrand plucked out of the burning:

vet have ve not returned unto me, saith the LORD.

Amo 4:12 Therefore thus will I do unto thee, O Israel: and because I will do this unto thee, prepare to meet thy God, O Israel.

Amo 4:13

For, lo, he

- that formeth the mountains, and createth the wind,
- and declareth unto man what is his thought,
- that maketh the morning darkness,
- and treadeth upon the high places of the earth,

The LORD, The God of hosts, is his name.

Amo 5:1

Hear ye this word which I take up against you, *even* a lamentation, O house of Israel.

Amo 5:2 The virgin of **Israel** is fallen; she shall no more rise: she is forsaken upon her land; *there is* none to raise her up.

Amo 5:3 For thus saith the LORD God;

The city that went out by a thousand shall leave an hundred, and that which went forth by an hundred shall leave ten, to **the house of Israel**.

Amo 5:4 For thus saith the LORD unto the house of Israel, Seek ye me, and ye shall live:

Amo 5:7 Ye who turn judgment to wormwood,

and leave off righteousness in the earth,

Amo 5:8 Seek him

- that maketh the seven stars and Orion,
- and turneth the shadow of death into the morning,
- and maketh the day dark with night:
- that calleth for the waters of the sea, and poureth them out upon the face of the earth:

The LORD is his name:

Amo 5:9 That strengtheneth the spoiled against the strong, so that the spoiled [destruction] shall come against the fortress.

Amo 5:10 They hate **him** that rebuketh in the gate, and they abhor **him** that speaketh uprightly.

Amo 5:11 Forasmuch therefore

as your treading *is* [you impose heavy rent] upon the poor, and ye take from him burdens [tributes] of wheat:

ye have built houses of hewn stone, but ye shall not dwell in them; ye have planted pleasant vineyards, but ye shall not drink wine of them.

Amo 5:12 For I know your manifold transgressions and your mighty sins: they **afflict the just**, they **take a bribe**, and they **turn aside the poor** in the gate *from their right*.

Therefore the LORD, the God of hosts, the LORD, saith thus;

and they shall call the husbandman to mourning, and such as are skilful of lamentation to wailing.

Amo 5:17 And in all vineyards shall be wailing:

for I will pass through thee, (Note: In Exodus, the Angel of Death purging out the first born of Egypt)

saith the LORD.

Israel to go into exile beyond Damascus and the reasons why

Amo 5:18 Woe unto you that desire the day of the LORD!

to what end is it for you?

the day of the LORD is darkness, and not light.

Amo 5:19 As if a man did flee from a lion, and a bear met him;

or went into the house, and leaned his hand on the wall, and a serpent bit him.

Amo 5:20 Shall not the day of the LORD be darkness, and not light?

even very dark, and no brightness in it?

Amo 5:21 I hate, I despise your feast days,

and I will not smell in your solemn assemblies.

Amo 5:22 Though ye offer me burnt offerings and your meat [grain] offerings, I will not accept them: neither will I regard the **peace offerings** of your fat beasts.

Amo 5:23 Take thou away from me the noise of thy songs; for I will not hear the melody of thy viols.

Amo 5:24 But let judgment run down as waters, and righteousness as a mighty stream.

Amo 5:25 Have ye offered unto me sacrifices and offerings in the wilderness forty years, O house of Israel?

Amo 5:26 But ye have borne the tabernacle of your Moloch and Chiun your images,

(Note: New American Standard version has the gods named Sikkuth and Kiyyun)

(Note Acts 7:43 'YOU ALSO TOOK ALONG THE TABERNACLE OF MOLOCH AND THE STAR OF THE GOD ROMPHA, THE IMAGES WHICH YOU MADE TO WORSHIP THEM. I ALSO WILL REMOVE YOU BEYOND BABYLON.')

the star of your god, which ye made to yourselves.

(Note: referring to the planet Saturn)

Amo 5:27 Therefore will I cause you to go into captivity beyond **Damascus**, saith the LORD, whose name is The God of hosts.

Amo 6:1

Woe to them *that are* at ease in **Zion**, (Note: Assyria lays siege to Jerusalem but does not overtake it) and trust in the mountain of **Samaria**,

which are named chief of the nations,

to whom the house of Israel came!

Amo 6:2 Pass ye unto Calneh, and see; (Note:Gen 10:10 And the beginning of his (Nimrod's) kingdom was Babel and Erech and Accad and Calneh, in the land of Shinar.)

and from thence go ye to Hamath the great: (Note: Hama (Arabic: Amail [ha'ma:], Biblical Ḥamāth, "fortress") is a city on the banks of the Orontes River in west-central Syria. It is located 213 kilometres (132 mi) north of Damascus. Source: Wikipedia)

Amo 6:3 Ye that put far away the evil day [the day of calamity].

and cause the seat of violence to come near;

Amo 6:4 That lie upon beds of ivory, and stretch themselves upon their couches,

and eat the lambs out of the flock, and the calves out of the midst of the stall;

Amo 6:5 That chant to the sound of the viol [harp], and invent to themselves instruments of musick, like David;

Amo 6:6 That drink wine in bowls, and anoint themselves with the chief ointments:

but they are not grieved for the affliction of Joseph. (Note: the half-tribes Ephriam and Manasseh)

Amo 6:7 Therefore now shall they go **captive** with the first that go captive, and the banquet of them that stretched themselves shall be removed.

Then shall he say, Hold thy tongue: for we may not make mention of the name of the LORD.

Brief summary of Zechariah's life

2Ki 15:8 In the thirty and eighth year of Azariah king of Judah

did Zachariah the son of Jeroboam reign over Israel in Samaria six months.

2Ki 15:9 And he did that which was evil in the sight of the LORD, as his fathers had done: he departed not from the sins of **Jeroboam** the son of Nebat, who made **Israel** to sin.

Transfer of power from Zechariah to Shallum by conspiracy

2Ki 15:10 And Shallum the son of Jabesh conspired against him, and smote him before the people, and slew him, and reigned in his stead.

More records of Zechariah king of Israel

2Ki 15:11 And the rest of the acts of Zachariah, behold, they are written in the book of the chronicles of the kings of Israel.

Note: Not the 1,2 Chronicles in the Bible but it is recommended reading (if you can find it).

Prophecy fulfilled regarding fourth generation of Jehu's offspring being king of Israel

2Ki 15:12 This was the word of the LORD which he spake unto Jehu, saying,

Thy sons shall sit on the throne of **Israel** unto the fourth generation. And so it came to pass.

Shallum, wicked king of Israel for only one month In brief parallel reign with Azariah (Uzziah)

Brief summary of Shallum's life

2Ki 15:13 **Shallum the son of Jabesh** began to reign in the nine and thirtieth year of Uzziah king of Judah; and he reigned a full month in **Samaria**.

Transfer of power from Shallum to Menahem by conspiracy

2Ki 15:14 For Menahem the son of Gadi went up from Tirzah, and came to Samaria, and smote Shallum the son of Jabesh in Samaria, and slew him, and reigned in his stead.

More records of Shallum brief king of Israel

2Ki 15:15 Now the rest of the acts of **Shallum** and his conspiracy which he made, behold they are written in **the book of the chronicles of the kings of Israel**.

Note: Not the 1,2 Chronicles in the Bible but it is recommended reading (if you can find it).

The vision of Isaiah the son of Amoz, which he saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem in the days of Uzziah, Jotham, Ahaz, *and* Hezekiah, kings of Judah.

Note: Here we cover what was likely prophesied during Uzziah's reign

Jerusalem in ruins because of their own wickedness

Isa 1:2 Hear, O heavens, and give ear, O earth: for the LORD hath spoken, I have nourished and brought up children, and they have rebelled against me.

Isa 1:3 The ox knoweth his owner, and the ass his master's crib: but Israel doth not know, my people doth not consider.

Isa 1:4 Ah sinful nation,
a people laden with iniquity,
a seed of evildoers,
children that are corrupters:
they have forsaken the LORD,
they have provoked the Holy One of Israel unto anger,
they are gone away backward.
Isa 1:5 Why should ye be stricken any more? ye will revolt more and more:

the whole head is sick, and the whole heart faint.

Isa 1:6 From the sole of the foot even unto the head *there is* no soundness in it; *but* wounds, and bruises, and putrifying sores: they have not been closed, neither bound up, neither mollified with ointment.

Isa 1:7 Your country *is* desolate, your cities *are* burned with fire: your land, strangers devour it in your presence, and *it is* desolate, as overthrown by strangers.

Isa 1:8 And the **daughter of Zion** is left as a cottage in a vineyard, as a lodge in a garden of cucumbers, as a besieged city.

Isa 1:9 Except the LORD of hosts had left unto us a very small remnant, we should have been as **Sodom**, *and* we should have been like unto **Gomorrah**.

Isa 1:10 Hear the word of the LORD, ye rulers of **Sodom**; give ear unto **the law** of our God, ye people of **Gomorrah**.

Sacrifices and offerings worthless when the heart of man is rebellious

Isa 1:11 To what purpose *is* the multitude of your **sacrifices** unto me? **saith** the LORD: I am full of the **burnt offerings** of rams, and the fat of fed beasts; and I delight not in the blood of bullocks, or of lambs, or of he goats. Isa 1:12 When ye come to appear before me, who hath required this at your hand, to tread my courts?

Isa 1:13 Bring no more vain oblations;

incense is an abomination unto me;

the new moons and sabbaths, the calling of assemblies,

I cannot away with [endure it]; it is iniquity, even the solemn meeting.

Isa 1:14 Your new moons and your appointed feasts my soul hateth:

they are a trouble unto me; I am weary to bear them.

Isa 1:15 And when ye spread forth your hands, I will hide mine eyes from you:

yea, when ye make many prayers, I will not hear:

your hands are full of blood.

What the LORD wants

Isa 1:16 Wash you, make you clean;

put away the evil of your doings from before mine eyes;

cease to do evil;

Isa 1:17 Learn to do well;

seek judgment [justice],

relieve the oppressed, [Reprove the ruthless (NASV)]

judge [defend] the fatherless,

plead for the widow.

Isa 1:18 Come now, and let us reason together, saith the LORD:

though your sins be as scarlet, they shall be as white as snow;

though they be red like crimson, they shall be as wool.

Isa 1:19 **If** ye be willing and obedient, ye shall eat the good of the land:

Isa 1:20 But if ye refuse and rebel, ye shall be devoured with the sword:

for the mouth of the LORD hath spoken it.

Jerusalem perverts Justice

After the LORD purges Jerusalem of the unrepentant

Isa 1:26 And I will restore thy judges as at the first, and thy counsellors as at the beginning: afterward thou shalt be called, The city of righteousness, the faithful city.

Isa 1:27 **Zion** shall be redeemed with judgment, and her converts with righteousness.

Penalty for the rebellious

Isa 1:28 And the destruction of the transgressors and of the sinners *shall be* together, and they that forsake the LORD shall be consumed.

Isa 1:29 For they shall be ashamed of the oaks which ye have desired,

and ye shall be confounded for the gardens that ye have chosen.

Isa 1:30 For ye shall be as an oak whose leaf fadeth, and as a garden that hath no water.

and they shall both burn together, and none shall quench them.

A righteous **Jerusalem** in the last days - Nations will flock to it to receive instruction directly from the LORD

- shall be established in the top of the mountains,
- and shall be exalted above the hills;

to the house of the God of Jacob:

and he will teach us of his ways, and we will walk in his paths:

the judge, and the prophet,

and the prudent, and the ancient,

Isa 3:3 The captain of fifty,

and the honourable man,

and the counsellor,

and the cunning artificer,

and the eloquent orator.

Isa 3:4 And I will give children to be their princes,

and babes [capricious children] (note: whimsical, impulsive, unpredictable) shall rule over them.

Isa 3:5 And the people shall be oppressed,

every one by another, and every one by his neighbour:

the child shall behave himself proudly against the ancient,

and the base against the honourable.

Isa 3:6 When a man shall take hold of his brother of the house of his father, saying,

Thou hast clothing, be thou our ruler,

and let this ruin be under thy hand:

2Ch 26:18 And they withstood Uzziah the king, and said unto him, *It appertaineth* not unto thee, Uzziah, to burn incense unto the LORD, but to the priests the sons of Aaron, that are consecrated to burn incense: go out of the sanctuary; for thou hast trespassed; neither *shall it be* for thine honour from the LORD God.

Note: According to God's authority structure the Godly Priests and Prophets have authority over Kings and Government Officials. When people elect to worship other gods (or mix their worship of other gods with God) then they follow priests and prophets who practice Witchcraft behind the scenes. Most people are not aware that today all over the world the hidden perverted authority structure (known by some as the shadow government) is:

Witches (Priestesses) and Wizards (Enforcers) >> Illuminati (formed May 1, 1776) >> Freemasonry, Vatican

Global Corporations: World banks, Centralized Banks, Large Companies, Military Industrial Complex

for she gathered it of the hire of an harlot,

and they shall return to the hire of an harlot.

Jotham rules during Uzziah's leprosy

2Ki 15:5 And the LORD smote the king,

2Ch 26:19 Then Uzziah was wroth, and *had* a censer in his hand to burn incense: and while he was wroth with the priests, the leprosy even rose up in his forehead before the priests in the house of the LORD, from beside the incense altar.

so that he was a leper unto the day of his death, and dwelt in a several house.

2Ch 26:20 And Azariah the chief priest, and all the priests, looked upon him, and, behold, he was leprous in his forehead, and they thrust him out from thence; yea, himself hasted also to go out, because the LORD had smitten him.

2Ch 26:21 And Uzziah the king was a leper unto the day of his death, and dwelt in a several house, *being* a leper; for he was cut off from the house of the LORD:

And **Jotham the king's son** *was* over the house, judging the people of the land.

and **Jotham his son** *was* over the king's house, judging the people of the land.

Mic 1:8 Therefore I will wail and howl,

I will go stripped and naked:

I will make a wailing like the dragons,

and mourning as the owls.

From Josephus, Antiquities of the Jews, Book 9, Chapter 10, Paragraph 4

In the mean time a great earthquake shook the ground and a rent was made in the temple,

and the bright rays of the sun shone through it, and fell upon the king's face, insomuch that the leprosy seized upon him immediately.

And before the city, at a place called Eroge, half the mountain broke off from the rest on the west, and rolled itself four furlongs, and stood still at the east mountain, till the roads, as well as the king's gardens, were spoiled by the obstruction.

Now, as soon as the priests saw that the king's face was infected with the leprosy, they told him of the calamity he was under, and commanded that he should go out of the city as a polluted person. Hereupon he was so confounded at the sad distemper, and sensible that he was not at liberty to contradict, that he did as he was commanded, and underwent this miserable and terrible punishment for an intention beyond what befitted a man to have, and for that impiety against God which was implied therein.

So he abode out of the city for some time, and lived a private life, while his son **Jotham** took the government; after which he died with grief and anxiety at what had happened to him, when he had lived sixty- eight years, and reigned of them fifty-two; and was buried by himself in his own gardens.

Menahem, wicked king of Israel by killing Shallum

In parallel reign with Jotham, co-regent with Azariah/Uzziah king of Judah

Brief summary of Menahem's life

2Ki 15:17 In the nine and thirtieth year of Azariah king of Judah began Menahem the son of Gadi to reign over Israel,

- and reigned ten years in Samaria.
- 2Ki 15:18 And he did that which was evil in the sight of the LORD: he departed not all his days from the sins of **Jeroboam the son of Nebat**, who made **Israel** to sin.

Details of Menahem's wickedness

2Ki 15:16 Then **Menahem** smote **Tiphsah**, and all that *were* therein, and the coasts thereof from **Tirzah**: because they opened not *to him*, therefore he smote *it*; and all the women therein that were with child he ripped up.

Places involved in the exile to come

Mic 1:9 For her wound is incurable;

for it is come unto **Judah**;

he is come unto the gate of my people, even to Jerusalem.

Mic 1:10 Declare ye it not at Gath, (Note: a fortified city of the Philistines)

weep ye not at all:

in the house of Aphrah roll thyself in the dust.

Mic 1:11 Pass ye away, thou inhabitant of **Saphir**, having thy shame naked:

the inhabitant of Zaanan came not forth in the mourning of Bethezel; he shall receive of you his standing.

Mic 1:12 For the inhabitant of **Maroth** waited carefully for good:

but evil came down from the LORD unto the gate of Jerusalem.

Mic 1:13 O thou inhabitant of Lachish, bind the chariot to the swift beast: s

he is the beginning of the sin to the **daughter of Zion**:

for the transgressions of Israel were found in thee.

Mic 1:14 Therefore shalt thou give presents to **Moreshethgath**:

the houses of Achzib shall be a lie to the kings of Israel.

Mic 1:15 Yet will I bring an heir unto thee, O inhabitant of Mareshah:

he shall come unto Adullam the glory of Israel.

Mic 1:16 Make thee bald, and poll thee for thy delicate children;

enlarge thy baldness as the eagle;

for they are gone into captivity from thee.

A Vineyard Analogy

Isa 5:1 Now will I sing to my wellbeloved a song of my beloved touching his vineyard.

My wellbeloved hath a vineyard in a very fruitful hill:

Isa 5:2 And he fenced it, and gathered out the stones thereof,

and planted it with the choicest vine.

and built a tower in the midst of it,

and also made a winepress therein:

and he looked that it should bring forth grapes, and it brought forth wild grapes.

Isa 5:3 And now, O inhabitants of Jerusalem, and men of Judah, judge, I pray you, betwixt me and my vineyard.

Isa 5:7 For the vineyard of the LORD of hosts is the house of Israel, and the men of Judah his pleasant plant:

and he looked for judgment, but behold oppression [slaughter]; for righteousness, but behold a cry [of distress].

Isa 5:8 Woe unto them that join house to house, *that* lay field to field, till *there be* no place, that they may be placed alone in the midst of the earth!

ye pull off the robe with the garment from them that pass by securely as men averse [returned] from war. Mic 2:9 The women of my people have ye cast out from their pleasant houses; from their children have ye taken away my glory for ever.

because it is polluted, it shall destroy you, even with a sore destruction.

Pekahiah the son of Menahem began to reign over Israel in Samaria,

- and reigned two years.

Transfer of power from Pekahiah to Pekah by conspiracy

2Ki 15:25 But **Pekah the son of Remaliah**, a captain of his, conspired against him, and smote him in **Samaria**, in the palace of the king's house, with Argob and Arieh, and with him fifty men of the **Gileadites**: and he killed him, and reigned in his room.

More records of Pekahiah king of Israel

Now when **Zachariah**, the son of **Jeroboam**, had reigned **six months** over **Israel**, he was slain by the treachery of a certain friend of his, whose name was

Shallum, the son of Jabesh, who took the kingdom afterward, but kept it no longer than thirty days;

for **Menahem**, the general of his army, who was at that time in the city **Tirzah**, and heard of what had befallen **Zachariah**, removed thereupon with all his forces to **Samaria**, and joining battle with **Shallum**, slew him; and when he had made himself king,

he went thence, and came to the city **Tiphsah**; but the citizens that were in it shut their gates, and barred them against the king, and would not admit him:

but in order to be avenged on them.

he burnt the country round about it,

and took the city by force, upon a siege; and being very much displeased at what the inhabitants of Tiphsah had done.

- he slew them all,
- and spared not so much as the infants,
- without omitting the utmost instances of cruelty and barbarity;

for he used such severity upon his own countrymen, as would not be pardonable with regard to strangers who had been conquered by him.

And after this manner it was that this **Menahem** continued to reign with cruelty and barbarity for ten years.

But when **Pul**, **king of Assyria**, had made an expedition against him, he did not think meet to fight or engage in battle with the **Assyrians**, <u>but he persuaded him to accept of a thousand talents of silver</u>, and to go away, and so put an end to the war.

This sum the multitude collected for **Menahem**, by exacting fifty drachme as poll-money for every head;

after which he died, and was buried in **Samaria**, and left his son **Pekahiah** his successor in the kingdom, **who followed the barbarity of his father**, and so **ruled but two years only**, after which he was slain with his friends at a feast, by the treachery of one **Pekah**, the general of his horse, and the son of Remaliah, who laid snares for him.

Now this **Pekah** held the government **twenty years**, and proved a wicked man and a transgressor.

But the king of Assyria, whose name was Tiglath-Pileser, when he had made an expedition against the Israelites, and had overrun all the land of Gilead, and the region beyond Jordan, and the adjoining country, which is called Galilee, and Kadesh, and Hazor, he made the inhabitants prisoners, and transplanted them into his own kingdom.

- howbeit he entered not into the temple of the LORD. And the people did yet corruptly.
- 2Ch 27:3 He built the high gate of the house of the LORD,

God prospers Jotham because of his obedience

2Ch 27:3b and on the wall of Ophel he built much.

2Ch 27:4 Moreover he built cities in the mountains of Judah, and in the forests he built castles and towers.

2Ch 27:5 He fought also with the king of the Ammonites, and prevailed against them. And the children of

Ammon gave him the same year an hundred talents of silver, and ten thousand measures of wheat, and ten thousand of barley. So much did **the children of Ammon** pay unto him, both the second year, and the third.

Paragraph 3

Now there was at that time a prophet, whose name was Nahum, who spake after this manner concerning the overthrow of the Assyrians and of Nineveh:

"Nineveh shall be a pool of water in motion

so shall all her people be troubled, and tossed, and go away by flight,

while they say one to another, Stand, stand still, seize their gold and silver,

for there shall be no one to wish them well,

for they will rather save their lives than their money;

for a terrible contention shall possess them one with another,

and lamentation,

and loosing of the members,

and their countenances shall be perfectly black with fear.

And there will be the den of the lions, and the mother of the young lions!

God says to thee, Nineveh, that they shall deface thee,

and the lion shall no longer go out from thee to give laws to the world."

And indeed this prophet prophesied many other things besides these concerning **Nineveh**, which I do not think necessary to repeat, and I here omit them, that I may not appear troublesome to my readers; **all which thing happened about Nineveh a hundred and fifteen years afterward:** so this may suffice to have spoken of these matters.

and thorns: but it shall be for the sending forth of oxen, and for the treading of lesser cattle.

From Josephus, Antiquities of the Jews, Book 9, Chapter 12, Paragraph 1

...and when the king of Syria [Aram] had taken the city Elath, upon the Red Sea, and had slain the

Ahaz's disbelief nullifies Isaiah's promise

2Ch 28:5a Wherefore the LORD his God delivered him into the hand of the king of Syria [Aram]; and they

inhabitants, he peopled it with Syrians;

and when he had slain those in the [other] garrisons, and the Jews in their neighborhood, and had driven away much prey, he returned with his army back to **Damascus**.

Now when **the king of Jerusalem** knew that the **Syrians** were returned home, **he**, supposing himself a match for **the king of Israel**, drew out his army against **him**, and joining battle with **him** was beaten;

and this happened because God was angry with him, on account of his many and great enormities.

Accordingly there were slain by **the Israelites** one hundred and twenty thousand of his men that day, whose general, Amaziah by name, slew

- Zechariah the king's son, in his conflict with Ahaz.
- as well as **the governor** of the kingdom, whose name was **Azricam**.

He also carried Elkanah, the general of the troops of the tribe of Judah, into captivity.

They also carried the women and children of the **tribe of Benjamin** captives;

and when they had gotten a great deal of prey, they returned to **Samaria**.

smote him, and carried away a great multitude of them captives, and brought *them* to **Damascus**.

2Ch 28:5b And he was also delivered into the hand of **the king of Israel**, who smote him with a great slaughter.

2Ch 28:6 For **Pekah the son of Remaliah** slew in **Judah** an hundred and twenty thousand in one day, *which were* all valiant men; because they had forsaken the LORD God of their fathers.

2Ch 28:7 And Zichri, a mighty man of Ephraim, slew

- Maaseiah the king's son,
- and Azrikam the governor of the house,
- and Elkanah that was next to the king.

2Ch 28:8 And the children of Israel carried away captive of their brethren two hundred thousand, women, sons, and daughters,

and took also away much spoil from them, and brought the spoil to **Samaria**.

God rebukes the army of Israel through the prophet Obed for making slaves from the people of Judah and Jerusalem

2Ch 28:9 But a prophet of the LORD was there, whose name was Oded: and he went out before [to] the host that came to Samaria, and said unto them,

Behold, because the LORD God of your fathers was wroth with **Judah**, he hath delivered them into your hand, and **ye have slain them in a rage** that reacheth up unto heaven.

2Ch 28:10 And now ye purpose to keep under **the children of Judah and Jerusalem** for bondmen and bondwomen unto you: but are there not with you, even with you, sins against the LORD your God? 2Ch 28:11 Now hear me therefore, and deliver the captives again, which ye have taken captive of your brethren: for the fierce wrath of the LORD is upon you.

Israel listens to God's rebuke

2Ch 28:12 Then certain of the heads of the children of Ephraim,

- Azariah the son of Johanan,
- **Berechiah** the son of Meshillemoth,
- and Jehizkiah the son of Shallum,
- and **Amasa** the son of Hadlai,

stood up against them that came from the war,

2Ch 28:13 And said unto them, Ye shall not bring in the captives hither:

• for whereas we have offended against the LORD *already*, ye intend to add *more* to our sins and to our trespass:

• for our trespass is great, and *there is* fierce wrath against **Israel**.

2Ch 28:14 So the armed men left the captives and the spoil before the princes and all the congregation.

2Ch 28:15 And the men which were expressed by name rose up, and took the captives,

- and with the spoil clothed all that were naked among them,
- and arrayed them, and shod them,
- and gave them to eat and to drink,
- and anointed them,
- and carried all the feeble of them upon asses,
- and brought them to **Jericho**, the city of palm trees, to their brethren:

then they returned to Samaria.

The Prophecies of Hosea

Hos 14:9

Who *is* wise, and he shall understand these *things?*prudent, and he shall know them?
for the ways of the LORD *are* right, and the just shall walk in them:
but the transgressors shall fall therein.

Why Judgment comes to Israel

Oppression

Hos 4:1 Hear the word of the LORD, ye children of Israel: for the LORD hath a controversy with the inhabitants of the land, because *there is* no truth, nor mercy, nor knowledge of God in the land. Hos 4:2 By swearing, and lying, and killing, and stealing, and committing adultery, they break out, and blood toucheth blood.

Hos 4:3 Therefore shall the land mourn, and every one that dwelleth therein shall languish, with the beasts of the field, and with the fowls of heaven; yea, the fishes of the sea also shall be taken away.

Contention, Scoffing, Rejecting the knowledge and law of God

Hos 4:4 Yet let no man strive, nor reprove another: for thy people are as they that strive with the priest. Hos 4:5 Therefore shalt thou fall in the day, and the prophet also shall fall with thee in the night, and I will destroy thy mother.

Hos 4:6 My people are destroyed for lack of knowledge:

- **because** thou hast rejected knowledge, I will also reject thee, that thou shalt be no priest to me:
- **seeing** thou hast forgotten the law of thy God, I will also forget thy children.
- Hos 4:7 As they were increased, so they sinned against me: *therefore* will I change their glory into shame
- Hos 4:8 They eat up [feed on] the sin of my people, and they set their heart on their iniquity.

Hos 4:9 And there shall be, like people, like priest:

- and I will punish them for their ways,
- and reward them their doings.
- Hos 4:10 For they shall eat, and not have enough:
- they shall commit whor**Edom**, and shall not increase:

because they have left off to take [stopped giving] heed to the LORD.

Hos 4:11 Whoredom and wine and new wine take away the heart.

Witchcraft - Idolotry - Prostitution

Hos 4:12 My people ask counsel at their stocks [wooden idols], and their staff [diviner's wand] declareth unto them:

for the **spirit of whorEdoms** hath caused them to err,

and they have gone a whoring from under their God.

Hos 4:13 They sacrifice upon the tops of the mountains, (Note: including human sacrifices)

and burn incense upon the hills, (Note: Three things necessary for a witch to cast a spell- incense, astrology, talisman jewelry)

under oaks and poplars and elms, because the shadow thereof is good:

therefore your daughters shall commit whor**Edom**, and your spouses shall commit adultery.

The men of Israel are guilty of making their women become harlots

Hos 4:14 I will not punish your daughters when they commit whor Edom,

nor your spouses when they commit adultery:

for themselves [the men] are separated with whores,

and they sacrifice with harlots:

therefore the people that doth not understand shall fall.

Hos 4:15 Though thou, Israel, play the harlot,

yet let not Judah offend;

and come not ye unto Gilgal,

neither go ye up to **Bethaven**,

nor swear. The LORD liveth.

Hos 4:16 For Israel slideth back as a backsliding heifer:

now the LORD will feed them as a lamb in a large place.

Hos 4:17 **Ephraim** *is* **joined to idols:** let him alone. Hos 4:18 Their drink is sour:

they have committed whor**Edom** continually:

her rulers with shame do love, Give ye.

Hos 4:19 The wind hath bound her up in her wings,

and they shall be ashamed because of their sacrifices.

Israel caused Judah to stumble

Note: When **Israel** split into two kingdoms the tribe of **Ephraim** led the revolt (10 tribes to the north; **Judah** and a remnant of **Benjamin** per God's prior judgment became the southern kingdom.

Being a snare to others

Hos 5:1 Hear ye this, O priests; and hearken, ve house of Israel;

and give ye ear, O house of the king;

for judgment is toward you,

because ye have been a snare on Mizpah,

and a net spread upon Tabor.

Hos 5:2 And the revolters have gone deep in depravity, But I will chastise all of them. (NASV)

Hos 5:2 And the revolters are profound to make slaughter, though I *have been* a rebuker of them all. (KJV)

Spiritual Harlotry

Hos 5:3 I know Ephraim, and Israel is not hid from me: for now,

O Ephraim, thou committest whorEdom,

and Israel is defiled.

Hos 5:4 They will not frame their doings to turn unto their God:

for the spirit of whorEdoms is in the midst of them,

and they have not known the LORD.

Hos 5:5 And the pride of **Israel** doth testify to his face [against him]:

therefore shall Israel and Ephraim fall in their iniquity;

Judah also shall fall with them.

Hos 5:6 They shall go with their flocks and with their herds to seek the LORD;

but they shall not find him;

he hath withdrawn himself from them.

Hos 5:7 They have dealt treacherously against the LORD:

for they have begotten strange [pagan] children:

now shall a month devour them with their portions.

Assyrian Invasion Coming

Hos 5:8 Blow ye the cornet in Gibeah,

and the trumpet in Ramah:

cry aloud at Bethaven, after thee, O Benjamin.

Hos 5:9 **Ephraim** shall be desolate in the day of rebuke:

among the tribes of Israel have I made known that which shall surely be.

Hos 5:10 The princes of Judah were like them that remove the bound:

therefore I will pour out my wrath upon them like water.

Hos 5:11 Ephraim is oppressed and broken in judgment,

because he willingly walked after the commandment.

Hos 5:12 Therefore will I be unto **Ephraim** as a moth,

and to the house of Judah as rottenness.

Seeking help from Assyria against enemies proves pointless

Hos 5:13 When Ephraim saw his sickness, and Judah saw his wound,

then went **Ephraim** to the Assyrian, and sent to king Jareb: (Note: An event yet to occur) yet could he not heal you, nor cure you of your wound.

Note: Assyria had multiple kings ruling multiple provinces at the same time. And some were at war with each other.

Hos 5:14 For I will be unto **Ephraim** as a lion,

and as a young lion to the house of **Judah**:

I, even I, will tear and go away;

I will take away, and none shall rescue him.

Hos 5:15 I will go and return to my place,

till they acknowledge their offence, and seek my face:

in their affliction they will seek me early.

Hos 6:1

Come, and let us return unto the LORD:

for he hath torn, and he will heal us; he hath smitten, and he will bind us up.

Hos 6:2 **After two days** will he revive us: **in the third day** he will raise us up, and we shall live in his sight.

Note:

1Co 15:3 For I delivered unto you first of all that which I also received, how that Christ died for our sins according to the scriptures;

1Co 15:4 And that he was buried, and that he rose again the third day according to the scriptures: (See the whole chapter) Mat 27:52 And the graves were opened; and many bodies of the saints which slept arose,

Mat 27:53 And came out of the graves after his resurrection, and went into the holy city, and appeared unto many.

Hos 6:3 Then shall we know, *if* we follow on to know the LORD: his going forth is prepared as the morning; and he shall come unto us as the rain, as the latter *and* former rain unto the earth.

Reasons for Judgment on Israel and Judah - continued

Ephraim's Fickle Loyalty

Hos 6:4 O **Ephraim**, what shall I do unto thee? O **Judah**, what shall I do unto thee?

for your goodness *is* as a morning cloud, and as the early dew it goeth away.

Hos 6:5 Therefore have I hewed *them* by the prophets;

I have slain them by the words of my mouth:

and thy judgments are as the light that goeth forth.

Hos 6:6 For I desired mercy, and not sacrifice;

and the knowledge of God more than burnt offerings.

Hos 6:7 But they like men have transgressed **the covenant**: there have they dealt treacherously against me.

Gilead's wickedness

Hos 6:8 Gilead is a city of them that work iniquity, and is polluted with blood.

Hos 6:9 And as troops of robbers wait for a man, so the company of priests murder in the way by consent: for they commit lewdness [H2154: crime].

When God intended to restore Israel and Judah He found instead:

Hos 6:10 I have seen an horrible thing in the house of Israel:

there is the whorEdom of Ephraim,

Israel is defiled.

Hos 6:11 Also, O Judah, he hath set an harvest for thee, when I returned the captivity of my people.

Government Sponsored Theft

Hos 7:1 When I would have healed Israel,

then the iniquity of **Ephraim** was discovered, and the wickedness of **Samaria**:

for they commit falsehood;

and the thief cometh in, and the troop of robbers spoileth without.

Hos 7:2 And they consider not in their hearts that I remember all their wickedness:

now their own doings have beset them about; they are before my face.

Hos 7:3 They make the king glad with their wickedness, and the princes with their lies.

Adultery

Hos 7:4 They are all adulterers, as an oven heated by the baker,

who ceaseth from raising after he hath kneaded the dough, until it be leavened.

Conspiracy, Assassination Plots

Hos 7:5 In the day of our king the princes have made him sick with bottles of wine;

he stretched out his hand with scorners.

Hos 7:6 For they have made ready their heart like an oven,

whiles they lie in wait: their baker sleepeth all the night;

in the morning it burneth as a flaming fire.

Hos 7:7 They are all hot as an oven, and have devoured their judges;

all their kings are fallen: there is none among them that calleth unto me.

Multiculturalism - Unholy alliances with other nations though unsuccessful

Hos 7:8 **Ephraim**, he hath mixed himself among the people;

Ephraim is a cake not turned.

Hos 7:9 Strangers have devoured his strength, and he knoweth it not: yea,

gray hairs are here and there upon him, yet he knoweth not.

Hos 7:10 And the pride of **Israel** testifieth to his face:

and they do not return to the LORD their God.

nor seek him for all this.

Hos 7:11a **Ephraim** also is like a silly dove without heart: ...

Israel's attempts at unholy alliances with Egypt and Assyria to prove useless

Hos 7:11b they call to **Egypt**, they go to Assyria.

Hos 7:12 When they shall go, I will spread my net upon them; I will bring them down as the fowls of the heaven; I will chastise them, as their congregation hath heard.

Hos 7:13 Woe unto them! for they have fled from me: destruction unto them! because they have transgressed against me:

though I have redeemed them, yet they have spoken lies against me.

Hos 7:14 And they have not cried unto me with their heart, when they howled upon their beds: they assemble themselves for corn and wine, and they rebel against me.

Hos 7:15 Though I have bound and strengthened their arms, yet do they imagine mischief against me.

Hos 7:16 They return, but not to the most High: they are like a deceitful bow:

their princes shall fall by the sword for the rage of their tongue: this shall be their derision in the land of Egypt.

Under Seige by Assyria

Hos 8:1 *Set* the trumpet to thy mouth.

He shall come as an eagle against the house of the LORD,

because they have transgressed my covenant, and trespassed against my law.

Hos 8:2 Israel shall cry unto me, My God, we know thee.

Hos 8:3 **Israel** hath cast off the thing that is good: the enemy shall pursue him.

Desiring any ruler but God

Hos 8:4 They have set up kings, but not by me: they have made princes, and I knew it not: of their silver and their gold have they made them idols, that they may be cut off.

Judgment on Samaria's Golden Calf

Hos 8:5 Thy calf, O **Samaria**, hath cast *thee* off; mine anger is kindled against them: how long *will it be* ere they attain to innocency?

Hos 8:6 For from Israel was it also:

the workman made it; therefore it is not God: but the calf of **Samaria** shall be broken in pieces.

Hos 8:7 For they have sown the wind, and they shall reap the whirlwind:

it hath no stalk: the bud shall yield no meal: if so be it yield, the strangers shall swallow it up.

Hos 8:8 **Israel** is swallowed up:

now shall they be among the **Gentiles** as a vessel wherein is no pleasure.

Hos 8:9 For they are gone up to Assyria, a wild ass alone by himself:

Ephraim hath hired lovers.

Hos 8:10 Yea, though they have hired among the nations, now will I gather them, and they shall sorrow a little for the burden of the king of princes.

Altars for Idols

Hos 8:11 Because Ephraim hath made many altars to sin,

• altars shall be unto him to sin.

Hos 8:12 I have written to him the great things of my law,

• but they were counted as a strange thing.

Perversion of God's altar

Hos 8:13 They sacrifice flesh *for* the sacrifices of **mine offerings**, and eat *it;* but the LORD accepteth them not;

now will he remember their iniquity, and visit their sins:

they shall return to **Egypt**.

Hos 8:14 For **Israel** hath forgotten his Maker, and buildeth temples; and **Judah** hath multiplied fenced cities:

but I will send a fire upon his cities, and it shall devour the palaces thereof.

Fornication

Hos 9:1 Rejoice not, O **Israel**, for joy, as *other* people: for thou hast gone a whoring from thy God, thou hast loved a reward upon every cornfloor.

Contaminated Offerings will not enter The house of the LORD

Hos 9:2 The floor and the winepress shall not feed them, and the new wine shall fail in her.
Hos 9:3 They shall not dwell in the LORD'S land;

but **Ephraim** shall return to **Egypt**, and they shall eat unclean *things* in **Assyria**.

and they shall eat unclean things in Assyria.

Hos 9:4 They shall not offer wine *offerings* to the LORD, neither shall they be pleasing unto him:

their sacrifices *shall be* unto them as the bread of mourners; all that eat thereof shall be polluted: for their bread for their soul shall not come into **the house of the LORD**.

Hos 9:5 What will ye do in the solemn day, and in the day of the feast of the LORD?

Fleeing to Egypt cont'

Hos 9:6 For, lo, they are gone because of destruction: Egypt shall gather them up,

Memphis shall bury them:

the pleasant *places* for their silver, nettles shall possess them: thorns *shall be* in their tabernacles.

Hos 9:7a The days of visitation [punishment] are come, the days of recompence are come;

Israel shall know it:

Israel's Wickedness con't

Hos 9:7b the **prophet** is a fool, the **spiritual man** is mad,

for the multitude of thine iniquity, and the great hatred.

Hos 9:8 The watchman of **Ephraim** was with my God:

but the prophet is a snare of a fowler in all his ways,

and hatred in the house of his God.

Hos 9:9 They have deeply corrupted *themselves*, as in the days of **Gibeah**:

therefore he will remember their iniquity, he will visit their sins.

THE WILL WISH SING.

Hos 9:10 I found Israel like grapes in the wilderness;

I saw your fathers as the firstripe in the fig tree at her first time:

but they went to **Baalpeor**, and separated themselves unto that shame; and their abominations were according as they loved.

Judgment - Ephraim's children slain and aborted

Hos 9:11 As for **Ephraim**, their glory shall fly away like a bird,

from the birth, and from the womb, and from the conception.

Hos 9:12 **Though they bring up their children,** yet will I bereave them,

that there shall not be a man left: yea,

woe also to them when I depart from them!

Hos 9:13 **Ephraim**, as I saw **Tyrus** [**Tyre**], is planted in a pleasant place:

but **Ephraim** shall bring forth his children to the murderer.

Hos 9:14 Give them, O LORD: what wilt thou give?

give them a miscarrying womb and dry breasts.

Hos 9:15 All their wickedness is in Gilgal:

for there I hated them:

for the wickedness of their doings I will drive them out of mine house,

I will love them no more:

all their princes are revolters.

Hos 9:16 **Ephraim** is smitten, their root is dried up,

they shall bear no fruit: yea,

though they bring forth, yet will I slay even the beloved fruit of their womb.

Hos 9:17 My God will cast them away, because they did not hearken unto him:

and they shall be wanderers among the nations.

Judgment on Israel as a whole

Hos 10:1 Israel is an empty vine,

he bringeth forth fruit unto himself:

according to the multitude of his fruit he hath increased the altars;

according to the goodness of his land they have made goodly images [sacred pillars, obelisks].

Hos 10:2 Their heart is divided:

now shall they be found faulty:

he shall break down their altars, he shall spoil their images [sacred pillars, obelisks].

Hos 10:3 For now they shall say,

We have no king, because we feared not the LORD;

what then should a king do to us?

Hos 10:4 They have spoken words,

swearing falsely in making a covenant:

thus judgment springeth up as hemlock [poisonous weeds] in the furrows of the field.

Hos 10:5 The inhabitants of **Samaria** shall fear because of the calves of **Bethaven**:

for the people thereof shall mourn over it,

and the {idolatrous} priests thereof that rejoiced on it,

for the glory thereof, because it is departed from it.

Hos 10:6 It shall be also carried unto Assyria for a present to king Jareb:

Ephraim shall receive shame,

and Israel shall be ashamed of his own counsel.

Hos 10:7 As for Samaria, her king is cut off

as the foam upon the water.

Hos 10:8 The high places also of Aven, the sin of Israel, shall be destroyed:

the thorn and the thistle shall come up on their altars;

nd they shall say to the mountains, Cover us; and to the hills, Fall on us.

Hos 10:9 O Israel, thou hast sinned from the days of Gibeah:

there they stood: the battle in Gibeah against the children of iniquity did not overtake them.

Hos 10:10 It is in my desire that I should chastise them;

and the people shall be gathered against them, when they shall bind themselves in their two furrows.

Hos 10:11 And Ephraim is as an heifer that is taught, and loveth to tread out the corn;

but I passed over upon her fair neck:

I will make **Ephraim** to ride;

Judah shall plow,

and Jacob shall break his clods.

Hos 10:12 Sow to yourselves in righteousness,

reap in mercy;

break up your fallow ground:

for it is time to seek the LORD, till he come and rain

righteousness upon you.

Hos 10:13 Ye have plowed wickedness, ye have reaped iniquity;

ye have eaten the fruit of lies:

because thou didst trust in thy way, in the multitude of thy mighty men.

Hos 10:14 Therefore shall a tumult arise among thy people,

and all thy fortresses shall be spoiled,

as Shalman spoiled Betharbel in the day of battle: the mother was dashed in pieces upon her children.

Hos 10:15 So shall **Bethel** do unto you because of your great wickedness:

in a morning shall the king of Israel utterly be cut off.

Hos 11:1 When Israel was a child, then I loved him,

and called my son out of Egypt. (Note similarity of Matthew 2:15 and its context)

Hos 11:2 As they called them, so they went from them:

they sacrificed unto Baalim, and burned incense to graven images.

Hos 11:3 I taught **Ephraim** also to go, taking them by their arms;

but they knew not that I healed them.

Hos 11:4 I drew them with cords of a man, with bands of love:

and I was to them as they that take off the yoke on their jaws,

and I laid meat unto them.

Hos 11:5 He shall not return into the land of Egypt, but the Assyrian shall be his king,

because they refused to return.

Hos 11:6 And the sword shall abide on his cities,

and shall consume his branches,

and devour *them*, because of their own counsels.

Hos 11:7 And my people are bent to backsliding from me:

though they called them to the most High, none at all would exalt him.

God Laments

Hos 11:8 How shall I give thee up, **Ephraim**?

how shall I deliver thee, Israel?

how shall I make thee as Admah?

how shall I set thee as **Zeboim**?

mine heart is turned within me,

my repentings are kindled together.

Hos 11:9 I will not execute the fierceness of mine anger,

I will not return to destroy **Ephraim**:

for I am God, and not man; the Holy One in the midst of thee:

and I will not enter into the city.

Hos 11:10 They shall walk after the LORD:

he shall roar like a lion: when he shall roar,

- then the children shall tremble from the west.
- Hos 11:11 They shall tremble as a bird out of Egypt,
- and as a dove out of the land of Assyria:

and I will place them in their houses, saith the LORD.

Wickedness of both Israel and Judah

Hos 11:12 **Ephraim** compasseth me about with lies, and **the house of Israel** with deceit:

Judah is also unruly against God,

Even against the Holy One who is faithful.

NASV correct assumption

but Judah yet ruleth with God,

and is faithful with the saints.

KJV incorrect assumption due to scribal error contradicting Hos 12:2

Hos 12:1 Ephraim feedeth on wind, and followeth after the east wind:

he daily increaseth lies and desolation;

and they do make a covenant with the Assyrians,

and oil is carried into **Egypt**.

Hos 12:2 The LORD hath also a controversy with Judah,

and will punish Jacob according to his ways; (Note: referring to Jacob's rebellious offspring)

according to his doings will he recompense him.

History of Jacob's Youth

Hos 12:3 He (note: Jacob) took his brother (note: Esau) by the heel in the womb,

and by his (note: Jacob) strength he had power with God:

Hos 12:4 Yea, he had power over the angel, and prevailed:

he wept, and made supplication unto him:

he found him in Bethel, and there he spake with us;

Hos 12:5 Even the LORD God of hosts; the LORD is his memorial. (Note: Jehovah)

Hos 12:12 And Jacob fled into the country of Syria [Aram],

and Israel served for a wife, and for a wife he kept sheep.

Hos 12:13 And by a prophet the LORD brought Israel out of Egypt,

and by a prophet was he preserved.

God's judgment on Israel by Assyria con't

Hos 12:6 Therefore turn thou to thy God:

keep mercy and judgment,

and wait on thy God continually.

Hos 12:7 He is a merchant, the balances of deceit are in his hand: he loveth to oppress.

Hos 12:8 And **Ephraim** said, Yet I am become rich,

I have found me out substance:

in all my labours they shall find none iniquity in me that were sin.

Hos 12:9 And I that am the LORD thy God from [since] the land of Egypt

will yet [again] make thee to dwell in tabernacles, as in the days of the solemn feast.

Hos 12:10 I have also spoken by the prophets, and I have multiplied visions, and used similitudes [parables], by the ministry of the prophets.

Hos 12:11 *Is there* iniquity *in* **Gilead?** surely they are vanity:

they sacrifice bullocks in **Gilgal**; yea,

their altars are as heaps in the furrows of the fields.

Hos 12:14 **Ephraim** provoked *him* to anger most bitterly:

therefore shall he leave his blood upon him, and his reproach shall his Lord return unto him.

Hos 13:1 When Ephraim spake {there was} trembling, he exalted himself in Israel;

but when he offended in [through] Baal, he died.

Hos 13:2 And now they sin more and more,

and have made them molten images of their silver,

and idols according to their own understanding,

all of it the work of the craftsmen:

they say of them, Let the men that sacrifice kiss the calves.

Hos 13:3 Therefore they shall be as the morning cloud,

and as the early dew that passeth away,

as the chaff that is driven with the whirlwind out of the floor,

and as the smoke out of the chimney.

Hos 13:4 Yet I am the LORD thy God from [since] the land of Egypt,

and thou shalt know no god but me:

for there is no saviour beside me.

Hos 13:5 I did know thee in the wilderness, in the land of great drought.

Hos 13:6 According to their pasture, so were they filled;

they were filled, and their heart was exalted;

therefore have they forgotten me.

Hos 13:7 Therefore I will be unto them as a lion:

as a leopard by the way will I observe them:

Hos 13:8 I will meet them as a bear that is bereaved of her whelps,

and will rend the caul of their heart,

and there will I devour them like a lion: the wild beast shall tear them.

Hos 13:9 O Israel, thou hast destroyed thyself; but in me is thine help.

Hos 13:10 I will be thy king: where is any other that may save thee in all thy cities?

and thy judges of whom thou saidst, Give me a king and princes?

Hos 13:11 I gave thee a king in mine anger, and took him away in my wrath.

Hos 13:12 The iniquity of **Ephraim** is bound up; his sin is hid.

Hos 13:13 The sorrows of a travailing woman shall come upon him:

he is an unwise son:

for he should not stay long in *the place of* the breaking forth of children.

Hos 13:14 I will ransom them from the power of the grave;

I will redeem them from death:

O death, I will be thy plagues;

O grave, I will be thy destruction:

(Note: The apostle Paul applies these statements as a question in a different context - 1 Corinthians chapter 15) repentance [compassion] shall be hid from mine eyes.

Hos 13:15 Though he be fruitful among his brethren,

an east wind shall come, the wind of the LORD shall come up from the wilderness,

and his spring shall become dry,

and his fountain shall be dried up:

he shall spoil the treasure of all pleasant vessels.

Note: referring to Assyria plundering Ephraim

Hos 13:16 **Samaria** shall become desolate; for she hath rebelled against her God: they shall fall by the sword: their infants shall be dashed in pieces, and their women with child shall be ripped up.

Judgment on Theft and Oppression

Mic 6:10 Are there yet the treasures of wickedness in the house of the wicked, and the scant measure *that is* abominable?

Mic 6:11 Shall I count them pure

with the wicked balances,

and with the bag of deceitful weights?

Mic 6:12 For the rich men thereof are full of violence,

and the inhabitants thereof have spoken lies,

and their tongue is deceitful in their mouth.

Mic 6:13 Therefore also will I make thee sick in smiting thee,

in making thee desolate because of thy sins.

Mic 6:14 Thou shalt eat, but not be satisfied;

and thy casting down shall be in the midst of thee;

and thou shalt take hold, but shalt not deliver;

and *that* which thou deliverest will I give up to the sword.

Mic 6:15 Thou shalt sow, but thou shalt not reap;

thou shalt tread the olives, but thou shalt not anoint thee with oil;

and sweet wine, but shalt not drink wine.

Mic 6:16 For the **statutes** of **Omri** are kept, and all the works of **the house of Ahab**,

and ye walk in their counsels;

that I should make thee a desolation,

and the inhabitants thereof an hissing:

therefore ye shall bear the reproach of my people.

and the stretching out of his wings shall fill the breadth of thy land,

O Immanuel.

Isa 8:9 Associate ourselves {by mistake}, O ye people, and ye shall be broken in pieces; and give ear, all ye of far countries:

gird yourselves, and ye shall be broken in pieces; gird yourselves, and ye shall be broken in pieces.

Ahaz seeks the help of the king of Assyria

2Ki 16:6 At that time Rezin king of Syria [Aram] recovered Elath to Syria [Aram], and drave [drove] the Jews from Elath: and the Syrians [Arameans] came to Elath, and dwelt there unto this day.
2Ki 16:7 So Ahaz sent messengers to Tiglathpileser king of Assyria, saying, I am thy servant and thy son: come up, and save me

- out of the hand of the king of **Syria** [**Aram**],
- and out of the hand of the king of Israel,

which rise up against me.

2Ch 28:16 At that time

did king Ahaz send unto the kings of Assyria to help him.

2Ch 28:17 For again the **Edomites** had come and smitten **Judah**, and carried away captives.

2Ch 28:18 The Philistines also had invaded the cities of the low country, and of the south of Judah, and had taken Bethshemesh, and Ajalon, and Gederoth, and Shocho with the villages thereof, and Timnah with the villages thereof, Gimzo also and the villages thereof: and they dwelt there. 2Ch 28:19 For the LORD brought Judah low because of Ahaz king of Israel; for he made Judah naked, and transgressed sore against the LORD.

From Josephus, Antiquities of the Jews, Book 9, Chapter 12, Paragraph 3

Hereupon king Ahaz, having been so thoroughly beaten by the Israelites, sent to Tiglath-Pileser, king of the Assyrians, and sued for assistance from him in his war against

- the Israelites,
- and Syrians [Arameans],
- and Damascenes, with a promise to send him much money;

2Ki 16:8 And Ahaz took the silver and gold that was found

- in the house of the LORD,
- and in the treasures of the king's house,

and sent *it for* a present to the king of Assyria.

2Ki 16:9 And the king of Assyria hearkened unto him:

for the king of Assyria went up against Damascus, and took it, and carried *the people of* it captive to Kir, and slew Rezin.

Note: Thus fulfilling Isaiah 8:4

(Discrepancy - Ahaz was king of Judah, not Israel)

2Ch 28:20 And Tilgathpilneser king of Assyria came unto him, and distressed him, but strengthened him not

2Ch 28:21 For **Ahaz** took away a portion

- out of the house of the LORD,
- and *out* of the house of the king, and of the princes,

and gave it unto the king of Assyria:

but he helped him not. (Scribal error here in Chronicles) he sent him also great presents at the same time.

Now this king, upon the reception of those ambassadors, came to assist Ahaz,

- and made war upon the Syrians [Arameans], and laid their country waste,
- and took Damascus by force, and slew Rezin their king, and transplanted the people of Damascus into the Upper Media,
- and brought a colony of Assyrians, and planted them in Damascus.

He also afflicted the land of Israel, and took many captives out of it.

Ahaz has Judah worship the gods of Damascus

2Ki 16:10 And king Ahaz went to Damascus to meet Tiglathpileser king of Assyria, and saw an altar that was at Damascus:

2Ch 28:22 And in the time of his distress did he trespass yet more against the LORD: this is that king Ahaz.

From Josephus, Antiquities of the Jews, Book 9, Chapter 12, Paragraph 3

While he was doing thus with the Syrians [Arameans], king Ahaz took all the gold that was in the king's treasures, and the silver, and what was in the temple of God, and what precious gifts were there, and he carried them with him, and came to Damascus, and gave it to the king of Assyria, according to his agreement.

So he confessed that he owed him thanks for all he had done for him, and returned to **Jerusalem**.

2Ch 28:23 For he sacrificed unto the gods of Damascus, which smote him: and he said, Because the gods of the kings of Syria [Aram] help them, therefore will I sacrifice to them, that

they may help me.

Now this king was so sottish and thoughtless of what was for his own good, that he would not leave off worshipping the Syria [Aram]n gods when he was beaten by them,

but he went on in worshipping them, as though they would procure him the victory;

and king Ahaz sent to Urijah the priest the fashion of the altar, and the pattern of it, according to all the workmanship thereof.

2Ki 16:11 And Urijah the priest built an altar according to all that king Ahaz had sent from Damascus: so Urijah the priest made it against [before] king Ahaz came from Damascus.

2Ki 16:12 And when the king was come from Damascus, the king saw the altar: and the king approached to the altar, and offered thereon.
2Ki 16:13 And he burnt his burnt offering and his meat offering, and poured his drink offering, and sprinkled the blood of his peace offerings, upon the altar.

2Ki 16:14 And he brought also the brasen altar, which *was* before the LORD, from the forefront of the house, from between the altar and the house of the LORD, and put it on the north side of the altar.

2Ki 16:15 And king Ahaz commanded Urijah the priest, saying, Upon the great altar burn the morning burnt offering, and the evening meat offering, and the king's burnt sacrifice, and his meat offering, with the burnt offering of all the

people of the land, and their meat offering, and their drink offerings; and sprinkle upon it all the blood of the burnt offering, and all the blood of the sacrifice:

and the brasen altar shall be for me to enquire *by*.

2Ki 16:16 Thus did Urijah the priest, according to all that king Ahaz commanded.

2Ki 16:17 And king Ahaz cut off the borders of the bases, and removed the laver from off them; and took down the sea from off the brasen oxen that were under it, and put it upon a pavement of stones.

2Ki 16:18 And the covert for the sabbath that they had built in the house, and the king's entry without, turned he from the house of the LORD for the king of Assyria.

But they were the ruin of him, and of all **Israel**.

2Ch 28:24 And Ahaz gathered together the vessels of the house of God, and cut in pieces the vessels of the house of God, and shut up the doors of the house of the LORD, and he made him altars in every corner of Jerusalem.

2Ch 28:25 And in every several city of **Judah** he made **high places to burn incense unto other gods**, and provoked to anger the LORD God of his fathers.

and when he was beaten again, he began to honor the gods of the Assyrians:

and he seemed more desirous to honor any other gods than his own paternal and true God, whose anger was the cause of his defeat; nay, he proceeded to such a degree of despite and contempt [of God's worship], that he shut up the temple entirely, and forbade them to bring in the appointed sacrifices, and took away the gifts that had been given to it.

Hoshea, wicked king of Israel Son of Elah wicked king of Israel

In parallel reign with either Ahaz or Jotham

Became king by conspiracy against Pekah

Note: Ahaz reigned 16 years

2Ki 17:1 In the twelfth year of Ahaz king of Judah began Hoshea the son of Elah to reign in Samaria over Israel

• nine years.

2Ki 17:2 And he did that which was evil in the sight of the LORD, but not as **the kings of Israel** that were before him.

Transfer of power from Pekah to Hoshea by conspiracy

2Ki 15:30 And Hoshea the son of Elah made a conspiracy against Pekah the son of Remaliah, and smote him, and slew him, and reigned in his stead, in the twentieth year of Jotham the son of Uzziah. Note: Jotham became co-regent with Uzziah when the Lord punished Uzziah with an earthquake and leprosy. His non co-regent rule was 16 years.

More records of Pekah king of Israel

2Ki 15:31 And the rest of the acts of **Pekah**, and all that he did, behold, they *are* written in **the book of the chronicles of the kings of Israel**.

Isa 14:26

This *is* the purpose that is purposed upon the whole earth: and this *is* the hand that is stretched out upon all the {pagan} nations.

Isa 14:27

For the LORD of hosts hath purposed, and who shall disannul *it?* and his hand *is* stretched out, and who shall turn it back?

Mic 7:13

Notwithstanding the land shall be desolate because of them that dwell therein, for the fruit of their doings.

The oracle/burden concerning Philistia

Isa 14:28 In the year that king Ahaz died was this burden.

Isa 14:29 Rejoice not thou, whole **Palestina [Philistia]**, because the rod of him that smote thee is broken: for out of the serpent's root shall come forth a cockatrice [viper ,adder], and his fruit *shall be* a fiery flying serpent.

Isa 14:30 And the firstborn of the poor shall feed, and the needy shall lie down in safety: and I will kill thy root with famine, and he shall slay thy remnant.

Isa 14:31 Howl, O gate; cry, O city; thou, whole **Palestina** [**Philistia**], *art* dissolved: for there shall come from the north a smoke, and none *shall be* alone in his appointed times.

Isa 14:32 What shall *one* then answer the messengers of the nation? That the LORD hath founded **Zion**, and the poor of his people shall trust in it.

Isa 15:1a

The burden of **Moab**.

Note: Moab and Ammon were sons of Lot by his two daughters after they made him severely drunk (Gen 19:31-38). Moab borders Reuben on the south. Ammon borders Gad and Reuben. Gad and Reuben inherited lands from Ammon and Moab in the days of Moses.

Isa 15:1b Because in the night **Ar of Moab** is laid waste, and brought to silence;

because in the night **Kir of Moab** is laid waste, and brought to silence;

Isa 15:2 He is gone up to Bajith, and to **Dibon**, the **high places**, to weep: (Note: Dibon is in the tribe of Gad) **Moab** shall howl over **Nebo**, and over **Medeba**: (Note: Nebo and Medeba are in the tribe of Reuben.) on all their heads *shall be* baldness, *and* every beard cut off.

Isa 15:3 In their streets they shall gird themselves with sackcloth:

on the tops of their houses, and in their streets, every one shall howl, weeping abundantly.

Isa 15:4 And Heshbon shall cry, and Elealeh: their voice shall be heard *even* unto Jahaz: (Note: These are in the tribe of Reuben)

therefore the armed soldiers of Moab shall cry out; his life shall be grievous unto him.

Isa 15:5 My heart shall cry out for **Moab**;

his fugitives *shall flee* unto **Zoar**, an heifer of three years old:

for by the mounting up of Luhith with weeping shall they go it up;

for in the way of Horonaim they shall raise up a cry of destruction.

Isa 15:6 For the waters of **Nimrim** shall be desolate:

for the hay is withered away, the grass faileth, there is no green thing.

Isa 15:7 Therefore the abundance they have gotten, and that which they have laid up, shall they carry away to **the brook of the willows**.

Isa 15:8 For the cry is gone round about the borders of **Moab**;

the howling thereof unto **Eglaim**, and the howling thereof unto **Beerelim**.

Isa 15:9 For the waters of Dimon shall be full of blood:

for I will bring more upon Dimon,

lions upon him that escapeth of **Moab**, and upon the remnant of the land.

Isa 16:1 Send ye the lamb to the ruler of the land

from Sela to the wilderness, unto the mount of the daughter of Zion.

Isa 16:2 For it shall be, that, as a wandering bird cast out of the nest,

so the daughters of **Moab** shall be at the fords of Arnon.

Isa 16:3 Take counsel, execute judgment;

make thy shadow as the night in the midst of the noonday;

hide the outcasts; bewray not him that wandereth.

Isa 16:4 Let mine outcasts dwell with thee, **Moab**;

be thou a covert to them from the face of the spoiler:

for the extortioner is at an end, the spoiler ceaseth, the oppressors are consumed out of the land.

Isa 16:5 And in mercy shall the throne be established: and he shall sit upon it in truth in the tabernacle of **David**, judging, and seeking judgment, and hasting righteousness.

Isa 16:6 We have heard of the pride of **Moab**; *he is* very proud:

even of his haughtiness, and his pride, and his wrath: but his lies shall not be so.

Isa 16:7 Therefore shall Moab howl for Moab, every one shall howl:

for the foundations of Kirhareseth shall ye mourn; surely they are stricken.

Isa 16:8 For the fields of **Heshbon** languish, and the vine of **Sibmah**: (Note: These are in the tribe of Reuben)

the LORDs of the heathen have broken down the principal plants thereof,

they are come even unto Jazer, they wandered through the wilderness: (Note: Jazer is in the tribe of Gad)

her branches are stretched out, they are gone over the sea.

Isa 16:9 Therefore I will bewail with the weeping of Jazer the vine of Sibmah:

I will water thee with my tears, O Heshbon, and Elealeh: (Note: These are in the tribe of Reuben)

for the shouting for thy summer fruits and for thy harvest is fallen.

Isa 16:10 And gladness is taken away, and joy out of the plentiful field;

and in the vineyards there shall be no singing, neither shall there be shouting:

the treaders shall tread out no wine in *their* presses;

I have made *their vintage* shouting to cease.

Isa 16:11 Wherefore my bowels shall sound like an harp for Moab,

and mine inward parts for Kirharesh.

Isa 16:12 And it shall come to pass,

when it is seen that **Moab** is weary on the high place,

that he shall come to his sanctuary to pray;

but he shall not prevail.

Isa 16:13 This is the word that the LORD hath spoken concerning Moab since that time.

Isa 16:14 But now the LORD hath spoken, saying,

Within three years, as the years of an hireling [hired man],

and the glory of **Moab** shall be contemned, with all that great multitude;

and the remnant shall be very small and feeble.

Judgment on Moab

Isa 25:10b and Moab shall be trodden down under him,

even as straw is trodden down for the dunghill.

Isa 25:11 And he shall spread forth his hands in the midst of them,

as he that swimmeth spreadeth forth his hands to swim:

and he shall bring down their pride together with the spoils of their hands.

Isa 25:12 And the fortress of the high fort of thy walls shall he bring down, lay low,

and bring to the ground, even to the dust.

Isa 17:1

The burden of **Damascus**.

Behold,

Damascus is taken away from being a city, and it shall be a ruinous heap.

Isa 17:2 The cities of Aroer are forsaken:

they shall be for flocks, which shall lie down, and none shall make *them* afraid

Isa 17:3 The fortress also **shall cease** from **Ephraim**,

and the kingdom from Damascus,

and the remnant of Syria [Aram]:

they shall be as the glory of the children of Israel, saith the LORD of hosts.

Israel to be made desolate

Isa 17:4 And In that day it shall come to pass, *that* the glory of **Jacob** shall be made thin, and the fatness of his flesh shall wax lean.

Isa 17:5 And it shall be as when the harvestman gathereth the corn, and reapeth the ears with his arm;

and it shall be as he that gathereth ears in the valley of Rephaim.

Isa 17:6 Yet gleaning grapes shall be left in it, as the shaking of an olive tree,

two or three berries in the top of the uppermost bough,

four or five in the outmost fruitful branches thereof,

saith the LORD God of Israel.

Isa 17:7 At that day shall a man look to his Maker, and his eyes shall have respect to the Holy One of Israel.

Isa 17:8 And he shall not look to the altars, the work of his hands, neither shall respect *that* which his fingers have made, either the groves, or the images.

Isa 17:9 In that day shall his strong cities be as a forsaken bough, and an uppermost branch, which they left because of the children of Israel: and there shall be desolation.

Isa 17:10 Because thou hast forgotten the God of thy salvation, and hast not been mindful of the rock of thy strength, therefore shalt thou plant pleasant plants, and shalt set it with strange slips:

Isa 17:11 In the day shalt thou make thy plant to grow, and in the morning shalt thou make thy seed to flourish: but the harvest shall be a heap in the day of grief and of desperate sorrow.

Judgment against Ethiopia

Isa 18:1 Woe to the land shadowing with wings, which is beyond the rivers of **Ethiopia**:

Isa 18:2 That sendeth ambassadors by the sea, even in vessels of bulrushes upon the waters, *saying*, Go, ye swift messengers, to a nation scattered and peeled,

to a people terrible from their beginning hitherto;

a nation meted out [stalwart] and trodden [treading] down, (Note: powerful and oppressive) whose land the rivers have spoiled [divided]!

Isa 18:3 All ye inhabitants of the world, and dwellers on the earth, see ye, when he lifteth up an ensign on the mountains;

and when he bloweth a trumpet, hear ye.

Isa 18:4 For so the LORD said unto me,

I will take my rest, and I will consider in my dwelling place like a clear heat upon herbs, and like a cloud of dew in the heat of harvest.

Isa 18:5 For afore the harvest, when the bud is perfect, and the sour grape is ripening in the flower, he shall both cut off the sprigs with pruning hooks, and take away *and* cut down the branches.

Isa 18:6 They shall be left together unto the fowls of the mountains, and to the beasts of the earth: and the fowls shall summer upon them, and all the beasts of the earth shall winter upon them.

Isa 18:7 **In that time** shall the present be brought unto the LORD of hosts of a people scattered and peeled, and from a people terrible from their beginning hitherto; a nation meted out and trodden under foot, whose land the rivers have spoiled [divided], to the place of the name of the LORD of hosts, the **mount Zion.**

Isa 19:1 The burden of Egypt.

Behold, the LORD rideth upon a swift cloud, and shall come into Egypt: and the idols of Egypt shall be moved at his presence, and the heart of Egypt shall melt in the midst of it.

Isa 19:2 And I will set the **Egyptians** against the **Egyptians**: and they shall fight every one against his brother, and every one against his neighbour; city against city, *and* kingdom against kingdom.

Isa 19:3 And the spirit of **Egypt** shall fail in the midst thereof; and I will destroy the counsel thereof: and they shall seek to the idols, and to the charmers, and to them that have familiar spirits, and to the wizards.

Isa 19:4 And the Egyptians will I give over into the hand of a cruel lord; and a fierce king shall rule over them, saith the LORD, the LORD of hosts.

Isa 19:5 And the waters shall fail from the sea, and the river shall be wasted and dried up. Isa 19:6 And they shall turn the rivers far away; and the brooks of defence shall be emptied and dried up: the reeds and flags shall wither.

Isa 19:7 The paper reeds by the brooks, by the mouth of the brooks, and every thing sown by the brooks, shall wither, be driven away, and be no more.

Isa 19:8 The fishers also shall mourn, and all they that cast angle into the brooks shall lament, and they that spread nets upon the waters shall languish.

Isa 19:9 Moreover they that work in fine flax, and they that weave networks, shall be confounded.

Isa 19:10 And they shall be broken in the purposes thereof, all that make sluices and ponds for fish.

Isa 19:11 Surely the princes of Zoan are fools, the counsel of the wise counsellors of Pharaoh is become brutish: how say ye unto Pharaoh, I am the son of the wise, the son of ancient kings? Isa 19:12 Where are they? where are thy wise men? and let them tell thee now,

and let them know what the LORD of hosts hath purposed upon Egypt.

Isa 19:13 The princes of Zoan are become fools, the princes of Noph are deceived; they have also seduced Egypt,

even they that are the stay of the tribes thereof.

Isa 19:14 The LORD hath mingled a perverse spirit in the midst thereof: and they have caused **Egypt** to err in every work thereof, as a drunken *man* staggereth in his vomit.

Isa 19:15 Neither shall there be *any* work for **Egypt**, which the head or tail, branch or rush, may do.

Isa 19:16 In that day shall Egypt be like unto women: and it shall be afraid and fear because of the shaking of the hand of the LORD of hosts, which he shaketh over it.

Isa 19:17 And the land of Judah shall be a terror unto Egypt, every one that maketh mention thereof shall be afraid in himself, because of the counsel of the LORD of hosts, which he hath determined against it.

Isa 19:22 And the LORD shall smite Egypt: he shall smite and heal *it*:

and he shall be intreated of them, and shall heal them.

Isa 19:18 In that day shall five cities in the land of Egypt speak the language of Canaan, and swear to the LORD of hosts;

one shall be called, The city of destruction.

and they shall return even to the LORD,

Isa 19:19 In that day

shall there be an altar to the LORD in the midst of the land of Egypt,

and a pillar at the border thereof to the LORD.

Isa 19:20 And it shall be for a sign and for a witness unto the LORD of hosts in the land of Egypt: for they shall cry unto the LORD because of the oppressors,

and he shall send them a saviour, and a great one,

and he shall deliver them.

Isa 19:21 And the LORD shall be known to Egypt,

and the Egyptians shall know the LORD In that day,

and shall do sacrifice and oblation; yea,

they shall vow a vow unto the LORD, and perform it.

Mic 7:12 In that day also he shall come even to thee

from Assyria, and *from* the **fortified cities**, and from **the fortress** even to the river, and from sea to sea, and *from* mountain to mountain.

Isa 19:23 In that day shall there be a highway out of Egypt to Assyria, and the Assyrian shall come into Egypt, and the Egyptian into Assyria, and the Egyptians shall serve with the Assyrians.

Isa 19:24 In that day shall Israel be the third with Egypt and with Assyria, even a blessing in the midst of the land:

Isa 19:25 Whom the LORD of hosts shall bless, saying,

- Blessed be Egypt my people,
- and Assyria the work of my hands,
- and Israel mine inheritance.

Assyria to enslave Egypt and Cush/Ethiopia just after Israelites flee to Egypt for help

Isa 20:1

In the year that Tartan (Note: the commander) came unto Ashdod,

(when Sargon the king of Assyria sent him,)

and fought against Ashdod, and took it;

Note: **Ashdod** is on the coast of **Israel** just north of **Ashkelon** which itself is just north of **Gaza**. **Ashdod**, **Ashkelon** and **Gaza** are Philistine cities.

Isa 20:2 At the same time spake the LORD by Isaiah the son of Amoz, saying,

Go and loose the sackcloth from off thy loins, and put off thy shoe from thy foot.

And he did so, walking naked and barefoot.

Isa 20:3 And the LORD said,

Like as my servant Isaiah hath walked naked and barefoot three years

for a sign and wonder upon Egypt and upon Ethiopia;

Isa 20:4 So shall the king of Assyria lead away

the Egyptians prisoners,

and the Ethiopians captives,

young and old, naked and barefoot, even with their buttocks uncovered,

to the shame of **Egypt**.

Isa 20:5 And they shall be afraid and ashamed of

- Ethiopia their expectation,
- and of **Egypt** their glory.

Isa 20:6

And the inhabitant of this isle shall say In that day,

Behold, such *is* our expectation, whither [where] we flee for help to be delivered from **the king of Assyria**: and how shall we escape?

(See also Jeremiah chapters 43-44 wrt **Judean**s fleeing to Egypt to escape Nebuchadnezzar king of Babylon) Note: The Assyrian Empire (746-609 BC) included Iran, Iraq Syria [Aram], parts of Turkey, Syria [Aram], Lebanon, Israel, parts of Egypt

Isa 21:11

The burden of Dumah [Edom/Esau]

Note:

- Gen_25:30 and <u>Esau</u> said to Jacob, "Please let me have a swallow of that red stuff there, for I am famished." Therefore his name was called **Edom**.
- Gen_32:3 Then Jacob sent messengers before him to his brother Esau in the land of Seir, the country of Edom
- Esau, who God hated, is the wicked twin brother of Jacob born to Isaac and Rebekah.

He calleth to me out of Seir,

Watchman, what of the night?

Watchman, what of the night?

Isa 21:12 The watchman said,

The morning cometh, and also the night:

if ye will enquire, enquire ye: return, come.

Isa 21:13

The burden upon Arabia.

In the forest in Arabia shall ye lodge, O ye travelling companies of Dedanim.

Isa 21:14 The inhabitants of the land of Tema brought water to him that was thirsty,

they prevented with their bread him that fled.

Isa 21:15 For they fled from the swords, from the drawn sword,

and from the bent bow,

and from the grievousness of war.

Isa 21:16 For thus hath the LORD said unto me,

Within a year, according to the years of an hireling,

and all the glory of Kedar shall fail; (Note: Kedar was the second son of Ishmael.)

Isa 21:17 And the residue of the number of archers, the mighty men of the children of Kedar, shall be diminished: for the LORD God of Israel hath spoken it.

Note: Jer_49:28 Concerning Kedar and the kingdoms of Hazor, which Nebuchadnezzar king of Babylon defeated. Thus says the LORD, "Arise, go up to Kedar And devastate the men of the east.

Isa 22:1

The burden of the valley of vision.

What aileth thee now, that thou art wholly gone up to the housetops?

Isa 22:2 Thou that art full of stirs, a tumultuous city, a joyous city:

thy slain men are not slain with the sword, nor dead in battle.

Isa 22:3 All thy rulers are fled together, they are bound by the archers:

all that are found in thee are bound together, which have fled from far.

Isa 22:4 Therefore said I,

Look away from me; I will weep bitterly,

labour not to comfort me, because of the spoiling of the daughter of my people.

Isa 22:5 For it is a day of trouble, and of treading down, and of perplexity

by the LORD God of hosts in the valley of vision,

breaking down the walls,

and of crying to the mountains.

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Isa 22:6 And Elam bare the quiver (Note: Elam is in Iran)
with chariots of men and horsemen,
and Kir uncovered the shield. (Note: Kir is the capital Moab, Moab is east of the Dead Sea)
Isa 22:7 And it shall come to pass, that thy choicest valleys shall be full of chariots,
and the horsemen shall set themselves in array at the gate.
Isa 22:8 And he discovered the covering of Judah,
and thou didst look In that day to the armour of the house of the forest.
Isa 22:9 Ye have seen also the breaches of the city of David, that they are many:
and ye gathered together the waters of the lower pool.
Isa 22:10 And ye have numbered the houses of Jerusalem,
and the houses have ye broken down to fortify the wall.
Isa 22:11 Ye made also a ditch between the two walls for the water of the old pool:
but ye have not looked unto the maker thereof,
neither had respect unto him that fashioned it long ago.
Isa 22:12 And In that day did the LORD God of hosts call
to weeping, and to mourning, and to baldness, and to girding with sackcloth:
Isa 22:13 And behold joy and gladness,
slaying oxen, and killing sheep, eating flesh, and drinking wine:
let us eat and drink; for to morrow we shall die.
Isa 22:14 And it was revealed in mine ears by the LORD of hosts,
Surely this iniquity shall not be purged from you till ye die, saith the LORD God of hosts.
Isa 22:15 Thus saith the LORD God of hosts,
Go, get thee unto this treasurer, even unto Shebna, which is over the house, and say,
         Isa 22:16 What hast thou here?
         and whom hast thou here,
         that thou hast hewed thee out a sepulchre here,
         as he that heweth him out a sepulchre on high,
         and that graveth an habitation for himself in a rock?
         Isa 22:17 Behold, the LORD will carry thee away with a mighty captivity,
         and will surely cover thee.
         Isa 22:18 He will surely violently turn and toss thee like a ball into a large country:
         there shalt thou die,
         and there the chariots of thy glory shall be the shame of thy lord's house.
         Isa 22:19 And I will drive thee from thy station,
         and from thy state shall he pull thee down.
Isa 22:20 And it shall come to pass In that day,
that I will call my servant Eliakim the son of Hilkiah: (2 Kings 18 - during the reign of Hezekiah after Ahaz)
         Isa 22:21 And I will clothe him with thy robe,
         and strengthen him with thy girdle,
         and I will commit thy government into his hand:
         and he shall be a father to the inhabitants of Jerusalem, and to the house of Judah.
         Isa 22:22 And the key of the house of David will I lay upon his shoulder;
         so he shall open, and none shall shut; and he shall shut, and none shall open.
         Isa 22:23 And I will fasten him as a nail in a sure place;
         and he shall be for a glorious throne to his father's house.
         Isa 22:24 And they shall hang upon him
         all the glory of his father's house,
         the offspring and the issue,
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all vessels of small quantity, from the vessels of cups, even to all the vessels of flagons.
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Isa 22:25 In that day, saith the LORD of hosts,

shall the nail that is fastened in the sure place be removed,

and be cut down, and fall;

and the burden that was upon it shall be cut off:

for the LORD hath spoken it.

Note: See also Hosea chapters 4-13

Isa 28:1

Woe to the crown of pride, to the drunkards of Ephraim,

whose glorious beauty is a fading flower,

which are on the head of the fat valleys of them that are overcome with wine!

Isa 28:7 But they also have erred through wine,

and through strong drink are out of the way;

the priest and the prophet have erred through strong drink,

they are swallowed up of wine, they are out of the way through strong drink;

they err in vision, they stumble *in* judgment.

Isa 28:8 For all tables are full of vomit and filthiness, so that there is no place clean.

Isa 28:9 Whom shall he teach knowledge?

and whom shall he make to understand doctrine?

them that are weaned from the milk, and drawn from the breasts.

Isa 28:10 For

precept must be upon precept, precept upon precept;

line upon line, line upon line;

here a little, and there a little:

Isa 28:11 For with stammering lips and another tongue will he speak to this people.

Isa 28:12 To whom he said, This is the rest wherewith ye may cause the weary to rest; and this is the refreshing: yet they would not hear.

Isa 28:13 But the word of the LORD was unto them

precept upon precept, precept upon precept;

line upon line, line upon line;

here a little, and there a little;

that they might go, and fall backward, and be broken, and snared, and taken.

Isa 28:2 Behold, the LORD hath a mighty and strong one,

which as a tempest of hail and a destroying storm,

as a flood of mighty waters overflowing,

shall cast down to the earth with the hand.

Isa 28:3 The crown of pride, the drunkards of **Ephraim**, shall be trodden under feet:

Isa 28:4 And the glorious beauty, which is on the head of the fat valley,

shall be a fading flower,

and as the hasty fruit before the summer;

which when he that looketh upon it seeth, while it is yet in his hand he eateth it up.

Isa 28:14

Wherefore hear the word of the LORD, ye scornful men,

that rule this people which is in Jerusalem.

Isa 28:15 Because ye have said,

We have made a **covenant with death**, and **with hell are we at agreement**;

when the overflowing scourge shall pass through, it shall not come unto us:

for we have made lies our refuge,

and under falsehood have we hid ourselves:

Isa 28:16 Therefore thus saith the LORD God,

Behold, I lay in **Zion** for a foundation a stone, a tried stone, a precious corner *stone*, a sure foundation: he that believeth shall not make haste.

Note:

Zec 3:9 For behold the stone that I have laid before Joshua; upon one stone *shall be* seven eyes: behold, I will engrave the graving thereof, saith the LORD of hosts, and I will remove the iniquity of that land in one day.

Mat 21:42 Jesus saith unto them, Did ye never read in the scriptures, The stone which the builders rejected, the same is become the head of the corner: this is the LORD's doing, and it is marvellous in our eves?

Psa 118:22 The stone *which* the builders refused is become the head *stone* of the corner.

Isa 28:17

Judgment also will I lay to the line, and righteousness to the plummet:

and the hail shall sweep away the refuge of lies, and the waters shall overflow the hiding place. Isa 28:18 And your covenant with death shall be disannulled, and your agreement with hell shall not stand;

when **the overflowing scourge** shall pass through, then ye shall be trodden down by it. Isa 28:19 From the time that it goeth forth it shall take you:

for morning by morning shall it pass over, by day and by night: and it shall be a vexation only *to* understand the report.

Isa 28:20 For the bed is shorter than that *a man* can stretch himself *on it*: and the covering narrower than that he can wrap himself *in it*.

Isa 28:21 For the LORD shall rise up as in mount Perazim,

he shall be wroth as in the valley of Gibeon,

that he may do his work, his strange work;

and bring to pass his act, his strange act.

Isa 28:22 Now therefore be ye not mockers, lest your bands be made strong:

for I have heard from the LORD God of hosts

a consumption, even determined upon the whole earth.

Judgment on those who pervert Justice

Isa 29:15

Woe unto them that seek deep to hide their counsel [plans] from the LORD, and their works are in the dark,

and they say, Who seeth us? and who knoweth us?

Isa 29:16 Surely your turning of things upside down

shall be esteemed as the potter's clay: for shall the work say of him that made it, He made me not? or shall the thing framed say of him that framed it, He had no understanding?

Isa 29:17 Is it not yet a very little while,

and Lebanon shall be turned into a fruitful field, and the fruitful field shall be esteemed as a forest?

Isa 29:20 For the **ruthless** will come to an end, and the **scorner** will be finished,

Indeed all who are **intent on doing evil** will be cut off;

- Isa 29:21 Who cause a person to be indicted by a word,
- And ensnare him who adjudicates at the gate,
- And defraud the one in the right with meaningless arguments.

NASV

Isa 29:20 For the terrible one is brought to nought, and the scorner is consumed,

- and all that watch for iniquity are cut off:
 - Isa 29:21 That make a man an offender for a word,
 - and lay a snare for him that reproveth in the gate,
 - and turn aside the just for a thing of nought.

KJV

God teaches the farmer his occupation

Isa 28:23 Give ye ear, and hear my voice; hearken, and hear my speech.

Isa 28:24 Doth the plowman plow all day to sow?

doth he open and break the clods of his ground?

Isa 28:25 When he hath made plain [level] the face [surface] thereof,

doth he not cast abroad [sow] the fitches [dill], and scatter the cummin,

and cast in the principal [plant in rows] wheat and the appointed barley and the rie [rye] in their place?

Isa 28:26 For his God doth instruct him to discretion, and doth teach him.

Isa 28:27 For the fitches [dill] are not threshed with a threshing instrument,

neither is a cart wheel turned about upon [driven over] the cummin;

but the fitches [dill] are beaten out with a staff, and the cummin with a rod.

Isa 28:28 Bread *corn* is bruised; because he will not ever [not continue to] be threshing it,

nor break it with the wheel of his cart, nor bruise it with his horsemen.

Isa 28:29 This also cometh forth from the LORD of hosts.

which is wonderful in counsel, and excellent in working.

Isa 29:1

Woe to Ariel, to Ariel, the city where David dwelt (camped)!

add ye year to year; let them kill sacrifices.

Isa 29:2 Yet I will distress Ariel,

and there shall be heaviness and sorrow:

and it shall be unto me as Ariel.

Isa 29:3 And I will camp against thee round about,

and will lay siege against thee with a mount,

and I will raise forts against thee.

Isa 29:4 And thou shalt be brought down,

and shalt speak out of the ground,

and thy speech shall be low out of the dust,

and thy voice shall be, as of one that hath a familiar spirit, out of the ground, a

nd thy speech shall whisper out of the dust.

Isa 29:5 Moreover the multitude of thy strangers shall be like small dust,

and the multitude of the terrible ones *shall be* as chaff that passeth away: yea, it shall be at an instant suddenly.

Isa 29:6 Thou shalt be visited of the LORD of hosts with thunder, and with earthquake, and great noise, with storm and tempest, and the flame of devouring fire.

Isa 29:7 And the multitude of all the nations that fight against Ariel,

even all that fight against her and her munition, and that distress her, shall be as a dream of a night vision.

Isa 29:8 It shall even be as when an hungry man dreameth, and,

behold, he eateth; but he awaketh, and his soul is empty:

or as when a thirsty man dreameth,

and, behold, he drinketh; but he awaketh, and,

behold, he is faint, and his soul hath appetite:

so shall the multitude of all the nations be, that fight against mount Zion.

Isa 29:9 Stay yourselves, and wonder;

cry ye out, and cry:

they are drunken, but not with wine;

they stagger, but not with strong drink.

Isa 29:10 For the LORD hath poured out upon you the spirit of deep sleep,

and hath closed your eyes: the prophets and your rulers, the seers hath he covered.

Isa 29:11 And the vision of all is become unto you as the words of a book that is sealed,

which men deliver to one that is learned, saying,

Read this, I pray thee: and he saith, I cannot; for it is sealed:

Isa 29:12 And the book is delivered to him that is not learned, saying, Read this, I pray thee:

and he saith, I am not learned.

Isa 29:13 Wherefore the LORD said,

Forasmuch as this people draw near me with their mouth,

and with their lips do honour me,

but have removed their heart far from me,

and their fear toward me is taught by the precept of men:

Isa 29:14 Therefore, behold,

I will proceed to do a marvellous work among this people, *even* a marvellous work and a wonder: for the wisdom of their wise *men* shall perish,

and the understanding of their prudent *men* shall be hid.

The righteous and foolish kings contrasted

Isa 32:1 Behold, a king shall reign in righteousness,

and princes shall rule in judgment.

Isa 32:2 And a man shall be as an hiding place from the wind,

and a covert from the tempest;

as rivers of water in a dry place,

as the shadow of a great rock in a weary land.

Isa 32:3 And the eyes of them that see shall not be dim,

and the ears of them that hear shall hearken.

Isa 32:4 The heart also of the rash shall understand knowledge,

and the tongue of the stammerers shall be ready to speak plainly.

Isa 32:5 The vile person [fool] shall be no more called liberal [noble],

nor the churl [rogue] said to be bountiful [generous].

Isa 32:6 For the vile person will speak villany,

and his heart will work iniquity,

to practise hypocrisy, and to utter error against the LORD,

to make empty the soul of the hungry,

and he will cause the drink of the thirsty to fail.

Isa 32:7 The instruments also of **the churl [rogue]** are evil:

he deviseth wicked devices to destroy the poor with lying words, even when the needy speaketh right.

Isa 32:8 But the liberal [noble] deviseth liberal [noble] things;

and by liberal [noble] things shall he stand. (Note: liberal here simply means a non-political generous person)

God's anger against Edom

Isa 63:1 Who is this that cometh from **Edom**, with dyed garments from Bozrah?

this that is glorious in his apparel, travelling in the greatness of his strength?

I that speak in righteousness, mighty to save.

Isa 63:2 Wherefore art thou red in thine apparel, and thy garments like him that treadeth in the winefat?

Isa 63:3 I have trodden the winepress alone;

and of the people there was none with me:

for I will tread them in mine anger, and trample them in my fury;

and their blood shall be sprinkled upon my garments, and I will stain all my raiment.

Isa 63:4 For the day of vengeance is in mine heart,

and the year of my redeemed is come.

Isa 63:5 And I looked, and there was none to help; and I wondered that there was none to uphold:

therefore mine own arm brought salvation unto me; and my fury, it upheld me.

Isa 63:6 And I will tread down the people in mine anger,

and make them drunk in my fury,

and I will bring down their strength to the earth.

Isa 34:8

For *it is* the day of the LORD'S vengeance, and the year of recompences for the controversy of **Zion**.

Isa 34:5

For my sword shall be bathed in heaven: behold, it shall come down upon Idumea [H123: Edom],

and upon the people of my curse, to judgment.

Note: See Jeremiah 49:7-22

Isa 34:6

The sword of the LORD is filled with blood, it is made

- fat with fatness,
- and with the blood of lambs and goats,
- with the fat of the kidneys of rams:

for the LORD hath a sacrifice in Bozrah, (Note: Bozrah was the capital of Edom) and a great slaughter in the land of Idumea [H123: Edom].

Isa 34:7 And the unicorns [wild oxen] shall come down with them,

and the bullocks with the bulls:

and their land shall be soaked with blood,

and their dust made fat with fatness.

Isa 34:9 And the streams thereof shall be turned into pitch,

and the dust thereof into brimstone,

and the land thereof shall become burning pitch.

Isa 34:10 It shall not be quenched night nor day;

the smoke thereof shall go up for ever:

from generation to generation it shall lie waste;

none shall pass through it for ever and ever.

Isa 34:13a And thorns shall come up in her palaces, nettles and brambles in the fortresses thereof:

Isa 34:12 They shall call the nobles thereof to the kingdom, but none *shall be* there, and all her princes shall be nothing.

Isa 34:11a But the cormorant and the bittern shall possess it; the owl also and the raven shall dwell in it;

Isa 34:13b and it shall be an habitation of dragons, and a court for owls.

Isa 34:14 The wild beasts of the desert shall also meet with the wild beasts of the island,

and the satyr [hairy goat] shall cry to his fellow;

the screech owl also shall rest there, and find for herself a place of rest.

Isa 34:15 The tree snake shall make its nest and lay eggs there.

And it will hatch and gather them under its protection.

Yes, the hawks shall be gathered there, Every one with its kind. (NASV)

Isa 34:15 There shall the great owl make her nest, and

and hatch, and gather under her shadow:

there shall the vultures also be gathered, every one with her mate. (KJV)

Isa 34:11b and he shall stretch out upon it the line of confusion, and the stones of emptiness.

Isa 34:16 Seek ye out of **the book of the LORD**, and read:

no one of these shall fail.

none shall want her mate:

for my mouth it hath commanded.

and his spirit it hath gathered them.

Isa 34:17 And he hath cast the lot for them,

and his hand hath divided it unto them by line:

they shall possess it for ever,

from generation to generation shall they dwell therein.

Isa 35:1 The wilderness and the solitary place shall be glad for them;

and the desert (note: the depressed area running along the Jordan River) shall rejoice, and blossom as the rose.

Isa 35:2 It shall blossom abundantly,

and rejoice even with joy and singing:

the glory of **Lebanon** shall be given unto it,

the excellency of Carmel and Sharon,

they shall see the glory of the LORD, and the excellency of our God.

Isa 35:3 Strengthen ye the weak hands, and confirm the feeble knees.

Isa 35:4 Say to them that are of a fearful heart, Be strong, fear not:

behold, your God will come with vengeance,

even God with a recompence;

he will come and save you.

Isa 35:5 Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened,

and the ears of the deaf shall be unstopped.

Isa 35:6 Then shall the lame man leap as an hart,

and the tongue of the dumb sing:

for in the wilderness shall waters break out,

and streams in the desert.

Isa 35:7 And the parched ground shall become a pool,

and the thirsty land springs of water:

in the habitation of dragons, where each lay, shall be grass with reeds and rushes.

Isa 35:8

And an highway shall be there, and a way, and it shall be called The way of holiness;

- the unclean shall not pass over it; but it shall be for those: the wayfaring men,
- though fools, shall not err therein.
- Isa 35:9 No lion shall be there,
- nor *any* ravenous beast shall go up thereon,

it shall not be found there; but the redeemed shall walk there:

Isa 35:10 And the ransomed of the LORD shall return,

and come to **Zion** with songs

and everlasting joy upon their heads:

they shall obtain joy and gladness,

and sorrow and sighing shall flee away.

Hezekiah, righteous king of Judah Son of Ahaz, wicked king of Judah

Brief summary of Hezekiah's life

2Ki 18:1 Now it came to pass in the third year of Hoshea son of Elah king of Israel,

Note: Hoshea reigned 9 years

that Hezekiah the son of Ahaz king of Judah began to reign.

- 2Ki 18:2 Twenty and five years old was he when he began to reign;
- and he reigned twenty and nine years in Jerusalem.
- His mother's name also was Abi, the daughter of Zachariah.
- 2Ki 18:3 And he did *that which was* right in the sight of **the LORD**, according to all that **David** his father did.
- 2Ch 29:1 Hezekiah began to reign when he was five and twenty years old,
- and he reigned nine and twenty years in **Jerusalem**.
- And his mother's name *was* Abijah, the daughter of Zechariah.
- 2Ch 29:2 And he did *that which was* right in the sight of the LORD, according to all that **David** his father had done.

Hezekiah repairs the house of the LORD and admonishes the Levites to follow the LORD fully

2Ch 29:3 He in the first year of his reign, in the first month, opened the doors of the house of the LORD, and repaired them.

2Ch 29:4 And he brought in the priests and the Levites, and gathered them together into the east street, 2Ch 29:5 And said unto them, Hear me, ye Levites,

- sanctify now yourselves,
- and sanctify the house of the LORD God of your fathers,
- and carry forth the filthiness out of the holy *place*.

2Ch 29:6 For our fathers

- have trespassed,
- and done that which was evil in the eyes of the LORD our God,
- and have forsaken him,
- and have turned away their faces from the habitation of the LORD,
- and turned *their* backs.
- 2Ch 29:7 Also they have shut up the doors of the porch,
- and put out the lamps,
- and have not burned **incense** nor offered **burnt offerings** in the holy *place* unto the God of Israel.

2Ch 29:8 Wherefore the wrath of the LORD was upon **Judah** and **Jerusalem**, and he hath delivered them to trouble, to astonishment, and to hissing, as ye see with your eyes.

2Ch 29:9 For, lo, our fathers have fallen by the sword, and our sons and our daughters and our wives *are* in captivity for this.

2Ch 29:10 Now it is in mine heart to make a covenant with the LORD God of Israel, that his fierce wrath may turn away from us.

2Ch 29:11 My sons, be not now negligent: for the LORD hath chosen you

- to stand before him,
- to serve him,
- and that ye should minister unto him, and burn incense.

The Levites consecrate the house of the LORD and cleanse it from objects of worship to foreign gods/demons

2Ch 29:12 Then the Levites arose,

- Mahath the son of Amasai,
- and Joel the son of Azariah,

of the sons of the Kohathites: and of the sons of Merari,

- Kish the son of Abdi,
- and Azariah the son of Jehalelel:

and of the Gershonites;

- Joah the son of Zimmah,
- and Eden the son of Joah:

2Ch 29:13 And of the sons of Elizaphan;

• Shimri, and Jeiel:

and of the sons of Asaph;

• Zechariah, and Mattaniah:

2Ch 29:14 And of the sons of Heman;

• Jehiel, and Shimei:

and of the sons of Jeduthun;

• Shemaiah, and Uzziel.

2Ch 29:15 And they gathered their brethren,

and sanctified themselves,

and came, according to the commandment of the king, by the words of the LORD,

to cleanse the house of the LORD.

2Ch 29:16 And the priests went into the inner part of the house of the LORD, to cleanse it,

- and brought out all the uncleanness that they found in the temple of the LORD into the court of the house of the LORD.
- And the Levites took *it*, to carry *it* out abroad into the brook Kidron.

2Ch 29:17 Now they began on the first day of the first month to sanctify, and on the eighth day of the month came they to the porch of the LORD:

so they sanctified the house of the LORD in eight days;

and in the sixteenth day of the first month they made an end.

2Ch 29:18 Then they went in to Hezekiah the king, and said,

We have **cleansed** all the house of the LORD,

- and the altar of burnt offering, with all the vessels thereof,
- and the shewbread table, with all the vessels thereof.
- 2Ch 29:19 Moreover all the vessels, which king Ahaz in his reign did cast away in his transgression, have we prepared and sanctified, and, behold, they are before the altar of the LORD.

The service of the house of the LORD is reestablished

2Ch 29:20 Then **Hezekiah** the king rose early,

- and gathered the rulers of the city,
- and went up to the house of the LORD.

2Ch 29:21 And they brought

- seven bullocks,
- and seven rams,
- and seven lambs.
- and seven he goats,

for a sin offering for the kingdom, and for the sanctuary, and for Judah.

And he commanded the priests the sons of Aaron to offer them on the altar of the LORD.

- 2Ch 29:22 So they killed **the bullocks**, and the priests received the blood, and sprinkled *it* on the altar:
- likewise, when they had killed the rams, they sprinkled the blood upon the altar:
- they killed also **the lambs**, and they sprinkled the blood upon the altar.
- 2Ch 29:23 And they brought forth the **he goats** for the **sin offering** before the king and the congregation;
 - o and they laid their hands upon them:
 - o 2Ch 29:24 And the priests killed them,
 - o and they made reconciliation with their blood upon the altar, to make an atonement for all **Israel**:

for the king commanded that the burnt offering and the sin offering should be made for all Israel.

2Ch 29:25 And he set the Levites in the house of the LORD with cymbals, with psalteries, and with harps, according to the commandment of

- David.
- and of Gad the king's seer,
- and Nathan the prophet:

for so was the commandment of the LORD by his prophets.

- 2Ch 29:26 And the Levites stood with the instruments of David,
- and the priests with the trumpets.

2Ch 29:27 And Hezekiah commanded to offer the burnt offering upon the altar.

And when the **burnt offering** began,

- the song of the LORD began *also* with the trumpets, and with the instruments *ordained* by **David king of Israel**.
- 2Ch 29:28 And all the congregation worshipped, and the singers sang, and the trumpeters sounded: *and* all *this continued* until the burnt offering was finished.

2Ch 29:29 And when they had made an end of offering,

- the king and all that were present with him bowed themselves, and worshipped.
- 2Ch 29:30 Moreover **Hezekiah** the king and the princes commanded the **Levites** to sing praise unto the **LORD** with the words of **David**, and of Asaph the seer.

And they sang praises with gladness, and they bowed their heads and worshipped.

2Ch 29:31 Then Hezekiah answered and said, Now ye have **consecrated yourselves** unto the LORD, come near and bring **sacrifices** and **thank offerings** into **the house of the LORD**. And the congregation brought in **sacrifices** and **thank offerings**; and as many as were of a free heart **burnt offerings**.

2Ch 29:32 And the number of the **burnt offerings**, which the congregation brought, was

- threescore and ten bullocks,
- an hundred rams.
- and two hundred lambs:

all these were for a burnt offering to the LORD.

2Ch 29:33 And the **consecrated things** were

- six hundred oxen
- and three thousand sheep.

2Ch 29:34 But the priests were too few, so that they could not flay all the **burnt offerings**: wherefore their brethren the **Levites** did help them, till the work was ended, and until the *other* priests had sanctified themselves: for the **Levites** were more upright in heart to sanctify themselves than the priests.

2Ch 29:35 And also the **burnt offerings** were in abundance, with the fat of the **peace offerings**, and the **drink offerings** for every **burnt offering**. So the service of **the house of the LORD** was set in order.

2Ch 29:36 And Hezekiah rejoiced, and all the people, that God had prepared the people: for the thing was done suddenly.

The Passover Celebration in Jerusalem is reestablished

2Ch 30:1 And **Hezekiah** sent to all **Israel** and **Judah**, and wrote letters also to **Ephraim** and **Manasseh**, that they should come to **the house of the LORD** at **Jerusalem**, to keep **the passover** unto **the LORD God** of **Israel**. 2Ch 30:2 For **the king** had taken counsel, and his princes, and all the congregation in **Jerusalem**, to keep the passover in the second month.

2Ch 30:3 For they could not keep it at that time,

- because the priests had not sanctified themselves sufficiently,
- neither had the people gathered themselves together to Jerusalem.

2Ch 30:4 And the thing pleased the king and all the congregation.

2Ch 30:5 So they established a decree to make proclamation throughout all **Israel**, from **Beersheba** even to **Dan**, that they should come to keep **the passover** unto **the LORD God** of **Israel** at **Jerusalem**: for they had not done *it* of a long *time in such sort* as it was written.

2Ch 30:6 So the posts went with the letters from the king and his princes throughout all **Israel** and **Judah**, and according to **the commandment** of the king, saying,

Ye children of Israel, turn again unto the LORD God of Abraham, Isaac, and Israel, and he will return to the remnant of you, that are escaped out of the hand of the kings of Assyria.

2Ch 30:7 And be not ye like your fathers, and like your brethren, which trespassed against the LORD God of their fathers, *who* therefore gave them up to desolation, as ye see.

2Ch 30:8 Now be ye not stiffnecked, as your fathers *were*, *but* yield yourselves unto the LORD, and enter into his sanctuary, which he hath sanctified for ever: and serve the LORD your God, that the fierceness of his wrath may turn away from you.

Note: <u>Pro_29:1</u> He, that being often reproved hardeneth *his* neck, shall suddenly be destroyed, and that without remedy.

2Ch 30:9 For if ye turn again unto **the LORD**, your brethren and your children *shall find* compassion before them that lead them captive, so that they shall come again into this land: for **the LORD your God** *is* gracious and merciful, and will not turn away *his* face from you, if ye return unto him.

Few accept the invitation to the Passover

2Ch 30:10 So the posts passed from city to city through the country of **Ephraim** and **Manasseh** even unto **Zebulun**: but they laughed them to scorn, and mocked them.

2Ch 30:11 Nevertheless divers [some men] of **Asher** and **Manasseh** and of **Zebulun** humbled themselves, and came to **Jerusalem**. See Matthew 22:2-6

The people of Judah cast the objects of worship to other god's into the brook Kidron

2Ch 30:12 Also in **Judah** the hand of God was to give them one heart to do the commandment of the king and of the princes, by the word of the LORD.

2Ch 30:13 And there assembled at **Jerusalem** much people to keep the **feast of unleavened bread** in the second month, a very great congregation.

2Ch 30:14 And they arose and took away the altars that were in Jerusalem, and all the altars for incense took they away, and cast them into the brook Kidron.

Hezekiah intercedes and the LORD pardons and heals those who did not follow the purification rules of the sanctuary

2Ch 30:15 Then they killed the passover on the fourteenth day of the second month: and the priests and the Levites were ashamed, and sanctified themselves, and brought in the burnt offerings into the house of the LORD

2Ch 30:16 And they stood in their place after their manner, according to **the law** of Moses the man of God: the priests sprinkled the blood, *which they received* of the hand of the Levites.

- 2Ch 30:17 For *there were* many in the congregation that were not sanctified: therefore the Levites had the charge of the killing of the passovers for every one *that was* not clean, to sanctify them unto the LORD.
- 2Ch 30:18 For a multitude of the people, *even* many of **Ephraim**, and **Manasseh**, Issachar, and **Zebulun**, had not cleansed themselves, yet did they eat the passover otherwise than it was written. But **Hezekiah** prayed for them, saying,

The good LORD pardon every one 2Ch 30:19 *That* prepareth his heart to seek God, the LORD God of his fathers, though he be not cleansed according to the purification of the sanctuary.

2Ch 30:20 And the LORD hearkened to **Hezekiah**, and healed the people.

The joyful Feast of Unleavened bread gets extended for another seven days

2Ch 30:21 And the children of Israel that were present at Jerusalem kept the feast of unleavened bread seven days with great gladness:

and the Levites and the priests praised the LORD day by day, singing with loud instruments unto the LORD.

2Ch 30:22 And Hezekiah spake comfortably unto all the Levites that taught the good knowledge of the LORD:

- and they did eat throughout the feast seven days, offering peace offerings, and making confession to the LORD God of their fathers.
- 2Ch 30:23 And the whole assembly took counsel to keep other seven days: and they kept *other* seven days with gladness.

2Ch 30:24 For Hezekiah king of Judah did give to the congregation

- a thousand bullocks
- and seven thousand sheep;

and the princes gave to the congregation

- a thousand bullocks
- and ten thousand **sheep**:

and a great number of priests sanctified themselves.

2Ch 30:25 And all the congregation of **Judah**, with the priests and the **Levites**, and all the congregation that came out of **Israel**,

- and the strangers that came out of the land of Israel,
- and that dwelt in **Judah**,

rejoiced. 2Ch 30:26 So there was great joy in Jerusalem:

for since the time of Solomon the son of David king of Israel there was not the like in Jerusalem.

2Ch 30:27 Then the priests the Levites arose and blessed the people: and their voice was heard, and their prayer came *up* to his holy dwelling place, *even* unto heaven.

Those of Israel who were present help Judah cleanse themselves of all the objects of worship to other god's

2Ki 18:4 He (note: Hezekiah)

- removed the high places,
- and brake the images [sacred pillars, obelisks],
- and cut down the groves [Asherim],
- and brake in pieces the brasen serpent that Moses had made: for unto those days the children of Israel did burn incense to it: and he called it Nehushtan

2Ch 31:1 Now when all this was finished, all Israel that were present went out to the cities of Judah,

- and brake the images [sacred pillars, obelisks] in pieces,
- and cut down the groves [Asherim],
- and threw down the high places and the altars out of
 - o all Judah and Benjamin,
 - o in **Ephraim** also and **Manasseh**, until they had utterly destroyed them all.

Then all **the children of Israel** returned, every man to his possession, into their own cities.

Hezekiah makes administrative assignments for the offerings

2Ch 31:2 And **Hezekiah** appointed the courses of the priests and the **Levites** after their courses, every man according to his service, the priests and **Levites**

- for burnt offerings and for peace offerings,
- to minister, and to give thanks, and to praise in the gates of the tents of the LORD.

2Ch 31:3 He appointed also the king's portion of his substance for the burnt offerings, to wit,

- for the morning and evening burnt offerings,
- and the burnt offerings for the sabbaths,
- and for the **new moons**,
- and for the set feasts,

as it is written in the law of the LORD.

2Ch 31:4 Moreover he commanded the people that dwelt in **Jerusalem** to give the portion of the priests and the **Levites**, that they might be encouraged in **the law of the LORD**.

2Ch 31:5 And as soon as the commandment came abroad,

the children of Israel brought in abundance

- the firstfruits of corn, wine, and oil, and honey, and of all the increase of the field;
- and the tithe of all *things* brought they in abundantly.
- 2Ch 31:6 And concerning the children of Israel and Judah, that dwelt in the cities of Judah, they also brought in
 - the tithe of oxen and sheep,
 - and the tithe of holy things which were consecrated unto the LORD their God, and laid them by heaps.

2Ch 31:7 In the third month they began to lay the foundation of the heaps, and finished *them* in the seventh month

2Ch 31:8 And when **Hezekiah** and the princes came and saw the heaps, they blessed the LORD, and his people **Israel**.

2Ch 31:9 Then Hezekiah questioned with the priests and the Levites concerning the heaps.

2Ch 31:10 And Azariah the chief priest of the house of Zadok answered him, and said, Since *the people* began to bring the offerings into the house of the LORD, we have had enough to eat, and have left plenty: for the LORD hath blessed his people; and that which is left *is* this great store.

2Ch 31:11 Then Hezekiah commanded to prepare chambers in the house of the LORD; and they prepared them,

2Ch 31:12a And brought in the offerings and the tithes and the dedicated *things* faithfully:

2Ch 31:12b over which Cononiah the Levite was ruler, and Shimei his brother was the next.

• 2Ch 31:13 And Jehiel, and Azaziah, and Nahath, and Asahel, and Jerimoth, and Jozabad, and Eliel, and Ismachiah, and Mahath, and Benaiah, *were* overseers

under the hand of Cononiah and Shimei his brother, at the commandment of Hezekiah the king,

and Azariah the ruler of the house of God.

2Ch 31:14 And **Kore** the son of Imnah the Levite, the porter toward the east, *was* over the freewill offerings of God, to distribute the oblations of the LORD, and the most holy things.

- 2Ch 31:15 And next him *were* Eden, and Miniamin, and Jeshua, and Shemaiah, Amariah, and Shecaniah, in the cities of the priests, in *their* set office, to give to their brethren by courses, as well to the great as to the small:
 - o 2Ch 31:16 Beside their genealogy of males, from three [thirty] years old and upward,
 - even unto every one that entereth into the house of the LORD, his daily portion
 - for their service in their charges according to their courses;
 - 2Ch 31:17 Both to the genealogy of the priests by the house of their fathers,
 - o and the Levites from twenty years old and upward, in their charges by their courses;
 - 2Ch 31:18 And to the genealogy of all their little ones, their wives, and their sons, and their daughters, through all the congregation: for in their set office they sanctified themselves in holiness:
 - 2Ch 31:19 Also of the sons of Aaron the priests, which were in the fields of the suburbs of their cities, in every several city, the men that were expressed by name, to give portions to all the males among the priests, and to all that were reckoned by genealogies among the Levites.

No prior king in Judah like Hezekiah regarding righteousness

2Ki 18:5 He trusted in the LORD God of Israel; so that after him was none like him among all the kings of Judah, nor *any* that were before him.

2Ki 18:6 For he clave to the LORD, *and* departed not from following him, but kept his commandments, which the LORD commanded Moses.

2Ki 18:7 And the LORD was with him; *and* he prospered whithersoever he went forth:

and he rebelled against the king of Assyria, and served him not.

2Ki 18:8 He smote the Philistines, even unto Gaza, and the borders thereof, from the tower of the watchmen to the fenced city.

2Ch 31:20 And thus did **Hezekiah** throughout all **Judah**, and wrought *that which was* good and right and truth before the LORD his God.

2Ch 31:21 And in every work that he began in the service of the house of God, and in **the law**, and in **the commandment**s, to seek his God, he did *it* with all his heart,

and prospered.

Hos 1:1 The word of the LORD that came unto Hosea, the son of Beeri,

in the days of Uzziah, Jotham, Ahaz, and Hezekiah, kings of Judah, and in the days of Jeroboam the son of Joash, king of Israel. (Note: Jeroboam 2) Note: Here we focus on what Hosea likely prophesied during Hezekiah's reign

Israel, the mother of Judah, Rejected Sidenote of past event

Hos 1:2 The beginning of the word of the LORD by Hosea. And the LORD said to Hosea, Go, take unto thee a wife of whorEdoms and children of whorEdoms: for the land hath committed great whorEdom, *departing* from the LORD. Hos 1:3 So he went and took Gomer the daughter of Diblaim;

which conceived, and bare him a son.

Hos 1:4 And the LORD said unto him, Call his name Jezreel;

for yet a little while, and I will avenge the blood of Jezreel upon the house of Jehu, and will cause to cease the kingdom of the house of Israel.
 (Note: Jehu's 4th generation son is Zechariah who was assassinated by Shallum, followed by further assasinations of subsequent kings until finally Israel is exiled to Assyria by Shalmanesser king of Assyria in the 9th year of Hoshea)

Hos 1:5 And it shall come to pass at that day, that I will break the bow of **Israel** in the valley of Jezreel.

Note regarding Hosea 1:4

Jehu was faithful to destroy the house of Ahab (and his wife Jezebel in Jezreel) and destroy the things of Baal (per the anointing by Elisha's servant) but still continued in the sins of **Jeroboam** 1 including worshipping the golden calf with **Israel**.

2Ki 10:29 However, as for the sins of **Jeroboam the son of Nebat**, which he made **Israel** sin, from these **Jehu** did not depart, even the golden calves that were at **Bethel** and that were at **Dan**.

2Ki 10:30 And the LORD said to **Jehu**, "Because you have done well in executing what is right in My eyes, and have done to the house of **Ahab** according to all that was in My heart, your sons of the fourth generation shall sit on the throne of **Israel**."

2Ki 10:31 But Jehu was not careful to walk in the law of the LORD, the God of Israel, with all his heart; he did not depart from the sins of Jeroboam, which he made Israel sin.

Note: There are two people named Jehu.

- Jehu the prophet the son of Hanani
- Jehu the son of Jehoshaphat (not King Jehoshaphat of **Judah**) the son of Nimshi (Note: sometimes "son of" can also mean grandson of as in the case: Jehu son of Nimshi)

Both Jehu's are in the same time period which can make keeping track of both people confusing.

Judah Rejected also

Hos 1:6 And she conceived again, and bare a daughter.

And God said unto him,

Call her name Loruhamah: (note: not pitied)

- for I will no more have mercy upon the house of Israel; but I will utterly take them away.
- Hos 1:8 Now when she had weaned Loruhamah, she conceived, and bare a son.
- Hos 1:9 Then said *God*, Call his name Loammi: (note: not my people)
 - for ye *are* not my people, and I will not be your *God*.

Israel to be Restored with Judah after their exiles

Hos 1:7

But I will have mercy upon the house of Judah,

and will save them by the LORD their God,

and will not save them by bow, nor by sword, nor by battle, by horses, nor by horsemen.

Hos 1:10 Yet the number of **the children of Israel** shall be as the sand of the sea,

(Note: the repentant remnant who survive the judgment and then multiply)

which cannot be measured nor numbered;

and it shall come to pass, *that* in the place where it was said unto them, Ye *are* not my people, *there* it shall be said unto them, Ye are the sons of the living God.

Hos 1:11 Then shall **the children of Judah** and **the children of Israel** be gathered together.

and appoint themselves one head,

and they shall come up out of the land:

for great shall be the day of Jezreel.

Israel misuses what God gave for the service of Baal

Hos 2:1 Say ye unto your brethren,

"Ammi," (note: not my people) and to your sisters, "Ruhamah." (note: not pitied)

Hos 2:2 Plead with your mother, plead: for she is not my wife, neither am I her husband:

let her therefore put away her whor**Edoms** out of her sight,

and her adulteries from between her breasts;

Hos 2:3 Lest I strip her naked,

and set her as in the day that she was born,

and make her as a wilderness, a

nd set her like a dry land,

nd slay her with thirst.

Hos 2:4 And I will not have mercy upon her children;

or they be the children of whor**Edom**s.

Hos 2:5 For their mother hath played the harlot:

she that conceived them hath done shamefully:

for she said, I will go after my lovers, that give me

- my bread
- and my water,
- my wool
- and my flax,
- mine oil
- and my drink.

Hos 2:6 Therefore, behold, I will hedge up thy way with thorns, a nd make a wall, that she shall not find her paths.

Hos 2:7a And she shall follow after **her lovers**, but she shall not overtake them; and she shall seek them, but shall not find *them*:

Hos 2:8 For she did not know that I gave her

- corn,
- and wine,
- and oil.
- and multiplied her silver and gold,

which they prepared for Baal.

Hos 2:9 Therefore will I return, and take away my corn in the time thereof,

and my wine in the season thereof,

and will recover my wool and my flax given to cover her nakedness.

Hos 2:10 And now will I discover her lewdness in the sight of her lovers,

and none shall deliver her out of mine hand.

Hos 2:11 I will also cause

- all her mirth to cease,
- her feast days,
- her new moons,
- and her sabbaths,
- and all her solemn feasts.

Hos 2:12 And I will destroy her vines and her fig trees, whereof she hath said, These *are* my rewards that my lovers have given me:

and I will make them a forest,

and the beasts of the field shall eat them.

Hos 2:13 And I will visit upon her [punish her for] the days of Baalim, wherein she

- burned **incense** to them,
- and she decked herself with her earrings and her jewels,
- and she went after her lovers, and forgat me,

saith the LORD.

No longer Master but Husband

Hos 2:7b then shall she say, I will go and return to my first husband; for then *was it* better with me than now.

Hos 2:14 Therefore, behold, I will allure her,

and bring her into the wilderness, and speak comfortably unto her.

Hos 2:15 And I will give her her vineyards from thence,

and the valley of Achor for a door of hope:

and she shall sing there, as in the days of her youth,

and as in the day when she came up out of the land of Egypt.

Hos 2:16 And it shall be at that day, saith the LORD,

that thou shalt call me Ishi (note: my husband); and shalt call me no more Baali (note: my master).

Hos 2:17 For I will take away the names of **Baalim** out of her mouth,

and they shall no more be remembered by their name.

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Hos 2:18 And In that day will I make a covenant for them
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- with the beasts of the field,
- and with the fowls of heaven,
- and with the creeping things of the ground:

and I will break the bow and the sword and the battle out of the earth,

and will make them to lie down safely.

Hos 2:19 And I will **betroth** thee unto me for ever; yea,

I will betroth thee unto me in righteousness, and in judgment,

and in lovingkindness, and in mercies.

Hos 2:20 I will even betroth thee unto me in faithfulness:

and thou shalt know the LORD.

Hos 2:21 And it shall come to pass In that day,

I will hear, saith the LORD,

I will hear the heavens, and they shall hear the earth;

Hos 2:22 And the earth shall hear the corn, and the wine, and the oil;

and they shall hear Jezreel.

Hos 2:23 And I will sow her unto me in the earth;

and I will have mercy upon her that had not obtained mercy;

and I will say to them which were not my people, Thou art my people;

and they shall say, Thou art my God.

Hos 3:1 Then said the LORD unto me,

Go yet, love a woman beloved of her friend, yet an adulteress,

according to the love of the LORD toward the children of Israel,

who look to other gods, and love flagons of wine.

Hos 3:2 So I bought her to me for fifteen *pieces* of silver, and *for* an homer of barley, and an half homer of barley:

Hos 3:3 And I said unto her, Thou shalt abide for me many days;

thou shalt not play the harlot, and thou shalt not be for another man: so will I also be for thee.

Hos 3:4 For the children of Israel shall abide many days

without a king,

and without a prince,

and without an image [sacred pillar],

and without an ephod,

and without teraphim [household idols]:

Hos 3:5 Afterward shall the children of Israel return,

be troubled, ye careless ones:

trip you, and make you bare, and gird sackcloth upon your loins.

Isa 32:12 They shall lament for the teats, for the pleasant fields, for the fruitful vine.

King Hoshea and Samaria of Israel are taken into captivity

by Shalmaneser king of Assyria

2Ki 18:9 And it came to pass in the fourth year of king Hezekiah,

which was the seventh year of Hoshea son of Elah king of Israel,

that Shalmaneser king of Assyria came up against Samaria, and besieged it.

2Ki 18:10 And at the end of three years they took it: even in the sixth year of **Hezekiah**,

that is the ninth year of Hoshea king of Israel, Samaria was taken. (Note: Thus fulfilling Isa 8:4) 2Ki 18:11 And the king of Assyria did carry away Israel unto Assyria, and put them in Halah and in Habor by the river of Gozan, and in the cities of the Medes:

2Ki 18:12 Because they obeyed not the voice of the LORD their God, but transgressed his covenant, and all that Moses the servant of the LORD commanded, and would not hear *them*, nor do *them*.

2Ki 17:3 Against him came up Shalmaneser king of Assyria; and Hoshea became his servant, and gave him presents.

2Ki 17:4 And the king of Assyria found conspiracy in Hoshea: for he had sent messengers to So king of Egypt, and brought no present to the king of Assyria, as he had done year by year: therefore the king of Assyria shut him up, and bound him in prison.
2Ki 17:5 Then the king of Assyria came up throughout all the land, and went up to Samaria, and besieged it

2Ki 17:6 In the ninth year of Hoshea the king of Assyria took Samaria.

and carried **Israel** away into **Assyria**, and placed them in **Halah** and in **Habor** by the **river of Gozan**, and in the cities of the Medes.

Reason for Israel's exile Treating God as one of many gods

three years.

2Ki 17:7 For so it was, that **the children of Israel** had sinned against the LORD their God, which had brought them up out of **the land of Egypt**, from under the hand of **Pharaoh king of Egypt**,

- and had feared other gods.
- 2Ki 17:8 And walked in
 - o the **statutes** of the heathen, whom the LORD cast out from before **the children of Israel**,
 - o and of the kings of Israel, which they had made.
- 2Ki 17:9 And the children of Israel did secretly those things that were not right against the LORD their God
- and they built them high places in all their cities, from the tower of the watchmen to the fenced city.
- 2Ki 17:10 And they set them up images and groves in every high hill, and under every green tree:
 - o 2Ki 17:11 And there they burnt **incense** in all **the high places**, as *did* the heathen whom the LORD carried away before them;
- and wrought wicked things to provoke the LORD to anger:
- 2Ki 17:12 For they served idols, whereof the LORD had said unto them, Ye shall not do this thing.

2Ki 17:13 Yet the LORD testified against Israel, and against Judah, by all the prophets, and by all the seers, saying, Turn ye from your evil ways, and keep my commandments and my statutes, according to all the law which I commanded your fathers, and which I sent to you by my servants the prophets.

2Ki 17:14 Notwithstanding they would not hear,

but hardened their necks, like to the neck of their fathers, that did not believe in the LORD their God.

2Ki 17:15 And they rejected

- his statutes,
- and his covenant that he made with their fathers,
- and his testimonies which he testified against them;

and they followed vanity, and became vain,

and went after the heathen that were round about them, concerning whom the LORD had charged them, that they should not do like them.

2Ki 17:16 And they left all the commandments of the LORD their God,

- and made them molten images, even two calves,
- and made a grove [Asherim],
- and worshipped all the host of heaven,
- and served Baal.
- 2Ki 17:17 And they caused their sons and their daughters to pass through the fire,
- and used divination and enchantments,
- and sold themselves to do evil in the sight of the LORD, to provoke him to anger.

2Ki 17:18 Therefore the LORD was very angry with **Israel**, and removed them out of his sight: there was none left but the tribe of **Judah** only.

2Ki 17:19 Also **Judah** kept not **the commandment**s of the LORD their God, but walked in the **statutes** of **Israel** which they made.

2Ki 17:20

And the LORD rejected all the seed of Israel,

- and afflicted them,
- and delivered them into the hand of spoilers, until he had cast them out of his sight.

Sidenote:

2Ki 17:21 For he rent **Israel** from the house of **David**;

and they made Jeroboam the son of Nebat king:

and Jeroboam drave Israel from following the LORD, and made them sin a great sin.

2Ki 17:22 For **the children of Israel** walked in all the sins of **Jeroboam** which he did; they departed not from them;

2Ki 17:23 Until the LORD removed Israel out of his sight, as he had said by all his servants the prophets.

So was Israel carried away out of their own land to Assyria unto this day.

Exiles from other nations are brought to **Samaria** in place of **Israel** who are then killed by lions from the LORD

2Ki 17:24 And the king of Assyria brought *men* from Babylon, and from Cuthah, and from Ava, and from Hamath, and from Sepharvaim, and placed *them* in the cities of Samaria instead of the children of Israel: and they possessed Samaria, and dwelt in the cities thereof.

2Ki 17:25 And so it was at the beginning of their dwelling there, that they feared not the LORD: therefore the LORD sent lions among them, which slew some of them.

2Ki 17:26 Wherefore they spake to **the king of Assyria**, saying, **The nations** which thou hast removed, and placed in the cities of **Samaria**, know not the manner of the God of the land: therefore he hath sent lions among them, and, behold, they slay them, because they know not the manner of the God of the land.

2Ki 17:27 Then **the king of Assyria** commanded, saying, Carry thither [there] one of the priests whom ye brought from thence; and let them go and dwell there, and let him teach them the manner of the God of the land.

Treating the true God as one of many gods

2Ki 17:28 Then one of the priests whom they had carried away from **Samaria** came and dwelt in **Bethel**, <u>and taught them how they should fear the LORD</u>.

2Ki 17:29 Howbeit every nation made gods of their own, and put *them* in the houses of **the high places** which the Samaritans had made, every nation in their cities wherein they dwelt.

- 2Ki 17:30 And the men of **Babylon** made Succothbenoth,
- and the men of Cuth made Nergal,
- and the men of Hamath made Ashima,
- 2Ki 17:31 And the Avites made Nibhaz and Tartak,
- and the Sepharvites burnt their children in fire to **Adrammelech** and **Anammelech**, the gods of **Sepharvaim**.

2Ki 17:32 So they feared the LORD, and made unto themselves of the lowest of them priests of **the high places**, which sacrificed for them in the houses of **the high places**.

2Ki 17:33 They feared the LORD, and served their own gods, after the manner of **the nations** whom they carried away from thence.

2Ki 17:34 Unto this day they do after the former manners:

- they fear not the LORD,
- neither do they after their **statutes**,
- or after their **ordinances**, or after **the law** and commandment which the LORD commanded the children of **Jacob**.

whom he named **Israel**; 2Ki 17:35 With whom the LORD had made a covenant, and charged them, saying, Ye shall not fear other gods,

- nor bow yourselves to them,
- nor serve them,
- nor sacrifice to them:

2Ki 17:36 But the LORD, who brought you up out of the land of Egypt with great power and a stretched out arm, him shall ye fear,

- and him shall ye worship,
- and to him shall ye do sacrifice.

2Ki 17:37 And the **statutes**, and the **ordinances**, and **the law**, and **the commandment**, which he wrote for you,

- ye shall observe to do for evermore;
- and ye shall not fear other gods.

2Ki 17:38 And the covenant that I have made with you

- ye shall not forget;
- neither shall ye fear other gods.

2Ki 17:39 But the LORD your God ye shall fear; and he shall deliver you out of the hand of all your enemies.

2Ki 17:40 Howbeit they did not hearken, but they did after their former manner [custom].

2Ki 17:41 So these nations feared the LORD, and served their graven images, both their children, and their children's children: as did their fathers, so do they unto this day.

Note: This is the mindset of Freemasonry and today's impending New World Order.

Sennacherib king of Assyria invades Judah

2Ki 18:13 Now in the fourteenth year of king Hezekiah

did Sennacherib king of Assyria come up against all the fenced cities of Judah, and took them.

2Ch 32:1 After these things, and the establishment thereof,
Sennacherib king of Assyria came, and entered into Judah, and encamped against the fenced cities, and thought to win them for himself

Isa 36:1 Now it came to pass in the fourteenth year of king Hezekiah, that Sennacherib king of Assyria came up against all the defenced cities of Judah, and took them.

Hezekiah surrenders gold and silver from the house of the LORD

2Ki 18:14 And Hezekiah king of Judah sent to the king of Assyria to [at] Lachish, saying, I have offended; return from me: that which thou puttest on me will I bear. And the king of Assyria appointed unto [required of] Hezekiah king of Judah three hundred talents of silver and thirty talents of gold.

2Ki 18:15 And Hezekiah gave *him* all the silver that was found in the house of the LORD, and in the treasures of the king's house.

2Ki 18:16 At that time did Hezekiah cut off the gold from the doors of the temple of the LORD, and from the pillars which Hezekiah king of Judah had overlaid, and gave it to the king of Assyria.

God grants the right of the uncompromising righteous to rebel against an invading wicked authority

2Ki 18:17 And the king of Assyria sent Tartan and Rabsaris and Rabshakeh from Lachish to king Hezekiah with a great host against Jerusalem. And they went up and came to Jerusalem. And when they were come up, they came and stood by the conduit of the upper pool, which is in the highway of the fuller's field

Isa 36:2 And the king of Assyria sent Rabshakeh from Lachish to Jerusalem unto king Hezekiah with a great army.

And he stood by the conduit of the upper pool in the highway of the fuller's field.

2Ki 18:7b and he rebelled against the king of Assyria, and served him not.

And when Hezekiah saw that Sennacherib was come, and that he was purposed to fight against Jerusalem,

2Ch 32:3 He took counsel with his princes and his mighty men to stop the waters of the fountains which *were* without the city: and they did help him.

2Ch 32:4 So there was gathered much people together, who stopped all the fountains, and the brook that ran through the midst of the land, saying, Why should **the kings of Assyria** come, and find much water? 2Ch 32:5 Also he strengthened himself, and built up all the wall that was broken, and raised *it* up to the towers, and another wall without, and repaired Millo *in* the city of **David**, and made darts and shields in abundance.

2Ch 32:6 And he set captains of war over the people, and gathered them together to him in the street of the gate of the city, and spake comfortably to them, saying,

2Ch 32:7 Be strong and courageous, be not afraid nor dismayed for **the king of Assyria**, nor for all the multitude that *is* with him: for *there be* more with us than with him:

2Ch 32:8 With him *is* an arm of flesh; but with us *is* the LORD our God to help us, and to fight our battles. And the people rested themselves upon the words of **Hezekiah king of Judah**.

Sennacherib king of Assyria mocks God as being any other impotent god against him

Isa 36:3 Then came forth unto him Eliakim, Hilkiah's son, which was over the house, and Shebna the scribe, and Joah, Asaph's son, the recorder.

Isa 36:4 And Rabshakeh said unto them, Say ye now to Hezekiah, Thus saith the great king, the king of Assyria, What confidence is this wherein thou trustest?

Isa 36:5 I say, sayest thou, (but they are but vain words) I have counsel and strength for war: now on whom dost thou trust, that thou rebellest against me?

Isa 36:6 Lo, thou trustest in the staff of this broken reed, on Egypt; whereon if a man lean, it will go into his hand, and pierce it: so *is* Pharaoh king of Egypt to all that trust in him.

Isa 36:7 But if thou say to me, We trust in the LORD our God: *is it* not he, whose **high places** and whose altars **Hezekiah** hath taken away, and said to **Judah** and to **Jerusalem**, Ye shall worship before this altar?

Isa 36:8 Now therefore give pledges, I pray thee, to my master the king of Assyria, and I will give thee two thousand horses, if thou be able on thy part to set riders upon them.

Isa 36:9 How then wilt thou turn away the face of one captain of the least of my master's servants, and put thy trust on Egypt for chariots and for horsemen?

Isa 36:10 And am I now come up without the LORD against this land to destroy it? the LORD said unto me, Go up against this land, and destroy it.

2Ki 18:18 And when they had called to the king, there came out to them Eliakim the son of Hilkiah, which was over the household, and Shebna the scribe, and Joah the son of Asah the recorder.

2Ki 18:19 And Rabshakeh said unto them, Speak ye now to Hezekiah, Thus saith the great king, the king of Assyria, What confidence is this wherein thou trustest?

2Ki 18:20 Thou sayest, (but *they are but* vain words,) *I have* counsel and strength for the war. Now on whom dost thou trust, that thou rebellest against me?

2Ki 18:21 Now, behold, thou trustest upon the staff of this bruised reed, even upon Egypt, on which if a man lean, it will go into his hand, and pierce it: so is Pharaoh king of Egypt unto all that trust on him.

2Ki 18:22 But if ye say unto me, We trust in the LORD our God: is not that he, whose high places and whose altars Hezekiah hath taken away, and hath said to Judah and Jerusalem, Ye shall worship before this altar in Jerusalem?

2Ki 18:23 Now therefore, I pray thee, give pledges to my lord the king of Assyria, and I will deliver thee two thousand horses, if thou be able on thy part to set riders upon them.

2Ki 18:24 How then wilt thou turn away the face of one captain of the least of my master's servants, and put thy trust on Egypt for chariots and for horsemen?

2Ki 18:25 Am I now come up without the LORD against this place to destroy it? The LORD said to me, Go up against this land, and destroy it

2Ch 32:9 After this did Sennacherib king of Assyria send his servants to Jerusalem, (but he himself laid siege against Lachish, and all his power with him,) unto Hezekiah king of Judah, and unto all Judah that were at Jerusalem, saying,

2Ch 32:10 Thus saith Sennacherib king of Assyria,

Whereon do ye trust, that ye abide in the siege in **Jerusalem**?

2Ch 32:12 Hath not the same Hezekiah taken away his high places and his altars, and commanded Judah and Jerusalem, saying, Ye shall worship before one altar, and burn incense upon it?

185,000 in the camp of the Assyrians are killed by the angel of the LORD and Sennacherib is killed by his own children at home

and smote in the camp of the **Assyrians** a hundred and fourscore and five thousand: and when they arose early in the morning, behold, they *were* all dead corpses.

Isa 37:37 So Sennacherib king of Assyria departed, and went and returned, and dwelt at Nineveh.

Isa 37:38 And it came to pass, as he was worshipping in the house of Nisroch his god, that Adrammelech and Sharezer his sons smote him with the sword; and they escaped into the land of Armenia:

From Josephus, Antiquities of the Jews, Book 10, Chapter 1, Paragraph 5

5. "Now when Sennacherib was returning from his Egyptian war to Jerusalem, he found his army under Rabshakeh his general in danger [by a plague], for God had sent a pestilential distemper upon his army; and on the very first night of the siege, a hundred fourscore and five thousand, with their captains and generals, were destroyed. So the king was in a great dread and in a terrible agony at this calamity; and being in great fear for his whole army, he fled with the rest of his forces to his own kingdom, and to his city Nineveh; and when he had abode there a little while, he was treacherously assaulted, and died by the hands of his elder sons, (4) Adrammelech and Seraser, and was slain in his own temple, which was called Araske. Now these sons of his were driven away on account of the murder of their father by the citizens, and went into Armenia, while Assarachoddas took the kingdom of Sennacherib."

And this proved to be the conclusion of this Assyrian expedition against the people of Jerusalem.

The nations hear of the LORD delivering Hezekiah from Assyria

2Ch 32:22 Thus the LORD saved Hezekiah and the inhabitants of Jerusalem from the hand of Sennacherib the king of Assyria, and from the hand of all *other*, and guided them on every side.

2Ch 32:23 And many brought gifts unto the LORD to Jerusalem, and presents to Hezekiah king of Judah: so that he was magnified in the sight of all nations from thenceforth.

Hezekiah becomes mortally ill but the LORD extends his life fifteen years

Notes

From Josephus, Antiquities of the Jews, Book 10, Chapter 2, Paragraph 2

2. At this time it was that the dominion of the Assyrians was overthrown by the Medes; but of these things I shall treat elsewhere. But the king of Babylon, whose name was Baladan, sent ambassadors to Hezekiah, with presents, and desired he would be his ally and his friend.

From Josephus, Antiquities of the Jews, Book 10, Chapter 5 Paragraph 1, in reference to Josiah, **king of Judah** 1. NOW **Neco**, **king of Egypt**, raised an army, and marched to **the river Euphrates**, in order to fight with the **Medes** and **Babylonians**, who had overthrown the dominion of the **Assyrians**, for **he** had a desire to reign over Asia.

God tests Hezekiah with great wealth

2Ch 32:27

And Hezekiah had exceeding much riches and honour: and he made himself

- treasuries for silver, and for gold, and for precious stones, and for spices,
- and for shields, and for all manner of pleasant jewels;
- 2Ch 32:28 Storehouses also for the increase of corn, and wine, and oil;
- and stalls for all manner of beasts, and cotes for flocks.
- 2Ch 32:29 Moreover he provided him cities,
- and possessions of flocks and herds in abundance:

for God had given him substance very much.

Commentary - Preview

Pride brings wrath, Repenting of Pride delays wrath for a future wicked generation

2Ch 32:25 *But Hezekiah rendered not again according to the benefit done unto him;* for his heart was lifted up: therefore there was wrath upon him, and upon **Judah** and **Jerusalem**.

2Ch 32:26 Notwithstanding **Hezekiah** humbled himself for the pride of his heart, *both* he and the inhabitants of **Jerusalem**, so that the wrath of the LORD came not upon them in the days of **Hezekiah**.

(See Isaiah 14:4-27 concerning Babylon and all nations surrounding Israel)

Isa 24:23 Then the moon shall be confounded, and the sun ashamed, (Note: the pagan mother gods and father gods)

when the LORD of hosts shall reign in mount Zion, and in Jerusalem,

and before his ancients [elders] gloriously.

Judgment on Idolotry/Witchcraft - all nations

Mic 5:10 And it shall come to pass In that day, saith the LORD,

that I will cut off thy horses out of the midst of thee, and I will destroy thy chariots:

Mic 5:11 And I will cut off the cities of thy land, and throw down all thy strong holds:

Mic 5:12 And I will cut off witchcrafts out of thine hand; and thou shalt have no more soothsayers:

Mic 5:13 Thy graven images also will I cut off, and thy standing images out of the midst of thee; and thou shalt no more worship the work of thine hands.

Mic 5:14 And I will pluck up thy groves [Asherim] out of the midst of thee: so will I destroy thy cities.

Mic 5:15 And I will execute vengeance in anger and fury upon the heathen, such as they [which] have not heard [obeyed].

Isa 25:1 O LORD, thou art my God; I will exalt thee,

I will praise thy name;

for thou hast done wonderful things;

thy counsels of old are faithfulness and truth.

Isa 25:2 For thou hast made of a city an heap; of a defenced city a ruin: a palace of strangers to be no city; it shall never be built.

Isa 25:3 Therefore shall the strong people glorify thee, the city of the terrible nations shall fear thee.

Isa 25:4 For thou hast been

- a strength to the poor,
- a strength to the needy in his distress,
- a refuge from the storm,
- a shadow from the heat,

when the blast of the terrible ones is as a storm against the wall.

Isa 25:5 Thou shalt bring down the noise of strangers, as the heat in a dry place; *even* the heat with the shadow of a cloud:

the branch of the terrible ones shall be brought low.

Jesus will judge and slay the wicked

Isa 11:1 And there shall come forth a rod out of the stem of Jesse,

and a Branch shall grow out of his roots:

Isa 11:2 And the spirit of the LORD shall rest upon him,

- the spirit of wisdom and understanding,
- the spirit of counsel and might,
- the spirit of knowledge and of the fear of the LORD;

Isa 11:3 And shall make him of quick understanding in the fear of the LORD:

and he shall not judge after the sight of his eyes,

neither reprove after the hearing of his ears:

Isa 11:4 But with righteousness shall he judge the poor,

and reprove with equity for the meek of the earth:

and he shall smite the earth with the rod of his mouth, and with the breath of his lips shall he slay the wicked.

Isa 11:5 And righteousness shall be the girdle of his loins, and faithfulness the girdle of his reins.

No more predators amongst the animals

Isa 11:6 The wolf also shall dwell with the lamb,

and the leopard shall lie down with the kid;

and the calf and the young lion and the fatling together;

and a little child shall lead them.

Isa 11:7 And the cow and the bear shall feed;

their young ones shall lie down together:

and the lion shall eat straw like the ox.

Isa 11:8 And the sucking child shall play on the hole of the asp,

and the weaned child shall put his hand on the cockatrice' den.

Isa 11:9 They shall not hurt nor destroy in all my holy mountain:

for the earth shall be full of the knowledge of the LORD, as the waters cover the sea.

The remnant of **Israel** will be recovered

Isa 11:10 And In that day

there shall be a root of Jesse, which shall stand for an ensign of the people; to it shall the Gentiles seek: and his rest shall be glorious.

Isa 11:11 And it shall come to pass In that day,

that the LORD shall set his hand again the second time

to recover the remnant of his people, which shall be left,

• from Assyria, and from Egypt, and from Pathros, and from Cush, and from Elam, and from Shinar, and from Hamath, and from the islands of the sea.

The recovered remnant will plunder the **Philistines**, sons of the east, sons of **Ammon**, **Edom**, **Moab**, **Egypt**

Isa 11:12 And he shall set up an ensign for the nations, and shall assemble the outcasts of Israel,

and gather together the dispersed of Judah from the four corners of the earth.

Mic 4:6 In that day, saith the LORD,

will I assemble her that halteth [is lame], and I will gather her that is driven out, and her that I have afflicted;

Mic 4:7 And I will make her that halted a remnant.

and her that was cast far off a strong nation:

and the LORD shall reign over them in mount Zion from henceforth, even for ever.

Mic 4:8 And thou, O tower of the flock, the strong hold of the **daughter of Zion**,

unto thee shall it come, even the first dominion;

the kingdom shall come to the daughter of Jerusalem.

Isa 11:13 The envy also of **Ephraim** shall depart,

and the adversaries of Judah shall be cut off:

Ephraim shall not envy Judah,

and Judah shall not vex Ephraim.

Isa 11:14 But they shall fly [swoop down] upon the shoulders of the **Philistines** toward the west; they shall spoil [plunder] them of the east together:

they shall lay their hand upon **Edom** and **Moab**;

and the children of Ammon shall obey them.

Isa 11:15 And the LORD shall utterly destroy the tongue of the Egyptian sea; and with his mighty wind shall he shake his hand over the river, and shall smite it in the seven streams, and make *men* go over dryshod.

Isa 11:16 And there shall be an highway <u>for the remnant of his people</u>, <u>which shall be left</u>, from **Assyria**; (See **Isaiah** 10:21-22a)

like as it was to Israel in the day that he came up out of the land of Egypt.

Thanksgiving for bringing the scattered remnant back home

Isa 12:1 And In that day thou shalt say,

O LORD, I will praise thee: though thou wast angry with me, thine anger is turned away, and thou comfortedst me.

Isa 12:2 Behold, God *is* my salvation; I will trust, and not be afraid: for the LORD JEHOVAH *is* my strength and *my* song; he also is become my salvation. Isa 12:3 Therefore with joy shall ye draw water out of the wells of salvation.

Isa 12:4 And In that day shall ye say,

Praise the LORD, call upon his name, declare his doings among the people, make mention that his name is exalted.

Isa 12:5 Sing unto the LORD; for he hath done excellent things: this *is* known in all the earth.

Isa 12:6 Cry out and shout, thou inhabitant of **Zion**: for great *is* the Holy One of Israel in the midst of thee.

See Psalm 118

Israel's and Judah's Calling

Isa 42:5

Thus saith God the LORD,

- he that created the heavens, and stretched them out;
- he that spread forth the earth, and that which cometh out of it;
- he that giveth breath unto the people upon it, and spirit to them that walk therein:

Isa 42:6 I the LORD

have called thee in righteousness,

and will hold thine hand, and will keep thee, and give thee

- for a covenant of the people,
- for a light of the **Gentiles**;
- Isa 42:7 To open the blind eyes,
- to bring out the prisoners from the prison, and them that sit in darkness out of the prison house.

Isa 42:8 I *am* the LORD: that *is* my name: (Note Strong's Concordance H3068 self Existent or eternal; Jehovah) and my glory will I not give to another, neither my praise to graven images.

Isa 40:12 **Who hath measured** the waters in the hollow of his hand, and meted out heaven with the span, and comprehended the dust of the earth in a measure, and weighed the mountains in scales, and the hills in a balance?

Isa 40:13 Who hath directed the Spirit of the LORD,

or being his counsellor hath taught him?

Isa 40:14 With whom took he counsel, and who instructed him,

and taught him in the path of judgment [justice],

and taught him knowledge,

and shewed to him the way of understanding?

Isa 40:15 **Behold, the nations** are as a drop of a bucket,

and are counted as the small dust of the balance:

behold, he taketh up the isles as a very little thing.

Isa 40:16 And Lebanon is not sufficient to burn,

nor the beasts thereof sufficient for a burnt offering.

Isa 40:17 All nations before him are as nothing;

and they are counted to him less than nothing, and vanity.

Isa 40:18

To whom then will ye liken God? or what likeness will ye compare unto him?

Isa 40:19 The workman melteth

a graven image,

and the goldsmith spreadeth it over with gold,

and casteth silver chains.

Isa 40:20 He that *is* so impoverished that he hath no oblation chooseth a tree *that* will not rot; he seeketh unto him a cunning workman to prepare a graven image, *that* shall not be moved [fall down].

Isa 40:21 Have ye not known? have ye not heard? hath it not been told you from the beginning? have ye not understood from the foundations of the earth?

Isa 40:22

It is he that sitteth upon the circle of the earth, and the inhabitants thereof are as grasshoppers; that stretcheth out the heavens as a curtain, and spreadeth them out as a tent to dwell in:

Isa 40:23

That bringeth the princes to nothing; he maketh the judges of the earth as vanity.

- Isa 40:24 Yea, they shall not be planted;
- yea, they shall not be sown:
- yea, their stock shall not take root in the earth:
- and he shall also blow upon them,
 - o and they shall wither,
 - o and the whirlwind shall take them away as stubble.

Isa 40:25 To whom then will ye liken me, or shall I be equal? saith the Holy One.

Isa 40:26 Lift up your eyes on high, and behold who hath created these things,

- that bringeth out their host by number:
- he calleth them all by names

by the greatness of his might, for that he is strong in power; not one faileth.

Isa 40:27

Why sayest thou, O Jacob, and speakest, O Israel, My way is hid from the LORD, and my judgment [justice] is passed over from my God?

Isa 40:28 Hast thou not known? hast thou not heard, *that* the everlasting God, the LORD, the Creator of the ends of the earth, fainteth not, neither is weary? *there is* no searching of [scrutinizing] his understanding.

Isa 40:29 He giveth power to the faint; and to *them that have* no might he increaseth strength. Isa 40:30 Even the youths shall faint and be weary, and the young men shall utterly fall:

Isa 40:31

But they that wait upon the LORD

- shall renew *their* strength;
- they shall mount up with wings as eagles [or other large bird of prey];
- they shall run, and not be weary:
- and they shall walk, and not faint.

Bearing witness to who God Is - There is no god like God

Isa 43:9b who among them can declare this, and shew us former things? let them bring forth their witnesses, that they may be justified: or let them hear, and say, *It is* truth.

Isa 43:10 Ye are my witnesses, saith the LORD, and my servant whom I have chosen: that ye may know and believe me, and understand that I am he:

before me there was no God formed, neither shall there be after me.
Isa 43:11 I, even I, am the LORD; and beside me there is no saviour.
Isa 43:12 I have declared, and have saved, and I have shewed, when there was no strange god among you: therefore ye are my witnesses, saith the LORD, that I am God. Isa 43:13 Yea, before the day was I am he; and there is none that can deliver out of my hand: I will work, and who shall let [reverse] it?

Isa 44:6 Thus saith the LORD the King of Israel, (Note: referring to God the Father) and his redeemer the LORD of hosts; (Note: referring to Jesus Christ)

I am the first, and I am the last; and beside me there is no God. (Note: referring to both are one and the same)

Isa 44:7 'And who is like Me?

Let him proclaim and declare it;

Yes, let him recount it to Me in order,

From the time that I established the ancient nation.

And let them declare to them the things that are coming

And the events that are going to take place. (NASV)

Isa 44:7 And who, as I, shall call, and shall declare it, and set it in order for me, since I appointed the ancient people? and the things that are coming, and shall come, let them shew unto them. (KJV)

Isa 44:8 Fear ye not, neither be afraid: have not I told thee from that time, and have declared *it?*

ye *are* even my witnesses. Is there a God beside me? yea, *there is* no God; I know not *any*.

Who God is

Isa 45:18 For thus saith the LORD that created the heavens;

God himself that formed the earth and made it;

he hath established it, he created it not in vain,

he formed it to be inhabited:

I am the LORD; and there is none else.

Isa 45:19 I have not spoken in secret, in a dark place of the earth:

I said not unto the seed of Jacob, Seek ve me in vain:

I the LORD speak righteousness, I declare things that are right.

Isa 45:20 Assemble yourselves and come;

draw near together, ye that are escaped of the nations:

they have no knowledge

that set up the wood of their graven image, and pray unto a god that cannot save.

Isa 45:21 Tell ye, and bring them near; yea,

let them take counsel together:

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who hath declared this from ancient time?
who hath told it from that time?
have not I the LORD?
and there is no God else beside me;
a just God and a Saviour;
there is none beside me.
Isa 45:22 Look unto me, and be ve saved, all the ends of the earth:
for I am God, and there is none else.
Isa 45:23 I have sworn by myself,
the word is gone out of my mouth in righteousness, and shall not return,
That unto me every knee shall bow, every tongue shall swear {allegiance}. (See Romans 14:11, Phillipians 2:10)
Isa 45:24 Surely, shall one say, in the LORD have I righteousness and strength:
even to him shall men come; and all that are incensed against him shall be ashamed.
Isa 45:25 In the LORD shall all the seed of Israel be justified, and shall glory.
Isa 46:1 Bel boweth down, Nebo stoopeth,
(Note: Bel is a Babylonian god, Nebo is a god of Moab)
their idols were upon the beasts, and upon the cattle:
your carriages were heavy loaden; they are a burden to the weary beast.
Isa 46:2 They stoop, they bow down together;
they could not deliver the burden,
but themselves are gone into captivity.
Isa 46:3 Hearken unto me, O house of Jacob, and all the remnant of the house of Israel,
which are borne by me from the belly, which are carried from the womb:
Isa 46:4 And even to your old age I am he;
and even to hoar hairs will I carry vou:
I have made, and I will bear:
even I will carry, and will deliver you.
Isa 46:5 To whom will ye liken me,
and make me equal, and compare me,
that we may be like?
Isa 46:6 They lavish gold out of the bag,
and weigh silver in the balance,
and hire a goldsmith; and he maketh it a god:
they fall down, yea, they worship.
Isa 46:7 They bear him upon the shoulder, they carry him,
and set him in his place,
and he standeth; from his place shall he not remove: yea,
one shall cry unto him, yet can he not answer, nor save him out of his trouble.
Isa 46:8 Remember this, and shew yourselves men:
bring it again to mind, O ye transgressors.
Isa 46:9 Remember the former things of old:
for I am God, and there is none else;
I am God, and there is none like me,
Isa 46:10 Declaring the end from the beginning.
and from ancient times the things that are not yet done,
saying, My counsel shall stand, and I will do all my pleasure:
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Fashioning your own gods to worship is arrogant sophisticated stupidity

Isa 44:9 They that make a graven image are all of them vanity;

and their delectable things shall not profit;

and they are their own witnesses; they see not, nor know;

that they may be ashamed.

Isa 44:10 Who hath formed a god, or molten a graven image that is profitable for nothing?

Isa 44:11 Behold, all his fellows shall be ashamed:

and the workmen, they are of men:

let them all be gathered together, let them stand up;

yet they shall fear, and they shall be ashamed together.

Isa 44:12 The smith with the tongs

both worketh in the coals,

and fashioneth it with hammers.

and worketh it with the strength of his arms: yea,

he is hungry, and his strength faileth:

he drinketh no water, and is faint.

Isa 44:13 The carpenter stretcheth out his rule; he marketh it out with a line;

he fitteth it with planes,

and he marketh it out with the compass,

and maketh it after the figure of a man, according to the beauty of a man;

that it may remain in the house.

Isa 44:14 He heweth him down cedars, and taketh the cypress and the oak,

which he strengtheneth for himself among the trees of the forest:

he planteth an ash, and the rain doth nourish it.

Isa 44:15 Then shall it be for a man to burn:

for he will take thereof, and warm himself; yea,

he kindleth it, and baketh bread; yea,

he maketh a god, and worshippeth it; he maketh it a graven image, and falleth down thereto.

Isa 44:16 He burneth part thereof in the fire;

with part thereof he eateth flesh; he roasteth roast, and is satisfied: yea,

he warmeth himself, and saith, Aha, I am warm, I have seen the fire:

Isa 44:17 And the residue thereof he maketh a god, even his graven image:

he falleth down unto it, and worshippeth it,

and prayeth unto it, and saith, Deliver me; for thou art my god.

Isa 44:18 They have not known nor understood:

for he hath shut their eyes, that they cannot see;

and their hearts, that they cannot understand.

Isa 44:19 And none considereth in his heart, neither is there knowledge nor understanding to say,

- I have burned part of it in the fire; yea,
- also I have baked bread upon the coals thereof;
- I have roasted flesh, and eaten it:
- and shall I make the residue thereof an abomination?
- shall I fall down to the stock of a tree?

Isa 44:20 He feedeth on ashes: a deceived heart hath turned him aside,

that he cannot deliver his soul, nor say,

Is there not a lie in my right hand?

God challenges the False Prophets

Isa 41:21

Produce your cause, saith the LORD;

bring forth your strong reasons, saith the King of Jacob.

Isa 41:22 Let them bring them forth, and shew us what shall happen:

let them shew the former things, what they be,

that we may consider them, and know the latter end of them;

or declare us things for to come.

Isa 41:23 Shew the things that are to come hereafter,

that we may know that ye are gods: yea,

do good, or do evil, that we may be dismayed, and behold it together.

Isa 41:24 Behold, ye are of nothing, and your work of nought:

an abomination is he that chooseth you.

Isa 41:25 I have raised up *one* from the north, and he shall come: (Note: In reference to a king of Persia, likely Cyrus)

from the rising of the sun shall he call upon my name:

and he shall come upon princes as *upon* morter, and as the potter treadeth clay.

Isa 41:26 Who hath declared from the beginning, that we may know? and beforetime, that we may say, *He is* righteous? yea,

there is none that sheweth, yea,

there is none that declareth, yea,

there is none that heareth your words.

Isa 41:27 The first *shall say* to **Zion**, Behold, behold them:

and I will give to **Jerusalem** one that bringeth good tidings.

Isa 41:28 For I beheld, and there was no man;

even among them, and there was no counsellor,

that, when I asked of them, could answer a word.

Isa 41:29 Behold, they are all vanity;

their works are nothing: their molten images are wind and confusion.

Those who pervert justice

Isa 56:9 All ye beasts of the field, come to devour, yea, all ye beasts in the forest.

Isa 56:10 His watchmen are blind: they are all ignorant,

they are all dumb dogs, they cannot bark;

sleeping, lying down, loving to slumber.

Isa 56:11 Yea, they are greedy dogs which can never have enough,

and they *are* shepherds *that* cannot understand:

they all look to their own way,

every one for his gain, from his quarter.

Isa 56:12 Come ye, say they, I will fetch wine, and we will fill ourselves with strong drink;

and to morrow shall be as this day, and much more abundant.

Isa 57:1 The righteous perisheth, and no man layeth *it* to heart:

and merciful men are taken away,

none considering that the righteous is taken away from the evil to come.

Isa 57:2 He shall enter into peace:

they shall rest in their beds, each one walking in his uprightness.

Isa 57:3 But draw near hither, ye sons of the sorceress,

the seed of the adulterer and the whore.

Isa 57:4 Against whom do ye sport yourselves? against whom make ye a wide mouth, *and* draw out the tongue? *are* ye not

- children of transgression [rebellion],
- a seed of **falsehood**,
- Isa 57:5 **Enflaming yourselves with idols** under every green tree,
- **slaying the children** in the valleys under the clifts of the rocks?

Isa 57:6 Among the smooth *stones* of the stream *is* thy portion; they, they *are* thy lot: even to them hast thou poured a drink offering, thou hast offered a meat [grain] offering.

Should I receive comfort in these?

Isa 57:7 Upon a lofty and high mountain hast thou set thy bed:

even thither [there] wentest thou up to offer sacrifice.

Isa 57:8 Behind the doors also and the posts hast thou set up thy remembrance:

for thou hast discovered [uncovered] *thyself to another* than me, and art gone up; thou hast enlarged thy bed, and made thee *a covenant* with them;

thou lovedst their bed where thou sawest it [looked upon their manhood].

Isa 57:9 And thou wentest to the king with ointment, and didst increase thy perfumes, and didst send thy messengers far off,

and made *them* go down to Sheol. (NASV)

and didst debase thyself even unto hell. (KJV)

Note: difficult to translate here

Isa 57:10 Thou art wearied in the greatness of thy way; yet saidst thou not, There is no hope:

thou hast found the life of thine hand; therefore thou wast not grieved [not worn out].

Isa 57:11 And of whom hast thou been afraid or feared, that thou hast lied, and hast not remembered me, nor laid it to thy heart?

have not I held my peace even of old, and thou fearest me not?

Isa 57:12 I will declare thy righteousness, and thy works; for they shall not profit thee.

Isa 57:13a When thou criest, let thy companies [collection of idols] deliver thee;

but the wind shall carry them all away; vanity shall take them:

Perverted Justice

Isa 59:1 Behold, the LORD'S hand is not shortened, that it cannot save; neither his ear heavy, that it cannot hear:

Isa 59:2 But your iniquities have separated between you and your God,

and your sins have hid his face from you, that he will not hear.

Isa 59:3 For your hands are defiled with blood,

and your fingers with iniquity;

your lips have spoken lies,

your tongue hath muttered perverseness.

Isa 59:4 None calleth for justice, nor *any* pleadeth for truth:

they trust in vanity [confusion], and speak lies;

- they conceive mischief, and bring forth iniquity.
- Isa 59:5 They hatch cockatrice' eggs, and weave the spider's web:

he that eateth of their eggs dieth,

and that which is crushed breaketh out into a viper.

Isa 59:6 Their webs shall not become garments, neither shall they cover themselves with their works: their works *are* works of iniquity, and the act of violence *is* in their hands. Isa 59:7 Their feet run to evil, and they make haste to shed innocent blood: their thoughts *are* thoughts of iniquity; wasting and destruction *are* in their paths.

Isa 59:8 The way of peace they know not; and *there is* no judgment in their goings: they have made them crooked paths: whosoever goeth therein shall not know peace.

Isa 59:9 Therefore is judgment [the verdict] far from us, neither doth justice [H6666: righteousness] overtake us:

we wait for light, but behold obscurity; for brightness, *but* we walk in darkness. Isa 59:10 We grope for the wall like the blind, and we grope as if *we had* no eyes: we stumble at noonday as in the night; *we are* in desolate places as dead *men*.

Isa 59:11 We roar all like bears, and mourn sore like doves:

we look for judgment, but *there is* none; for salvation, *but* it is far off from us.

Isa 59:12 For our transgressions are multiplied before thee,

and our sins testify against us:

for our transgressions are with us;

and as for our iniquities, we know them;

- Isa 59:13 In transgressing and lying against the LORD,
- and departing away from our God,
- speaking oppression and revolt,
- conceiving and uttering from the heart words of falsehood.

Isa 59:14 And judgment is turned away backward, and justice standeth afar off:

for truth is fallen in the street,

and equity cannot enter.

Isa 59:15 Yea, truth faileth;

and he *that* departeth from evil maketh himself a prey:

and the LORD saw it, and it displeased him that there was no judgment.

Isa 59:16a And he saw that there was no man,

and wondered that there was no intercessor:

Judgment on Rulers of Israel

who build Zion and Jerusalem with money gained by bloodshed and injustice Mic 3:9 Hear this, I pray you, ye heads of the house of Jacob, and princes of the house of Israel,

• that abhor judgment,

- and pervert all equity.
- Mic 3:10 They build up Zion with blood, and Jerusalem with iniquity.

- Mic 3:11 The heads thereof judge for reward [a bribe],
- and the priests thereof teach for hire,
- and the prophets thereof divine for money:

yet will they lean upon the LORD, and say, Is not the LORD among us? none evil can come upon us.

Mic 3:12 Therefore shall **Zion** for your sake be plowed *as* a field, and **Jerusalem** shall become heaps, and the mountain of the house as **the high places** of the forest.

Note: Jer 26:18 Micah the Morasthite prophesied in the days of Hezekiah king of Judah, and spake to all the people of Judah, saying, Thus saith the LORD of hosts; Zion shall be plowed *like* a field, and Jerusalem shall become heaps, and the mountain of the house as the high places of a forest.

Do not pervert Fasting and the Sabbath Day

Isa 58:1 Cry aloud, spare not, lift up thy voice like a trumpet, and shew my people their transgression, and the house of **Jacob** their sins.

Note: Speaking facetiously

Isa 58:2 Yet they seek me daily, and delight to know my ways, as a nation that did righteousness, and forsook not the ordinance of their God: they ask of me the **ordinances** of justice; they take delight in approaching to God.

Isa 58:3 Wherefore have we fasted, *say they*, and thou seest not? *wherefore* have we afflicted our soul, and thou takest no knowledge?

Behold, in the day of your fast ye find pleasure, and exact all your labours. Isa 58:4 Behold, ye fast for strife and debate, and to smite with the fist of wickedness:

ye shall [do] not fast as ye do this day, to make your voice to be heard on high.

Isa 58:5 Is it such a fast that I have chosen?

- a day for a man to afflict his soul?
- *is it* to bow down his head as a bulrush, and to spread sackcloth and ashes *under him?* wilt thou call this a fast, and an acceptable day to the LORD?

Isa 58:6 Is not this the fast that I have chosen?

- to loose the bands of wickedness,
- to undo the heavy burdens,
- and to let the oppressed go free,

Shall the earth be made to bring forth in one day?

or shall a nation be born at once?

for as soon as **Zion** travailed, she brought forth her children.

Isa 66:9 Shall I bring to the birth, and not cause to bring forth? saith the LORD:

shall I cause to bring forth, and shut the womb? saith thy God.

Isa 66:10 Rejoice ye with **Jerusalem**, and be glad with her, all ye that love her:

rejoice for joy with her, all ye that mourn for her:

lying children, children that will not hear the law [H8451: precept, statute, law] of the LORD:

and to the prophets, Prophesy not unto us right things,

speak unto us smooth things, prophesy deceits:

Isa 30:11 Get you out of the way, turn aside out of the path,

cause the Holy One of Israel to cease from before us.

Isa 30:12 Wherefore thus saith the Holy One of Israel,

Because ye despise this word,

and trust in **oppression** and **perverseness**, and stay thereon:

Isa 30:13 Therefore this iniquity shall be to you

- as a breach ready to fall,
- swelling out in a high wall,
- whose breaking cometh suddenly at an instant.
- Isa 30:14 And he shall break it as the breaking of the potters' vessel that is broken in pieces; he shall not spare: so that there shall not be found in the bursting of it a sherd
 - o to take fire from the hearth,
 - o or to take water withal out of the pit.

Isa 31:1 Woe to them that go down to **Egypt** for help;

and stay on horses.

and trust in chariots, because they are many;

and in horsemen, because they are very strong;

but they look not unto the Holy One of Israel, neither seek the LORD!

Isa 31:2 Yet he also is wise, and will bring evil,

and will not call back his words:

but will arise against the house of the evildoers,

and against the help of them that work iniquity.

Isa 31:3 Now the **Egyptians** *are* men, and not God; and their horses flesh, and not spirit.

Babylon - Unknowingly a servant pawn of God

Isa 42:19 Who is blind but My servant, Or so deaf as My messenger whom I send? Who is so blind as he that is at peace *with Me*, Or so blind as the servant of the LORD?

Isa 42:20 You have seen many things, but you do not observe *them; Your* ears are open, but none hears.

Isa 42:21 The LORD was pleased for His righteousness' sake To make the law great and glorious.

Isa 42:22 But this is a people plundered and despoiled;

All of them are trapped in caves,

Or are hidden away in prisons;

They have become a prey with none to deliver *them*,

And a spoil, with none to say, "Give them back!"

Isa 42:23 Who among you will give ear to this?

Who will give heed and listen hereafter?

Isa 42:24 Who gave Jacob up for spoil, and Israel to plunderers?

Was it not the LORD, against whom we have sinned,

And in whose ways they were not willing to walk,

And whose law they did not obey?

Isa 42:25 So He poured out on him

the heat of His anger

And the fierceness of battle;

And it set him aflame all around, Yet he did not recognize it;

And it burned him, but he paid no attention.

Israel to repent after 70 years captivity

there the LORD shall redeem thee from the hand of thine enemies.

Purifying Judah through exile to Babylon

Isa 27:7 Hath he smitten him, as he smote those that smote him?

or is he slain according to the slaughter of them that are slain by him?

Isa 27:8 Thou didst contend with them by banishing them, by driving them away.

debate with it:

With His fierce wind He has expelled *them* on the day of the east wind. (NASV)

he stayeth [removes] his rough [severe] wind in the day of the east wind. (KJV)

Isa 27:8 In measure, when it shooteth forth, thou wilt

Isa 27:9 By this therefore shall the iniquity of **Jacob** be purged;

And this will be the full price of the pardoning of his sin: (NASV)

and this is all the fruit to take away his sin; (KJV - correct translation here)

- when he maketh all the stones of the altar as chalkstones that are beaten in sunder,
- the groves [Asherim] and images [H2553: obelisks, sun pillars] shall not stand up.

Isa 27:10 Yet the defenced city shall be desolate,

and the habitation forsaken, and left like a wilderness:

Come down, and sit in the dust, O virgin daughter of **Babylon**, sit on the ground: *there is* no throne, O daughter of the Chaldeans:

for thou shalt no more be called tender and delicate.

Isa 47:2 Take the millstones, and grind meal: uncover thy locks, make bare the leg, uncover the thigh, pass over the rivers.

Isa 47:3 Thy nakedness shall be uncovered, yea, thy shame shall be seen:
I will take vengeance, and I will not meet *thee as* a man.

Isa 13:1

The burden of **Babylon**,

which Isaiah the son of Amoz did see.

Isa 13:2 Lift ye up a banner upon the high mountain,

shake the hand, that they may go into the gates of the nobles.

Isa 13:3 I have commanded my sanctified ones,

I have also called my mighty ones for mine anger, *even* them that rejoice in my highness.

Isa 13:4 The noise of a multitude in the mountains,

like as of a great people;

a tumultuous noise of the kingdoms of nations gathered together:

the LORD of hosts mustereth the host of the battle.

Isa 13:5 They come from a far country, from the end of heaven [the horizon],

even the LORD, and the weapons of his indignation, to destroy the whole land.

Isa 13:6 Howl ye; for the day of the LORD is at hand;

it shall come as a destruction from the Almighty.

Isa 13:7 Therefore shall all hands be faint,

and every man's heart shall melt:

Isa 13:8 And they shall be afraid:

pangs and sorrows shall take hold of them;

they shall be in pain as a woman that travaileth:

they shall be amazed one at another;

their faces shall be as flames.

Isa 13:9 Behold, the day of the LORD cometh,

cruel both with wrath and fierce anger,

to lay the land desolate:

and he shall destroy the sinners thereof out of it.

Isa 13:10 For the stars of heaven and the constellations thereof shall not give their light: the sun shall be darkened in his going forth, and the moon shall not cause her light to shine.

Isa 13:11 And I will punish the world for *their* evil, and the wicked for their iniquity;

and I will cause the arrogancy of the proud to cease, and will lay low the haughtiness of the terrible.

Isa 13:13 Therefore I will shake the heavens, and the earth shall remove out of her place, in the wrath of the LORD of hosts, and in the day of his fierce anger.

Isa 13:15 Every one that is found shall be thrust through; and every one that is joined *unto them* shall fall by the sword. Isa 13:16 Their children also shall be dashed to pieces before their eyes;

their houses shall be spoiled, and their wives ravished.

Behold, I will stir up the Medes against them,

which shall not regard silver; and *as for* gold, they shall not delight in it. Isa 13:18 *Their* bows also shall dash the young men to pieces; and they shall have no pity on the fruit of the womb; their eye shall not spare children.

And **Babylon**, the glory of kingdoms, the beauty of the Chaldees' excellency, shall be as when God overthrew **Sodom** and **Gomorrah**.

Isa 14:3 And it shall come to pass in the day that the LORD shall give thee rest

- from thy sorrow,
- and from thy fear,
- and from the hard bondage wherein thou wast made to serve,

Isa 14:4 That thou shalt take up this proverb against the king of Babylon, and say,

How hath the oppressor ceased! the golden city ceased!

Isa 14:5 The LORD hath broken the staff of the wicked, and the sceptre of the rulers.

Isa 14:6 He who smote the people in wrath with a continual stroke,

he that ruled **the nations** in anger, is persecuted, *and* none hindereth.

Isa 14:7 The whole earth is at rest, and is quiet:

they break forth into singing.

Isa 14:8 Yea, the fir trees rejoice at thee, and the cedars of Lebanon, saying,

Since thou art laid down, no feller [tree cutter] is come up against us.

Isa 14:9 Hell from beneath is moved for thee to meet *thee* at thy coming:

it stirreth up the dead for thee, even all the chief ones of the earth;

it hath raised up from their thrones all the kings of the {H1471: heathen/pagan} nations.

Isa 14:10 All they shall speak and say unto thee,

Art thou also become weak as we?

art thou become like unto us?

Isa 14:11 Thy pomp is brought down to the grave, and the noise of thy viols:

the worm is spread under thee,

and the worms cover thee.

Isa 14:12 How art thou fallen from heaven,

O Lucifer [morning star], son of the morning [H7837: dawn]!

Note: the NASV doesn't specify Lucifer)

how art thou cut down to the ground,

which didst weaken the nations!

Note Revelation 22:16 I Jesus...am the root and the offspring of **David**, and the bright and morning star.

2Co 11:14 And no marvel; for Satan himself is transformed into [disguised as] an angel of light.

The context here specifies Babylon. Ezekiel 27-28 context specifies **Tyre**. Both kings assert themselves to be God.

Isa 14:13 For thou hast said in thine heart,

I will ascend into heaven,

I will exalt my throne above the stars of God:

I will sit also upon the mount of the congregation, in the sides of the north:

Isa 14:14 I will ascend above the heights of the clouds;

I will be like the most High.

Note: Genesis 11 - Tower of Babel

Isa 14:15 Yet thou shalt be brought down to hell, to the sides of the pit.

Isa 14:16 They that see thee shall narrowly look upon thee, and consider thee, saying,

Is this the man

that made the earth to tremble, that did shake kingdoms; Isa 14:17 *That* made the world as a wilderness, and destroyed the cities thereof; *that* opened not the house of his prisoners?

Isa 14:18 All the kings of the nations, even all of them, lie in glory, every one in his own house.

Isa 14:19 But thou art cast out of thy grave like an abominable branch, *and as* the raiment of those that are slain, thrust through with a sword, that go down to the stones of the pit; as a carcase trodden under feet.

Isa 14:20 Thou shalt not be joined with them in burial, because thou hast destroyed thy land, and slain thy people: the seed of evildoers shall never be renowned.

Isa 14:21 Prepare slaughter for his children for the iniquity of their fathers; that they do not rise, nor possess the land, nor fill the face of the world with cities.

Isa 23:1

The burden of **Tyre**.

Note: **Tyre** was an ancient Phoenician city on an island close to the coast. Its wealth depended on trade. There was almost no place in the known world which **Tyre** did not have relations with. Taken by the **Babylonians** in 573 BC and by **Alexander** in 332 BC, who joined it to its mainland by building a man-made bridge, in fulfillment of prophecy. The rise of Alexandria is really the main cause of the decline of **Tyre**. It was under the yoke of the ptolemies in 273 BC and the freed by the Seleucids in 198 BC. Pompey proclaimed its autonomy in 126 BC after he conquered the city. It became again an important commercial city throughout the Roman period. Jesus visited **Tyre** (Mk 7:2 ff.). When Paul was journeying to **Jerusalem** he passed through **Tyre** where there was already established a Christian community in the city (Acts 21:3-7).

for it [Tyre] is laid waste, so that there is no house, no entering in [no harbor]: from the land of Chittim [Kittim, also called Cyprus] it is revealed to them.

(Note: Cyprus is an island west of Syria [Aram] and south of Turkey in the Mediterranean Sea.)

Isa 23:2 Be still, ye inhabitants of the isle;

thou whom the merchants of Zidon [Sidon], that pass over the sea, have replenished.

Isa 23:3 And by great waters the seed of Sihor, the harvest of the river, is her revenue; and she is a mart of nations.

neither do I nourish up young men, nor bring up virgins.

Isa 23:5 As at the report concerning Egypt, so shall they be sorely pained at the report of Tyre.

Isa 23:6 Pass ye over to Tarshish; howl, ye inhabitants of the isle.

Isa 23:7 Is this your joyous city, whose antiquity is of ancient days?

her own feet shall carry her afar off to sojourn.

Isa 23:8 Who hath taken this counsel against Tyre,

- the crowning city,
- whose merchants are princes,
- whose traffickers [traders] are the honourable of the earth?

Isa 23:9 The LORD of hosts hath purposed it,

- to stain the pride of all glory,
- and to bring into contempt all the honourable of the earth.

Isa 23:10 Pass through thy land as a river [H2795: the Nile], O daughter of Tarshish:

there is no more strength.

Isa 23:11 He stretched out his hand over the sea,

he shook the kingdoms:

The LORD has given a command concerning Canaan to demolish its strongholds. (NASV)

the LORD hath given a commandment against the merchant *city*, to destroy the strong holds thereof. (KJV- correct interpretation due to context)

Isa 23:12 And he said, Thou shalt no more rejoice, O thou oppressed virgin, daughter of Zidon [Sidon]: arise, pass over to Chittim [Cyprus]; there also shalt thou have no rest.

Isa 23:13 Behold the land of the Chaldeans; this people was not,

till the Assyrian founded it for them that dwell in the wilderness:

- they set up the {siege} towers thereof,
- they raised up [H6209: demolished] the palaces thereof;
- and he brought it to ruin.

Isa 23:14 Howl, ye ships of Tarshish: for your strength is laid waste.

Tyre is also a great whore like Babylon

Isa 23:15 And it shall come to pass In that day, that Tyre shall be forgotten seventy years, according to the days of one king:

At the end of seventy years it will happen to Tyre as in the song of the harlot: (NASV) after the end of seventy years shall Tyre sing as an harlot. (KJV)

Isa 23:16 Take an harp, go about the city, **thou harlot** that hast been forgotten; make sweet melody, sing many songs, that thou mayest be remembered.

Isa 23:17 And it shall come to pass after the end of seventy years, that the LORD will visit Tyre,

and she shall turn to her hire [go back to her harlot's wages],

and shall commit fornication with all the kingdoms of the world upon the face of the earth.

Isa 23:18 And her merchandise and her hire shall be holiness [set apart] to the LORD:

it shall not be treasured nor laid up;

for her merchandise shall be for them that dwell before the LORD, to eat sufficiently, and for durable clothing.

Babylon to be subdued

Isa 43:14 Thus saith the LORD, your redeemer, the Holy One of Israel;

they are extinct [extinguished], they are quenched as tow [a wick].

The fall of Elam, Media, and Babylon

Note: The Negev is the southern half of **Israel** roughly triangular in shape, between Egypt and Jordan As whirlwinds in the south pass through;

so it cometh from the desert, from a terrible land.

Go up, O Elam: besiege, (Note: Elam is in Iran southeast of **Babylon** in Iraq)

(Note: Media is included in parts of Iran, Iraq, and Turkey.)

Isa 21:3 Therefore are my loins filled with pain:

pangs have taken hold upon me, as the pangs of a woman that travaileth:

I am so bewildered I cannot hear, so terrified I cannot see. (NASV)

I was bowed down at the hearing of it; I was dismayed at the seeing of it.(KJV)

Isa 21:4 My heart panted, fearfulness affrighted me:

the night [twilight] of my pleasure [longing] hath he turned into fear unto me.

Isa 21:5 Prepare the table, watch in the watchtower, eat, drink:

arise, ye princes, and anoint the shield.

Isa 21:6 For thus hath the LORD said unto me,

Go, set a watchman, let him declare what he seeth.

Isa 21:7 And he saw

- a chariot with a couple of horsemen,

he is brought as a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before her shearers is dumb, so he openeth not his mouth.

Isa 53:8 He was taken from prison and from judgment:

and who shall declare his generation? for he was cut off out of the land of the living:

for the transgression of my people was he stricken.

Isa 53:9 And he made his grave with the wicked,

and with the rich in his death:

because he had done no violence,

neither was any deceit in his mouth.

Isa 53:10 Yet it pleased the LORD to bruise him; he hath put him to grief:

when thou shalt make his soul an offering for sin, he shall see his seed, he shall prolong his days, and the pleasure of the LORD shall prosper in his hand.

Isa 53:11 He shall see of the travail of his soul, and shall be satisfied:

by his knowledge shall my righteous servant justify many; for he shall bear their iniquities.

Isa 53:12 Therefore will I divide him a portion with the great,

and he shall divide the spoil with the strong;

because he hath poured out his soul unto death:

and he was numbered with the transgressors;

and he bare the sin of many,

and made intercession for the transgressors.

The Redeemer comes to Israel

Isa 59:16b therefore his arm brought salvation unto him;

and his righteousness, it sustained him. Is a 59:17 For he put on righteousness as a breastplate, and an helmet of salvation upon his head; and he put on the garments of vengeance *for* clothing, and was clad with zeal as a cloke.

Preview

and thy daughters shall be nursed at thy side.

Isa 60:5 Then thou shalt see, and flow together [be radiant],

and thine heart shall fear, and be enlarged;

because the abundance of the sea shall be converted unto thee.

the forces [resources] of the Gentiles shall come unto thee. (Note: nations, Gentiles, heathen, pagan)

Isa 60:6 The multitude of camels shall cover thee.

the dromedaries [young camels] of **Midian** and **Ephah**;

all they from Sheba shall come:

they shall bring gold and incense [frankincense];

and they shall shew forth the praises of the LORD.

Isa 60:7 All the flocks of **Kedar** shall be gathered together unto thee,

the rams of **Nebaioth** shall minister unto thee:

they shall come up with acceptance on mine altar,

and I will glorify the house of my glory.

Isa 60:8 Who are these that fly as a cloud, and as the doves to their windows?

Isa 60:9 Surely the isles shall wait for me,

and the ships of Tarshish first, to bring thy sons from far,

their silver and their gold with them,

2Ki 21:2 And he did *that which was* evil in the sight of the LORD, after the abominations of the heathen, whom the LORD cast out before the children of Israel

- 2Ch 33:1 Manasseh was twelve years old when he began to reign,
- and he reigned fifty and five years in **Jerusalem**:

2Ch 33:2 But did *that which was* evil in the sight of the LORD, like unto the abominations of the heathen, whom the LORD had cast out before **the children of Israel**.

Details of Manasseh's wickedness

- 2Ki 21:3 For he built up again the high places which Hezekiah his father had destroyed;
- and he reared up altars for Baal, and made a grove, as did Ahab king of Israel;
- and worshipped all the host of heaven, and served them.
- 2Ki 21:4 And he built altars in the house of the LORD, of which the LORD said, In Jerusalem will I put my name.
- 2Ki 21:5 And he built altars for all the host of heaven in the two courts of the house of the LORD.
- 2Ki 21:6 And he made his son pass through the fire,
- and observed times,
- and used **enchantments**.
- and dealt with **familiar spirits** and **wizards**:

- 2Ch 33:3 For he built again the high places which **Hezekiah** his father had broken down,
- and he reared up altars for **Baalim**, and made groves,
- and worshipped all the host of heaven, and served them.
- 2Ch 33:4 Also he built altars in the house of the LORD, whereof the LORD had said, In Jerusalem shall my name be for ever.
- 2Ch 33:5 And he built altars for all the host of heaven in the two courts of the house of the LORD.
- 2Ch 33:6 And he caused his children to pass through the fire in the valley of the son of Hinnom:
- also he observed times,
- and used **enchantments**.
- and used witchcraft,
- and dealt with a familiar spirit, and with wizards:

- he wrought much wickedness in the sight of the LORD, to provoke *him* to anger.
- 2Ki 21:7 And he set a graven image of the grove that he had made in the house,
 - of which the LORD said to David, and to Solomon his son, In this house, and in Jerusalem, which I have chosen out of all tribes of Israel, will I put my name for ever:
 - 2Ki 21:8 Neither will I make the feet of Israel move any more out of the land which I gave their fathers; only
 - if they will observe to do according to all that I have commanded them, and according to all the law that my servant Moses commanded them.

- he wrought much evil in the sight of the LORD, to provoke him to anger.
- 2Ch 33:7 And he set a carved image, the idol which he had made, in the house of God,
 - of which God had said to David and to Solomon his son, In this house, and in Jerusalem, which I have chosen before all the tribes of Israel, will I put my name for ever:
 - 2Ch 33:8 Neither will I any more remove the foot of Israel from out of the land which I have appointed for your fathers;
 - so that they will take heed to do all that I have commanded them, according to the whole law and the statutes and the ordinances by the hand of Moses.

2Ki 21:9 But they hearkened not: and **Manasseh** seduced them to do more evil than did **the nations** whom the LORD destroyed before **the children of Israel**.

2Ch 33:9 So **Manasseh** made **Judah** and the inhabitants of **Jerusalem** to err, *and* to do worse than the heathen, whom the LORD had destroyed before **the children of Israel**.

and commanded Judah to serve the LORD God of Israel.

Brief summary of Amon's life

- and he reigned two years in Jerusalem.
- And his mother's name *was* Meshullemeth, the daughter of Haruz of Jotbah.
- 2Ki 21:20 And he did that which was evil in the sight of the LORD, as his father
 Manasseh did.
- 2Ki 21:21 And he walked in all the way that his father walked in, and served the idols that his father served, and worshipped them:

2Ki 21:22 And he forsook the LORD God of his fathers, and walked not in the way of the LORD.

- 2Ch 33:21 Amon was two and twenty years old when he began to reign,
- and reigned two years in Jerusalem.
- 2Ch 33:22 But he did that which was evil in the sight of the LORD, as did Manasseh his father:
- for Amon sacrificed unto all the carved images which Manasseh his father had made, and served them;

2Ch 33:23 And humbled not himself before the LORD, as **Manasseh** his father had humbled himself; but **Amon** trespassed more and more.

Transfer of power from Amon to his son Josiah in spite of conspiracy

2Ki 21:23 And the servants of Amon conspired against him, and slew the king in his own house.

2Ki 21:24 And the people of the land slew all them that had conspired against **king Amon**;

and the people of the land made Josiah his son king in his stead.

2Ki 21:26 And he was buried in his sepulchre in the garden of Uzza: and Josiah his son reigned in his stead.

2Ch 33:24 And his servants conspired against him, and slew him in his own house.

2Ch 33:25 But the people of the land slew all them that had conspired against **king Amon**;

and the people of the land made Josiah his son king in his stead.
