Brief summary of Josiah's life

 2Ki 22:1 Josiah was eight years old when he began to reign, and he reigned thirty and one years in Jerusalem. And his mother's name was Jedidah, the daughter of Adaiah of Boscath. 2Ki 22:2 And he did <i>that which was</i> right in the sight of the LORD, and walked in all the way of David his father, and turned not aside to the right hand or to the left. 	 2Ch 34:1 Josiah was eight years old when he began to reign, and he reigned in Jerusalem one and thirty years. 2Ch 34:2 And he did <i>that which was</i> right in the sight of the LORD, and walked in the ways of David his father, and declined <i>neither</i> to the right hand, nor to the left.

2Ch 34:3a For **in the eighth year of his reign**, while he was yet young, he began to seek after the God of David his father:

Josiah purges Judah and Jerusalem of objects of worship to foreign gods and their priests

and in the twelfth year he began to purge Judah and Jerusalem from

- the high places,
- and the groves [Asherim],
- and the carved images,
- and the molten images.

2Ch 34:4 And they brake down

- the altars of Baalim in his presence;
- and the images [H2553: Sun pillar, idol, image], that were on high above them, he cut down;
- and the groves [Asherim],
- and the **carved images**,
- and the molten images,

he brake in pieces, and made dust of them,

and strowed [scattered] it upon the graves of them that had sacrificed unto them.

2Ch 34:5 And he burnt the bones of the priests upon their altars, Note: Prophecy of 1Ki 13:1-2 spoken to Jeroboam fulfilled

Note: In this document we focus what was likely prophesied during Josiah's reign only.



The same basic story varies by region and culture
